Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am encouraged by the progress which has been made to date in resolving the differences between the House and Senate versions of S. 734, the Export Trading Company Act. I hope that you will be able to complete your work this week so that this essential legislation can be implemented without delay.

You are undoubtedly aware of reports in today's newspapers regarding our August merchandise trade deficit. The record \$7.1 billion deficit for August reflected a 20.2 percent increase in imports and a 2.9 percent drop in our exports. While our trading partners are becoming more aggressive in the world market, the U.S. share of total world exports has declined more than 3 percent since 1970, representing a cumulative loss of nearly \$80 billion.

The Commerce Department estimates that over 20,000 U.S. businesses currently produce goods and services that can be competitive in the world market, but do not export due to a lack of knowledge and/or resources. By providing the vital link necessary to encourage these firms to begin exporting, our estimates indicate that export trading companies will create more than 350,000 new American jobs.

America needs the Export Trading Company Act, and I strongly urge you to complete your work in time for the Congress to approve the conference report before your recess at the end of the week.

Dear Congressman Rodino:

I regret that you were unable to attend the briefing yesterday at the White House. The purpose of the briefing was to discuss the newly established National Narcotics Border Interdiction System (NNBIS). Mr. Meese stated during the meeting that the new border interdiction effort would complement the existing South Florida Task Force and the twelve organized crime/drug enforcement task forces.

NNBIS is the next step in the President's program to bring all avialable resources to bear on reducing the supply of illegal drugs. The new system is designed to strengthen interdiction efforts along our borders, to detect and intercept the drug smugglers, and to stop the drugs before they get into domestic distribution.

Enclosed is a copy of a press release announcing the formation of the National Narcotics Border Interdiction System.
