Dear President Reagan,

I am writing you in hope that you can help me resolve a problem stemming from the death of my father.

My father passed away August 29, 1984 while in Hobe Sound, Florida. We had the appropriate funeral service in Florida shortly after his death. However, since my father was a longtime resident of Rockville, Maryland, he elected to be buried in Rockville Cemetery. We plan to have a memorial service October 20th to honor my father's memory and give local friends who were not able to attend the funeral in Florida a chance to pay their respects.

In conjunction with this service, I have been desperately trying to arrange for an honor guard to attend and give my father the military send-off that he deserves. My father served in the Air Force during World War 2 (Army Serial # 11023809) and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross. I know that he always wanted a military service when he died and here lies the root of my problem. I contacted the Veterans Administration to try to set up arrangements for an honor guard and was told to contact Bolling Air Force Base. Bolling Air Force Base informed me that its honor guard is on-call for Arlington Cemetery and that I could not schedule an honor guard in advance. I was told to call them the day before the service and only then could they tell me if they could send someone over. Needless to say, I cannot coordinate something like this in 24 hours.

I then contacted various local VFW branches and was told that since my father was not an "active" member of the VFW and had not paid his dues, they could not do anything for him. One would think that 33 missions over Japan would be enough dues for anyone to pay, but apparently the VFW does not think so.

Next, I contacted Maryland Congressman Mike Barnes' office in an attempt to solicit his help. I was told that the Congressman's office was working on the situation, but it was doubtful that anything could be done.

Since my father was a member of the White House staff during his career in Washington, I was hoping that you might be able to solve this problem. All that we ask is the appearance of an honor guard from any branch of the service to honor my father's memory and present the familiy with a flag. Having taps played would be nice too, but I do not want to push my luck.

When I stop and think about the thousands of dollars that we spend every year to have military personnel honor foreign dignitaries it seems to me that the military should take the time to honor one of its own. Thanks for taking the time to address this matter. You are our last hope.

Roland George Duggan,

66, a retired operating engineer with the General Services Administration who was assigned to the White House and was a decorated veteran of World War II, died of a heart ailment Aug. 29 at The Hospital in Jupiter, Fla.

Mr. Duggan, who lived in Hobe Sound, Fla., was born in Hinsdale, N.H. During World War II, he served in the Army Air Forces and won the Distinguished Flying Cross as a member of a bomber crew in the Pacific.

He was an air conditioning engineer in Pennsylvania before moving to the Washington area in 1959. He managed the gift shop at the Washington Hospital Center until 1966, when he joined the GSA. He retired in 1980.

Mr. Duggan was a member of the Rockville Presbyterian Church. He moved from Potomac to Hobe Sound when he left the government.

Survivors include his wife, Lois, of Hobe Sound; two children, Theodore George Duggan of Germantown and Linda Thomas of Frederick, Md.; and four sisters, Florence Bosely of Canton, Ohio, Doris Lovette of Massillon, Ohio, Bernice Pavao of Hinsdale, and Jeanne Bechard of Wilbraham, Mass.



Thank you for your telegram of October 6, 1985 to President Reagan concerning a military funeral for your father. The Casualty and Memorial Affairs Operations Center oversees the Department of the Army Burial Honors Program. Therefore, I am answering your inquiry on behalf of Mr. Reagan.

Your request for assistance in obtaining honors for your father was not received in time for my staff to help you, so I assume Mr. Laity was laid to rest without honors from the active Army. I checked with the Casualty Office at Fort Devens, Massachusetts which is tasked with the mission of providing burial honors to your area of New York. I was told they have no record of a request for honors for your father.

I am very interested in learning the difficulties you encountered in trying to obtain a military funeral for your father. Please let me know what transpired so I will be able to look into the matter.

I extend my sympathy to you and your family on the loss of a fine soldier.

NO HONORS

On October 4, 1985, my father, a World War II veteran and ten-year resident of the City of Tonawanda, passed away. One of my father's last requests was to have a military funeral. My father sacrificed four (4) years of his life to defend his country and was awarded several ribbons and commemoriations. These included the Presidential Unit Citation, two battle stars and a Good Conduct Ribbon as well as a Pacific Campaign Ribbon. My father was a Military Policeman with the 720th Military Police Battalian and also participated in Special Funeral detachments concerned with protection of bodily remains from cannibals in New Guinea.

My father belonged to the Black Diamond Post 395 in Kingston, PA., which is a branch of the American Legion. His membership card states "Any privileges or courtesies extended to him will be appreciated by Black Diamond Post...". I requested aid from these people in an effort to obtain for my father his last request. I enlisted the aid of the Brounshidle American Legion also.

Both had promised some assistance, whether it be a small group of legionnaires to have a memorial service (which Brounshidle promised) or whether it be to call Fort Drum as the Black Diamond Post promised. Both promises were not carried out. Fort Drum, after having promised Black Diamond Post that soldiers would be sent, declined to send them. Brounshidle Amvets did not even show up at all.

In the course of the weekend after my father died (my dad died on a Friday night), my sister, my brother-in-law and myself made a concerted effort to receive for my father his last request. My sister suggested a telegram to the President (I had already called the Governor's office in Albany and was told that the request would be given to the Governor's staff). I decided to call the White House. After having reached the White House, I relayed my request to the switchboard operator who then connected me with a colonel at the Pentagon, who then referred me to Arlington National Cemetery. I then got referred to Fort Devins, MA. I spoke with a Captain Cerner who passed the buck down to a Specialist Meyers. For the next 24 hours, we waited, calling back and forth to Fort Devins asking for status reports. At one point, I was told that they could not reach us, that there was trouble on the line. The operator tells me that the line was clear and operable.

