



Carter: Reagan made big mistake in arms talks

ATLANTA (UPI) — Former President Jimmy Carter said the Reagan administration thwarted its weapons talks with the Soviets by clinging to Star Wars and refusing to consider a halt to testing.

Carter also accused the government of using private companies to cause unrest in Nicaragua and added in a wide-ranging interview that he would support Sen. Sam Nunn, D-Ga., for president.

Carter said Reagan was not prepared to give up as many nuclear weapons in a push for peace as was Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev.

"I don't think they were prepared for Gorbachev's willingness to put (far-reaching proposals) flat on the table and say, 'Here they are,'" he said. "He put the whole thing on the table and said, 'I'll accept all of this provided you will accept a strict interpretation of the ABM treaty for 10 years, which I think would preclude some very vital tests in the air and space for some of the Star War components.'"

"I have always thought Star Wars was a big mistake. My judgment is President Reagan missed a wonderful opportunity," Carter said in an interview with Cox Newspapers officials that was published in The Atlanta Journal and Constitution Saturday.

Carter also accused Reagan of misleading the world by implying the space-based Strategic Defense Initiative, popularly called Star Wars, will be as good a deterrent to nuclear war as arms reduction.

He said he was in a wilderness area in Michigan last weekend during the weapons talks and got an emergency call from the administration about the talks in Reykjavik, Iceland.

"It was one of the rare times in the last 5² years that I've been called by the White House," he said, adding he was cold and soaking wet because he had been outside. "And my impression is that Gorbachev came to Iceland very carefully prepared to present some startling proposals — startling to me."

As Admiral John Poindexter, national security adviser, read Gorbachev's proposals, "I said, 'That's great, I can't believe it. It's wonderful,'" Carter said.

"After about 30 or 45 minutes, he finally said, 'The president has decided to reject all of these opportunities because Gorbachev insists on a stringent interpretation of the ABM treaty.'"

Carter said he believes the treaty allows testing of nuclear weapons on the ground, but not in the air or in space.

He said he believes Reagan wanted only to agree on a reduction in intermediate range missiles and save other meatier matters for a "politically popular summit."

Carter also criticized Reagan's Nicaraguan policies and said the government is at the root of Central American unrest.

"There's very little doubt in my mind that what has been going on — in the mining of harbors, the preparation of the pamphlet encouraging murder, and the delivery of weapons to the contras — that our government has been directly or indirectly involved," he said.

Carter said the Central Intelligence Agency often uses private companies to conduct its business, including trucking, airline and motion picture firms.

He said his administration used a film company to stage the release of six Americans from the Canadian Embassy during the Iranian hostage crisis.

"I think that's what's going on in Nicaragua," he said.

Carter told the editors and publishers he has no idea who the Democratic nominee for president will be in 1988.

"If I had my own choice of the person who could win, I would choose Sam Nunn," he said. "My guess is, he won't run, but it's very difficult mathematically for the Democrats to win without strong support in the South. I think Nunn can do as well as any Republican candidate in the South."

He likened Nunn's philosophies to those he supported in his presidential races in 1976 and 1980 — progressive in arms control, dependence on negotiations instead of troops in dealings with other countries, conservative increases in military spending and strong belief in human rights.

Democrats have a good chance to take the White House in 1988 because "Reagan will not be running with his high popularity, which I don't think is transferable to ... whomever the Republicans choose."

MEMORANDUM FOR FRED FIELDING
Counsel to the President

Re: Policy of the Carter Administration Regarding
the Protection of the President's Name, Picture,
and Seal

This responds to Mr. Bolton's telephone inquiry of January 27, 1981, concerning the policy of the Carter Administration regarding the protection of the President's name, picture, and seal.

This Office is not aware of the pertinent policies of the previous Administration. We therefor must limit our response to relevant advice we have given to the White House and in particular to the Counsel to the President.

Our advice has generally fallen into two areas: first, the enforcement of 18 U.S.C. § 713 which protects the seal of the President, and its implementing Executive Order No. 11649, as amended by Executive Order No. 11916, 18 U.S.C. § 713, note; and, second, the use of the President's name or likeness for promotional or deceptive purposes.

