In addition, I hereby agree that during my tenure as a member of the Commission, I will not advise, directly or indirectly, any client with respect to any matters that will be, or may reasonably be expected to be, reviewed by the Commission.

I further agree to disqualify myself from all or part of the Commission's deliberations if I feel I have any financial interest or any relation with a third party which might be deemed likely to affect the integrity or impartiality of the Commission's report and recommendations; and to consult with the Legal Adviser of the Department of State before taking any action if I have any doubt or question as to whether it is in accordance with this agreement.

Dear Dr. Kissinger:

As a member of the National Bipartisan Commission on Central America (the Commission) you will be a "special Government employee" and as such will be subject to the conflict of interest statutes, see 18 U.S.C. §§ 202-208, and the standards of conduct applicable to all Government employees (Executive Order No. 11222). In an effort to avoid even the appearance of a conflict of interest as a result of the financial holdings and the clients of any firm or business association of members of the Commission, we have determined that each member of the Commission will be required to sign an Agreement on Nondisclosure of Information. That Agreement is attached for your review and signature.


By signing this Agreement you are agreeing not to disclose any information that you obtain during your tenure as a member of the Commission to any non-Government parties; not to advise, directly or indirectly, any clients with respect to matters that may be reviewed by the Commission; and to recuse yourself from all or part of the Commission's proceedings if you believe you have a financial interest or relation with a third party that might be deemed to adversely affect the integrity or impartiality of the Commission's reports or recommendations. The Legal Adviser of the State Department will be available to give guidance to you with respect to any questions you may have with respect to your responsibilities under this Agreement or any other conflict of interest questions you may have during your tenure as a member of the Commission.

Please sign and date this Agreement and return it to my office as soon as possible. Following our receipt of this signed agreement, your appointment as a member and Chairman of the Commission will be finalized.

This Agreement has been reviewed and approved by the Office of Government Ethics as an appropriate measure to avoid inadvertent violations of 18 U.S.C. § 208; indeed, that Office has specifically endorsed the use of the recusal provisions included in this Agreement. The opinion of the Office of

Government Ethics regarding the application of the conflict of interest laws, agency standards of conduct and public financial disclosure requirements as they apply to members of the Commission is enclosed for your information. Also enclosed is the confidential memorandum provided to us by the Deputy Designated Ethics Officer for the Department of State setting forth his conclusion that he sees no conflicts of interest created by your holdings and clients that would preclude your appointment as a member of the Commission.

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

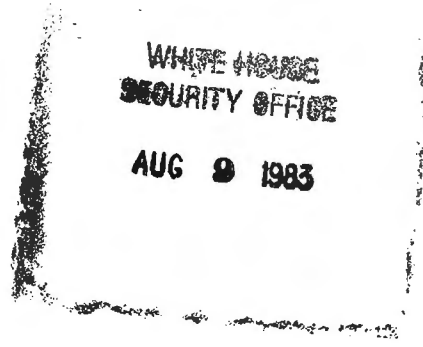

The Office of the Legal Adviser has completed its review of the lists of clients of Henry Kissinger Associates and of his own financial interests in the light of the functions of the Commission in Section 2 of Executive Order 12433 (48 FR 33227). We have also taken account of the non-disclosure and recusal agreement which you propose to have members of the Commission sign.

The interests fall into three broad relevant categories: (1) banking, either as operators of banking facilities in the Central American area or as lenders to Governments; (2) other marketing enterprises either operating, or looking for business, in the area; and (3) purveyors of defense equipment which could benefit from an increased military assistance program to the area should the Commission recommend, and Congress and the Administration adopt, an increased program.

The general policy recommendations which the Commission is mandated to deliver could, if adopted, in some measure enhance the financial interests of one or more companies identified by Dr. Kissinger, but the linkage is at most speculative and remote.

We are therefore satisfied that, on the basis of information available to the Department of this time, there is no conflict of interest or appearance of conflict as to any particular matter which may come before the Commission and that the nondisclosure/recusal agreement adequately protects against the use of official, privileged information for private gain.