I am told by my brother-in-law who served on special funeral details can be rounded up at an hour's notice. Fort Devins tells me that 48 hours notice was needed. Fort Drum personnel backed out completely. So what about our own National Guard? My God, it is easy for me to see how Pearl Harbor was attacked on a Sunday. No-one is there on a weekend. I got to speak with a "State Janitor" at the Connecticut Street Armory, a "State Janitor."

On Oct. 19, 1985, I received a letter from the Department of the Army. It was signed by Col. Tony De-Berardino, Director, Casualty and Memorial Affairs. In this letter, Col. DeBerardino states "I am answering your inquiry on behalf of Mr. Reagan...Your request for assistance in obtaining honors for your father was not received in time for my staff to help you...I checked with the Casualty Office at Fort Devins, MA. which is tasked with the mission of providing burial honors for your area of New York...I was told they have no record of a request for honor for your father' NO record of a request?? That is not the truth. We tried for hours and even days to get these people to honor my father's wishes. The Colonel himself admits "Certainly our veterans are deserving of military honors, if at all possible". Col. DeBerardino goes on to say in his letter that he extends his "sympathy to myself and my family on the loss of a fine soldier'

The reply I received from the Department of the Army was prompted by a telegram I sent to the President himself, informing him of the red tape that was evident. Yes, my dad was a fine soldier. As such, he "deserved" recognition, he deserved the military funeral honors he requested.

Not only was he a fine soldier, he was a fine parent, a fine man and a fine American. One of our neighbors commented that he was "the most patriotic man on the whole block, he always had his flag out on holidays". The day he died and for three days thereafter, my family flew that same flag at half mast.

The mayor of the City of Tonawanda, Mr. David Miller, was called at home and was asked by me to help if he could. He told me that I would "have to wait until Monday morning when my office opens, I cannot help you now". I asked if he could not contact a National Guard unit to request a funeral detachment for my father. He said "No". I brought up the question: what would happen if there were a disaster in Tonawanda over the weekend. would he then be able to call the National Guard? His reply was that a "Disaster preparedness plan would then be followed and he would be able to then call the National Guard". Why could be not call them in this case. As an honorably discharged veteran, my father serves a military funeral" in words of the Commander of his old V.F.W. Post. Col. Berardino concurs "Veterans are deserving of military honors".

As you may well know from my previous letters to the editor, I work for the Veteran's Administration Medical Center. I had even asked them to help me grant my father's last request. This was to no avail. No explanation was given to me concerning their failure to give me assistance. No acknowledgement of the request was made to me.

My father, however, will be remembered in other ways. Dietrich Bonhoffer said, "In ordinary life we hardly realize that we receive a great deal more than we give, and that it is only with gratitude that life becomes rich. It is very easy to overestimate the importance of our own achievements in comparison with what we owe others". Those of us who will remember George R. Laity, Sr. will realize what we "owe" others. My father taught me about the horrors of war and then I saw it for myself in Vietnam. He taught me respect for life and then sacrificed his. He taught me Love and then gave me his.

Yes, Col. DeBerardino, my father was a "fine soldier". The Army should realize that. His family realizes that he also was an excellent human being. I think it feasible that the Army could provide a gravesite memorial even to this day. He deserves it as do all veterans and servicemen whom, with my father shared the common bond of self-sacrifice for his fellowman and patriotic dedicatin to America's high ideals.

My father had a very hard life. He worked as a coal miner and contracted Black Lung disease. He and my mom raised seven children. My father also worked as a tool setter at the Chevrolet Tonawanda Motor Plant. He was a hard-working, honest and principled person. He gave it all he had, all his life. In what he taught us of life, its ups and its downs, he will always be remembered with love. The world has lost a good man. So long for now, Dad. God bless you and keep you forever.

May all who read these words find comfort in the fact that like Father Kozlowski of St. Francis of Assisi Church said at my father's Mass of Christian Burial: "Life does not end, it just changes". Contemplate the butterly. God Bless you all. Robert C. Laity


Dear Archbishop Hannan:

Dear Senator Johnston:

Your letter of January 11, 1988, to The White House, Legislative Affairs, concerning Hr. Walter Manning's desire to add a special inscription to his headstone, has been referred to my office for response. I am pleased to address this matter and to provide additional information which affects Mr. Manning's request.

On January 29, 1988, at Mr. Manning's request and with approval by the Veterans Administration, his wife Ann's cremated remains were disinterred from Baton Rouge National Cametery and returned to him. Mr. Manning indicated he may take the remains to Arlington National Cametery for burial in the gravesite of his former wife. Also, he may request to be buried at Arlington upon his death. In a case like this, a replacement headstone is furnished upon notification from the national or State veterans' cemetery that a subsequent burial has occurred.

The special inscription Mr. Manning desires, MADE IN USA, can be accommodated on a Government headstone. As an additional inscription item, it may not be provided at Government expense. However, it may be authorized at private expense, provided Mr. Manning makes this known to the person designated to handle the reinterment of his wife, or his affairs after his death, and it is requested upon burial. This special inscription becomes a private transaction between the applicant and the Government contractor, with whom the headstone order is placed. At the present time, such an inscription generally costs in the range of \$50 to \$80.
