Objectives

- Rebut idea that it is in our interest to lean upon Arabs to get Syria to reopen pipeline from Iraq. Yes, this would relieve financial pressure on Iraq, but the Syrians would surely exact a price for having agreed to do moderate Arabs a favor. That price could not possibly be to our liking. Moreover, it is not in our interest to encourage Syrian-Iraqi entente. We might look at an alternative of rapid augmentation of pipieline through Turkey, or construction of new line through Jordan. Ikle said he would have engineers do quick private feasibility study.
- Key should be to protect our friends against the damage that would result from a dramatic escalation of the war. Answer is better preparedness on our part, not a political tilt toward Iraq. Idea of such a tilt looks more attractive in light of Iranian backed atrocities in Lebanon; but answer to that should be effective retaliation on the ground in Lebanon rather than warming up to an Iraqi regime which is every bit as capable of acting unjustly once freed from its current preoccupations.
 - Iranians, unlike the Afghans, have a strong accommodatist streak. If too badly isolated they could turn to Soviets. We need to be firm in repulsing Iranian attacks on our friends, but we shouldn't gratuitously create conditions that would provide Soviets--especially in post-Grenada environment--with pretext for invoking their 1921 treaty with Iran.
 - We also need to walk a fine line, distancing ourselves from the current Iranian regime, but encouraging the South Koreans and Japanese to try, in the course of their economic dealings, to cultivate assets and contacts that would be critical in a post-Khomeini succession crisis.
 - Finally, whatever limited moves we may take to forestall complete collapse of Iraq, it is important to take a very firm posture on CW question.
- Central question is that of our posture in the event of hostilities and our willingness to predeploy forces that can help to deter and effectively cope with new violence. Our intelligence community notes that, even with AWACS, the Saudis could not today prevent the Iranians from damaging key facilities. While the Iranians might not be able to cripple Saudi Arabia's oil production centers, even a little damage may be a lot in terms of adversely affecting the internal Saudi political situation and maintaining a regime

whose legitimacy hinges to a large extent on its ability to protect the symbols and attributes of national power.

Therefore, we need some clear guidance from the President on what our posture should be in the event of hostilities; and we need to secure decisions on precautionary deployment of mineclearing assets to Oman and tactical air to Saudi Arabia. According to the JCS, it would take us a full eight days to get a helicopter minesweeping squadron (six helicopters) to the Gulf and in excess of 40 days to get ocean-going minesweepers in. French minesweepers are three weeks away. The current crisis aside, routinizing precautionary deployments can help to stabilize expectations and prevent miscalculations.

Finally, there is an opportunity here. Protecting Gulf shipping and production facilities is something we can do and the Soviet can't. Moreover, we can do it at low risk to ourselves. It is a success waiting to be created, if we handle the situation adroitly. It demonstrates continued worldwide U.S momentum, resilience, and agility.

STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT

In my address to the American people last week concerning events in Lebanon and Grenada, I spoke of my determination to spare no effort to identify those responsible for the October 23 attack on our Marines in Beirut. I promised that if the perpetrators could be identified, their act would not go unpunished.

Our intelligence confirms that the insidious act which took the lives of 235 of our Marines that Sunday morning was sponsored, funded and otherwise supported by sovereign states as a means to achieve poltical objectives. These states sought to force us out of Lebanon by terrorizing our forces and thereby weakening our commitment to bringing peace to Lebanon. After a careful and painstaking search, we determined the identity of the group responsible for this cowardly crime. Although they sought anonymity, we know the culprits were the so-called "Husayni Suicide Commandos", a fanatical group with headquarters in the Bekaa valley of Lebanon. We are also sure that this group is supported and directed by the government of the Islamic Republic of Iran. Further, we believe that there is good reason to assume certain Syrian officials were aware of this group's plans, and that their movement to Beirut may have been facilitated by individuals employed by the Syrian government.

On the basis of the solid evidence developed, we have taken steps to discourage further attacks by these international criminals. About one hour ago, at _____EST, aircraft from the carrier USS Eisenhower attacked a headquarters and training complex

in the Bekaa Valley used by the group. The strike was successful. All aircraft have been recovered safely.

I deeply regret that this action was necessary.

We took every conceivable precaution to limit damage to innocent civilians and to avoid armed confrontation with third parties.

We are prepared to let the matter rest here, although I caution those states responsible for supporting this form of terrorism that we have increased our vigilance and heightened our readiness.

The United States will work closely with other governments victimized by unprovoked and state-sponsored terrorism to preclude future crimes such as that perpetrated against our Marines. We call on all nations which subscribe to a moral code governing the conduct of relations between nations to join in a resolute and decided effort to curb this criminal conduct.

- AT 0001 HOURS GMT NOVEMBER , STRIKE AIRCRAFT FROM THE UNITED STATES SIXTH FLEET ATTACKED A HEADQUARTERS/TRAINING CAMP COMPLEX IN THE BEKAA VALLEY OF LEBANON BELONGING TO THE GROUP WE KNOW WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OCTOBER 23 ATTACK ON OUR MNF UNIT. THE AIRCRAFT ENCOUNTERED NO OPPOSITION AND ALL WERE RECOVERED SAFELY.
- 3. THE PURPOSE OF THIS ATTACK WAS TO RESPOND DECISIVELY AT THE SOURCE OF THE TERRORIST ATTACK ON OUR MARINES. THIS SURGICAL ACTION IS INTENDED TO PREEMPT FURTHER STRIKES BY THIS PARTICULAR GROUP, THE SO-CALLED "HUSAYNI SUICIDE COMMANDOS" OF THE DISSIDENT ISLAMIC AMAL MOVEMENT (NOT TO BE CONFUSED WITH THE AMAL ORGANIZATION UNDER THE LEBANESE LEADER NABIH BERRI). IT IS ALSO INTENDED TO DETER SIMILAR ACTIONS BY OTHER TERRORIST ORGANIZATIONS.
- POSTS SHOULD SEEK APPOINTMENT WITH FOREIGN MINISTRIES AT FIRST OPPORTUNITY TO EXPLAIN NATURE AND PURPOSE OF OUR ACTION. THE SURGICAL NATURE OF THE OPERATION AND THE CARE TAKEN TO MINIMIZE COLLATERAL DAMAGE TO INNOCENT CIVILIANS SHOULD BE STRESSED. IT SHOULD ALSO BE EMPHASIZED THAT THE USG IS PREPARED TO LET THIS MATTER REST HERE. WE SEEK NO FURTHER OBJECTIVES THAN THOSE OUTLINED ABOVE. HOWEVER, WE HAVE SUBSTANTIAL EVIDENCE THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF ISLAMIC REPUBLIC OF IRAN ENCOURAGED AND SUPPORTED THE ATTACKON OUR MARINES, AND WE SUSPECT THAT CERTAIN SYRIAN OFFICIALS WERE INVOLVED. IN THE EVENT OF ANY FUTURE TERRORIST ACTS OF THIS NATURE WHICH WE BELIEVE ARE DIRECTED, SUPPORTED, OR FACILITATED BY SOVEREIGN STATES, THE UNITED STATES WILL HOLD THESE STATES ACCOUNTABLE.
