



Section 202(d) of the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1622(d)) provides for the automatic termination of a national emergency unless, prior to the anniversary date of its declaration, the President publishes in the Federal Register and transmits to the Congress a notice stating that the emergency is to continue in effect beyond the anniversary date. In accordance with this provision, I have sent the enclosed notice, stating that the Iran emergency is to continue in effect beyond November 14, 1988, to the Federal Register for publication. Similar notices were sent to the Congress and the Federal Register on November 12, 1980, November 12, 1981, November 8, 1982, November 4, 1983, November 7, 1984, November 1, 1985, November 10, 1986, and November 10, 1987.

The crisis between the United States and Iran that began in 1979 has not been fully resolved. Although the international tribunal established to adjudicate claims of U.S. nationals against Iran and of Iranian nationals against the United States continues to function, normalization of commercial and diplomatic relations between the United States and Iran has not been achieved. In these circumstances, I have determined that it is necessary to maintain in force the broad authorities that may be

needed in the process of implementing the January 1981 agreements with Iran and in the eventual normalization of relations with that country.

Dear Mr. President:

Under the National Emergencies Act, the November 14, 1979, declaration of national emergency with respect to Iran will terminate on November 14, 1988, unless, prior to that date, you publish in the Federal Register and transmit to the Congress a notice stating that the emergency is to continue in effect.

The ongoing claims settlement process created by the Algiers Accords of January 19, 1981, continues to implicate important diplomatic, financial, and legal interests of United States nationals. If the Iranian emergency were allowed to lapse, it would significantly impair our ability to continue to take actions pursuant to the Claims Settlement Agreement, and to take all other necessary actions until such time as there is a return to normal relations.

For these reasons, I recommend that you sign, transmit to the Congress, and publish in the Federal Register the necessary notice of extension.

Enclosed are the following documents:

- The proposed notice of extension;
- A proposed letter transmitting the notice to the Congress; and
- A copy of the notice of extension submitted to the Congress last year.



Notice of November 10, 1987

Continuation of Iran Emergency

On November 14, 1979, by Executive Order No. 12170, the President declared a national emergency to deal with the threat to the national security, foreign policy, and economy of the United States constituted by the situation in Iran. Notices of the continuation of this national emergency were transmitted by the President to the Congress and the *Federal Register* on November 12, 1980, November 12, 1981, November 8, 1982, November 4, 1983, November 7, 1984, November 1, 1985, and November 12, 1986. Because our relations with Iran have not yet returned to normal, and the process of implementing the January 19, 1981, agreements with Iran is still underway, the national emergency declared on November 14, 1979, must continue in effect beyond November 14, 1987. Therefore, in accordance with section 202(d) of the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1622(d)), I am continuing the national emergency with respect to Iran. This shall be published in the *Federal Register* and transmitted to the Congress.



Under the National Emergencies Act, the November 14, 1979 declaration of national emergency with respect to Iran will expire on November 14, 1988 unless the President formally extends it prior to that date. Termination of the Iranian emergency would undercut the ongoing claims settlement at The Hague and the economic sanctions you approved last year.

Treasury's recommendation to extend the emergency (Tab C) has full interagency support. It would be helpful for the President to sign the attached notice of extension (Tab A) and the proposed letter to Congress (Tab B) by COB, Monday November 7, in order for the notice to be published in the Federal Register by November 14.

Nicholas *NS* Rostow and Alison Fortier *AF* concur. *Steve Farnam concurs.*
