Revised Teltschik Cable

Embassy Bonn informs me that Teltschik was engaged in a lengthy struggle with the FRG foreign ministry over the content of the Reagan/Kohl negotiated statement. Teltschik has personally informed the Embassy that they are amenable to extensive revision of this draft statement. There is some speculation that Teltschik decided to put off his internal battle for now, recognizing that all would have to be settled in Washington in any case.

Attached is a revised cable to Teltschik reflecting changes you had previously made, congratulating Teltschik for his recent promotion to Deputy Chief of Staff of the Chancellery, and incorporating changes which make clear that considerable work needs to be done, especially on the draft text and on coordination of NATO defense efforts.

We will be meeting with representatives of State and Defense to discuss revisions in the draft text and may wish to forward these to Teltschik before he leaves Bonn. If so, we will provide you with a recommended follow-on cable with a revised text.

Meeting with Horst Teltschik

In Ron Lehman's and Don Mahley's absence, I thought I would put on paper how we might proceed with Horst Teltschik's visit on Monday, November 19. On his return, Ron may wish to modify this approach, which I have discussed with Jim Dobbins at State.

It is my understanding that Teltschik's high-level team will include Fred Ruth, Arms Control Commissioner at the Foreign Ministry, and Major General Huettel, who heads the Pol-Mil section at the MOD. Their goal is to reach agreement on a joint statement for use at the conclusion of the President's November 30 meeting with Kohl.

In Bud's absence (he will be in California with the President), Ron, in my view, should chair the meeting. In the past, he was joined by Richard Burt and Richard Perle. Burt will be out of town—in such cases, Dobbins usually represents Burt on this subject. There is also the question of participation by PM, JCS and ACDA. I prefer the smaller group, but this decision can await Ron's return.

On substance, Teltschik was to have sent us a proposed draft statement. I don't believe it has arrived. It is obvious from previous discussions and the make-up of the German team that the Germans will wish to give equal, or even higher, attention to East-West relations and arms control than to improving NATO's conventional defense. Our task will be to get emphasis and detail on the need for NATO conventional force improvements into the Reagan-Kohl statement. We will also need to agree with Teltschik and company on the mechanics of launching a NATO initiative and, in particular, how to ensure that NATO agrees to undertake such an initiative at the December Ministerial meeting.

I strongly recommend that you send State a copy of the German draft statement, when and if Teltschik sends it.

In summary, this memo is intended for background if Bud should ask for the status. It is also intended to bring Ron up-to-date on what I have discussed with Dobbins. (I will be at West Point when Ron returns.)

RON LEHMAN HAS BRIEFED ME ON THE RESULTS OF YOUR MEETING LAST MONDAY. I AM PLEASED THAT WE HAVE REACHED SUBSTANTIAL ACCORD ON A DRAFT STATEMENT WHICH WOULD ALLOW THE CHANCELLOR AND THE PRESIDENT JOINTLY TO MAKE SOME IMPORTANT POINTS ON THE NEED TO IMPROVE NATO'S CONVENTIONAL FORCE POSTURE. AS WELL AS ADDRESSING EAST-WEST RELATIONS AND ARMS CONTROL.

I KNOW YOU ARE AWARE OF OUR STRONG INTEREST IN ENSURING THAT THE VISIT AND STATEMENT RESULT IN MEANINGUL ACTION WITHIN THE ALLIANCE IN THE AREA OF CONVENTIONAL FORCE IMPROVEMENTS BOTH TO STRENGTHEN NATO'S DETERRENT AND TO RAISE THE NUCLEAR THRESHOLD. IN OUR VIEW. THIS EFFORT NEEDS TO BE PRODDED IN DECEMBER AT THE DPC MINISTERIAL. AT LEAST TO THE EXTENT OF CHARGING THE SECRETARY GENERAL WITH DEVELOPING. OVER THE COMING SPRING. AN ORGANIZATIONAL

APPROACH AND TERMS OF REFERENCE TO BE REPORTED BACK TO THE DPC IN MAY. SUCH AN UNDERTAKING WOULD BE THE LOGICAL FOLLOW-UP TO AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CHANCELLOR AND THE PRESIDENT TO SEEK A COHERENT APPROACH TO ENHANCING NATO'S CONVENTIONAL CAPABILITIES. IN COMBINATION WITH SHORT-TERM MEASURES WHICH WE UNDERSTAND THE ALLIANCE WILL TAKE, IT COULD GIVE A MAJOR IMPULSE TO RAISING THE NUCLEAR THRESHOLD, AND WOULD ALSO HELP US IN FENDING OFF HARMFULL U.S. CONGRESSIONAL INITIATIVES NEXT SPRING.

AS FOR THE NAC, WE AGREE WHOLLY THAT ITS COMMUNIQUE SHOULD INCLUDE A STRONG STATEMENT ON EASTKKK-WEST RELATIONS, ARMS CONTROL AND CONVENTIONAL DEFENSE. WE ALSO SUPPORT AND INTEND TO CONTINUE INTENSIVE CONSULTATIONS WITHIN THE ALLIANCE ON EAST-WEST RELATIONS AND ARMS CONTROL. WE BELIEVE OUR PAST RECORD ON CONSULTATIONS CLEARLY DEMONSTRATES OUR COMMITMENT TO SUCH DISCUSSION. WE WOULD, AS YOU KNOW, BE OPPOSED TO CREATING NEW PROCEDURAL FRAMEWORKS OR BODIES FOR THIS PURPOSE. A FULL NETWORK OF STRUCTURES ALREADY EXISTS AND THE ONLY REQUIREMENT IS TO USE THEM EFFECTIVELY -- AS INDEED THE ALLIANCE HAS DONE IN RECENT YEARS. HOWEVER, THE NAC IS NOT THE APPROPRIATE BODY TO LAUNCH A CONVENTIONAL DEFENSE EFFORT, WHICH IS CLEARLY THE RESPONSIBILITY OF DEFENSE MINISTERS. MOREOVER, BECAUSE OF FRENCH PRESENCE, THE NAC COULD NOT APPROPRIATELY ASK THE SYG TO DEVELOP THE ACTION-ORIENTED CONVENTIONAL FORCE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM WHICH WE NEED.