As regards the protection of the President's seal, we have cautioned your Office orally to be extremely careful in seeking to enforce § 713 by criminal or injunctive proceedings. Our files, in particular the antecedents of Executive Order No. 11916 and the documents supporting it, show that Presidents themselves have frequently given Presidential seals or facsimiles thereof to individuals for unauthorized purposes, or have tolerated technical violations of the statute or the Executive orders because prosecutions, especially of "respectable violators," would be too difficult or undesirable as a matter of policy. In those circumstances, the institution of criminal or injunctive proceedings against less favored persons could raise embarrassing implications of favoritism, retaliation or intimidation. This consideration, of course, would not apply to the use of the seal for deceptive purposes.

See, in this context, the attached memoranda from Assistant Attorney General Scalia to Associate Counsel Chapman, dated September 30, 1974; from Counsel to the President Buchen to Director Lynn, OMB, dated August 22, 1975; and from General Counsel Nichols, OMB, to Attorney General Levi, dated May 11, 1976.

As regards the second topic, we have advised the White House generally that no federal law restricts the use of the President's name or likeness as such. This would mean, e.g., that the use of the President's picture on souvenir items could not be prevented. On the other hand, remedies under the Federal Trade Commission Act and under State laws are available where the President's name or picture are used so as to imply that the President endorses, profits from, or is connected with, a product or that the communication involved is of an official nature. See attached memoranda from Assistant Attorney General Harmon to Associate Counsel Huron, dated May 3, 1977; and from Assistant Attorney General Katzenbach to Assistant Special Counsel to the President White, dated July 26, 1961.

We do not know whether and to what extent the recommendations made by this Office were followed.

Joe Rodota, of Public Affairs has dug up some interesting quotes by our former President, concerning the Reagan Administration, which you might find of interest in preparing your thoughts for the dedication of the Great Man's Library.

The first quote (note underscored), sort of explains how the rest may have come about:

When I was in the Navy in '52, I was working for Admiral Rickover. There was a meltdown of a reactor at Chalk River in Canada and I had to take my crew up there. We had 22 men and an officer under me and had to go up there and disassemble the reactor after it cooled off a little. At that time, the limits on radiation were probably 1,000 times higher than they are now and they let us get the maximum amount of radiation that was permissible at that time.

CARTER SPEAKS

"Things will be different for the Democrats in 1988," Carter said. "For one thing, Ronald Reagan will no longer be president -- and he has been a very popular president despite his atrocious policies."

He [Reagan] avoids responsibility, successfully, for anything that's unpleasant or disappointing or embarrassing or a failure. It's never his fault. It's always the fault of his cabinet members, of Congress, his predecessor in the White House, or some foreigner. Never his fault.

"This is the first time I have gone public," Mr. Carter said of this interview, "but some of his statements are almost more than a human being can bear."

I think he tends to exaggerate, sometimes to deliberately misstate facts to make his point about needing an enormous buildup in the Defense Department or not taking blame for anything that goes wrong and blaming his predecessors in office or in Congress or someone else.

Responding to questions by reporters, Carter said President Reagan's farm policy "has been a disaster."

...he's had no detectable achievements in foreign policy.

"The private sector role is increasingly important as the federal government withdraws its support of hunger programs, housing and arms control," Carter said, adding that he hoped "it wouldn't have been quite so necessary to have the Better World Society when I was in the White House."

"I never saw an anti-nuclear demonstrator" during his presidency, he said. "There was a certain conviction that we were pushing for the reduction of nuclear arms and the only opposition came from the Kremlin," he said.

The Reagan-backed Contra rebels are "mere puppets of the United States and would not exist a month without U.S. aid," Carter said. "They have no support in Nicaragua that I have been able to see. Their human rights violations are much more severe than the Sandinistas."

"Nicaragua lies in the seeds of successful negotiations," he said. "We are standing in the way of the contadora process."

--- UPI, 9/11/86

On the Libyan bombing raid:

"Billy hasn't been to Libya in a long time," Jimmy Carter said. "He never met Khadafy. But I think he would agree with my assessment that the bombing was ill-advised and a counterproductive response to terrorism."

Carter said he didn't think the bombing of Libya "has reduced the incidence of terrorism -- it's probably increased it. I think it's made Khadafy a hero in much of the world."

"He was an outcast. Now he is a hero," Mr. Carter said. The United States "has been universally condemned" for its action, he said.

We can try to frighten people [but that is] not a sign of greatness but a sign of bullying.

"If 17 years ago, somebody had killed Amy, I would not have rested until her killer was punished," Mr. Carter said.
