SUBJECT: Appointment Request: Lord Carrington

NATO Secretary General, Lord Peter Carrington, is coming to the U.S. in early April on one of his frequent consultations/public diplomacy trips. He has specifically asked to meet with you; I think it would be a good idea. There are plenty of topics for discussion: U.S.-Soviet relations, arms control, and Alliance management with a focus on NATO as a consultative body and conventional force improvements.

Carrington has often seen the President on his U.S. visits, but since he comes so frequently he doesn't expect an appointment every time, and has not asked for one in April. Carrington has, however, asked to meet with the VP, Shultz, and Weinberger. He will also be meeting with members of Congress.

RECOMMENDATION

That you agree to meet with Lord Carrington for 30-minutes on the afternoon of April 7.

SUBJECT: Spain and NATO

Ambassador Enders has convinced State that we should make another effort at influencing Conservative opposition leader, Manuel Fraga, to play a more constructive role in Spain's March 12th NATO referendum. Allen met with Fraga in January and didn't have much success. But we still consider Allen, who will be back in Europe next week, seeing both Kohl and Fraga, as our best messenger at this stage. We are currently working on talking points that would have Allen encourage Fraga and his fellow conservatives either to vote "yes" or at least "abstain" in the referendum. Because of deep-seated domestic political differences with Gonzalez and the Socialists, Spanish conservatives have threatened to vote "no" vice "abstaining" in the referendum, basically to embarrass Gonzalez.

Allen's demarche would carry considerable more weight if he carried with him a brief Presidential letter. But we need to be sure that the language of such a letter could not be perceived as intervening in domestic politics, should its text become public. In essence, the letter is designed to convey a Presidential imprimatur and thereby flatter Fraga.

A number of other Allies are also approaching Fraga, in particular the German CDU and CSU parties. We have urged State to take steps to heighten Allied efforts with Fraga and to have Lord Carrington raise it at a PremReps lunch. It is important that the referendum not be seen as mainly a Spanish-US question, but rather a NATO-Spain issue.

Not received

State's formal memo requesting the letter is still in S/S; an advance copy is at Tab II. Allen is leaving this week-end and we need to move forward now. Both the Admiral and Don previously agreed with Allen's earlier demarche.

The negative attitude of Spain's conservative opposition towards participating in that country's NATO referendum threatens Spain's continued Alliance membership.

Richard Allen has already attempted, on the President's behalf, to persuade Spanish opposition leader Manuel Fraga to rethink his position. Allen is leaving for Europe this weekend and is planning another meeting with Fraga to reiterate our concerns. We believe it would strengthen his efforts if he were to carry a letter from the President to Fraga. A proposed text is attached.