FOR THESE REASONS, I HOPE WE CAN OUICKLY AGREE THAT THE APPROPRIATE FOLLOW-UP TO THE CHANCELLOR'S VISIT SHOULD BE A CALL IN THE DPC COMMUNIQUE FOR THE SECRETARY GENERAL TO ORGANIZE AN EFFORT IN THE FIELD OF CONVENTIONAL DEFENSE, AND TO FOLLOW THIS UP IN THE NAC COMMUNIQUE WITH A BROAD STATEMENT ON THE ALLIANCE'S APPROACH TO EAST-WEST RELATIONS, ARMS CONTROL, AND CONVENTIONAL DEFENSE, ALONG WITH A RENEWED PLEDGE TO CLOSE ALLIANCE CONSULTATIONS ON ALL THESE ISSUES. EAST-WEST RELATIONS AND ARMS CONTROL CONSULTATIONS COULD BE ACCOMPLISHED THROUGH THE NORTH ATLANTIC COUNCIL AND OTHER EXISTING FORA. EARLY AGREEMENT ON THIS APPROACH IS IMPORTANT IF WE ARE TO LAY THE NECESSARY GROUNDWORK

WITH THE SECRETARY GENERAL AND OUR OTHER ALLIES IN THE SHORT PERIOD BEFORE THE DPC MEETING, I.E., CONSULTATIONS SHOULD BEGIN IN BRUSSELS AND IS SELECTED CAPITALS NEXT WEEK. SINCE THE INITIAL APPEAL BY THE DPC FOR AN ESSENTIALLY ORGANIZATIONAL MANDATE TO THE SERETARY GENERAL WILL NOT BE OVERLY SPECIFIC OR AMBITIOUS, WE BELIEVE THE ALLIANCE CAN REACH AGREEMENT AT THE DECEMBER MEETINGS. BUT AN IMPORTANT FIRST STEP IS TO AGREE NOW BETWEEN OURSELVES ON COMMON OBJECTIVES.

ON A RELATED MATTER, WE ARE CONFIDENT THAT YOU ARE AS PLEASED AS WE ARE THAT WE HAVE NOW SET A DATE TO RESUME TALKS WITH THE SOVIETS. OUR JOINT STATEMENT WILL, OF COURSE, HAVE TO BE UPDATED TO REFLECT THIS POSITIVE DEVELOPMENT.

I LOOK FORWARD TO HEARING FROM YOU AS SOON AS POSSIBLE AND ANTICIPATE A HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL VISIT ON NOVEMBER 30.

Dear Horst:

Ron Lehman has briefed me on the results of your meeting last Monday. I am pleased that we have reached substantial accord on a draft statement which would allow the Chancellor and the President jointly to make some important points on the need to improve NATO's conventional force posture, as well as addressing East-West relations and arms control.

I know you are aware of our strong interest in ensuring that the visit and statement result in meaningful action within the Alliance in the area of conventional force improvements both to strengthen NATO's deterrent and to raise the nuclear threshold. In our view, this effort needs to be prodded in December at the DPC Ministerial, at least to the extent of charging the Secretary General with developing, over the coming spring, an organizational approach and terms of reference to be reported back to the DPC in May. Such an undertaking would be the logical follow-up to an agreement between the Chancellor and the President to seek a

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coherent approach to enhancing NATO's conventional capabilities. In combination with short-term measures which we understand the Alliance will take, it could give a major impulse to raising the nuclear threshold, and would also help us in fending off harmful US Congressional initiatives next spring.

As for the NAC, we agree wholly that its communique should include a strong statement on East-West relations, arms control and conventional defense. We also support and intend to continue intensive consultations within the Alliance on East-West relations and arms control. We believe our past record on consultations clearly demonstrates our commitment to such discussion. We would, as you know, be opposed to creating new procedural frameworks or bodies for this purpose. A full network of structures already exists and the only requirement is to use them effectively -- as indeed the Alliance has done in recent years. However, the NAC is not the appropriate body to launch a conventional defense effort, which is clearly the responsibility of defense ministers. Moreover, because of French presence, the NAC could not appropriately ask the SYG to develop the action-oriented conventional force improvement program which we need.

For these reasons, I hope we can quickly agree that the appropriate follow-up to the Chancellor's visit should be a call in the DPC communique for the Secretary General to organize an effort









in the field of conventional defense, and to follow this up in the NAC communique with a broad statement on the Alliance's approach to East-West relations, arms control, and conventional defense, along with a renewed pledge to close Alliance consultations on all these issues. East-West relations and arms control consultations could be accomplished through the North Atlantic Council and other existing fora. Early agreement on this approach is important if we are to lay the necessary groundwork with the Secretary General and our other Allies in the short period before the DPC meeting, i.e., consultations should begin in Brussels and in selected capitals next week. Since the initial appeal by the DPC for an essentially organizational mandate to the Secretary General will not be overly specific or ambitious, we believe the Alliance can reach agreement at the December meetings, but an important first step is to agree now between ourselves on common objectives.

On a related matter, we are confident that you are as pleased as we are that we have now set a date to resume talks with the Soviets. Our joint statement will, of course, have to be updated to reflect this positive development.

I look forward to hearing from you as soon as possible and anticipate a highly successful visit on November 30.
