

Dear Mrs. Reagan:

We are so pleased to read about and see the remarkable recovery our President is making after his recent surgery. During our last three Sundays at mass we have prayed for his recovery so that he may continue to lead our country in such a positive, strong and compassionate manner. My prayers and good wishes are with both of you.

On October 1 I am hosting a luncheon in New York City at The Metropolitan Club for approximately 120 ladies of which 70% will be the wives of ambassadors of the United Nations. The purpose of the luncheon is to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the forming of the United Nations. I feel very honored to do this for them and for my country.

The theme of the luncheon will be "Peace," and in the center of each table there will be a pair of hands with a dove unfolding, soaring to the sky, which is entitled, "The Flight of the Dove." Each lady attending the luncheon will receive a miniature Dove of Peace to further the theme of the luncheon.

Under separate cover I am sending fourteen miniature Doves of Peace, which are also card holders, for you and the President to use in your private quarters, if you so choose. This is my little "get well gift" for the President.

Another interesting thing has developed. When I did a book review at the UN for the Ambassadors' and Under Secretaries' Wives, the wife of the Under Secretary of Russia was wondering why I never had an exhibition in Russia; she knew I had been to Saudi Arabia, Japan, Egypt, Israel, China and many other countries. I told her I had not been invited to Russia, and she told me she was now inviting me. Mrs. Reagan, I thought it was an unusual approach.

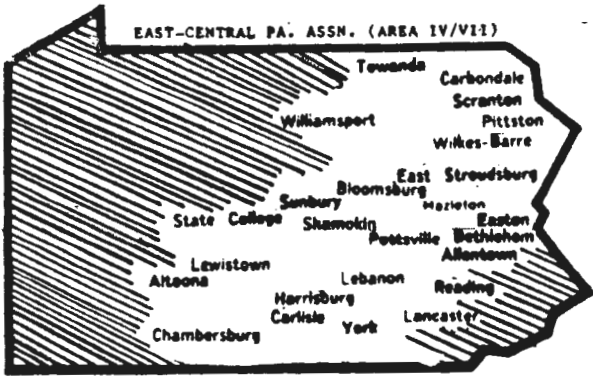



Dear Mr. President,

we wish to convey our best wishes for your speedy recovery. We hope that you will soon regain your full health.

Since it isn't every day that one writes a letter to the President of the United States, we would like to take this chance to express some of our thoughts - this also to thank you for your words during your visit to Germany. You know - and we know - that the majority of the people in this country sympathize with America; it is a small but loud minority that constantly inveighs against the United States and tries to create aggression and is sometimes even successful. We - Susan and I - would like to say that this saddens us greatly, because we know how important friendship with the United States is for this country.

We have known people of your country for many years and we have come to love them. In them we found naturalness and warmth in such a degree as we have never seen in Germany.

In the past few years, when this minority in Germany was once again loudly demonstrating against the soldiers of the United States and even in a despicable display of brutality killed citizens of your nation, we found it increasingly more unbearable that only lame protest was heard from the Germans. We felt shame for those Germans that were capable of such acts, especially when we were once again visiting Virginia or Ohio, where our friends have always received us with indescribable warmth. One day we decided to make a mark, within our limited possibilities. We too wanted to demonstrate, not for brutality and terrorism but for humanitarianism, respect and friendship. And that's how the story of Dieter's and Susan's guest book began. Upon its completion we wanted to make a present of it to you, because we had dedicated it to you personally, to you and not the president who may then be in office. To you personally because in you we saw the reflection of our friends in the United States, who are as close to us as members of our family.

Today we are sending you copies of the first pages of our guest book as a small gift. We want to thank you for getting the hostages back safely from Beirut to the United States. We also wish to express our sadness that a young man - to whom we feel especially close because he was a soldier - had to die. Our sympathy goes out to his friends and family.

We shall continue our little protest. We want to show the members of the American military forces in Germany that they are welcome here as friends. One day our guest book will be full. Then it will find its way to you. We hope that it will find you well and in good health.

In August we will once again visit your wonderful country and our friends. We are looking forward to it.

When we were in the United States last winter, we heard a song:


