SUBJECT: UNIVERSITY CLEGE GALWAY - DR. O'HEOCHA

1. YOU WILL RECALL THAT WHEN WE VISITED UNIVERSITY COLLEGE GALWAY (UCG) ON MARCH 31, PRESIDENT O'HEOCHA RAISED WITH US THE POSSIBILITY OF PRESIDENT REAGAN'S MARKING IN A TANGIBLE WAY HIS VISIT TO UCG.

2. DR. O'HEOCHA ON APRIL 25 MADE SEVERAL SUGGESTIONS TO ME ABOUT WHAT SUCH A GESTURE MIGHT CONSIST OF. HE ADMITTED THAT THEY WERE ALL PRELIMINARY IDEAS BUT THOUGHT THAT THEY MIGHT HELP TO FOCUS WASHINGTON THINKING. HE MENTIONED FOUR POSSIBILITIES, NAMELY:  
A. ESTABLISH A CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF IRISH-AMERICAN RELATIONS AT UCG. SUCH A CENTER DR. O'HEOCHA BELIEVED MIGHT INVOLVE FIVE OR SIX PEOPLE TO PROMOTE IRISH AND AMERICAN STUDIES IN UNIVERSITIES IN IRELAND AND IN THE UNITED STATES. THE COST OF SUCH A PROGRAM, HE THOUGHT, COULD RUN UP TO ONE MILLION POUNDS;  
B. GIVEN THE STRONG USG SUPPORT FOR AMERICAN INVESTMENT IN IRELAND, AND IRELAND'S GROWING REPUTATION IN THE ELECTRONICS SECTOR, ESTABLISH A CENTER OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (INVOLVING A DEDICATED COMPUTER PLUS SOFTWARE). SUCH A CENTER, HE THOUGHT, MIGHT INVOLVE A STAFF OF TWO OR THREE PLUS THE COST OF A COMPUTER, ETC. THE PRICE TAG FOR THIS WOULD SEEM IN O'HEOCHA'S VIEW TO BE CLOSE TO ONE MILLION POUNDS AS WELL;  
C. ESTABLISH AN ANNUAL VISITING LECTURESHIP AT UCG IN THE AREA OF BIOTECHNOLOGY OR INFORMATION EXCHANGE; AND  
D. ESTABLISH A PROGRAM FOR JOINT MARINE STUDIES TO EXPLORE THE IRISH CONTINENTAL SHELF. O'HEOCHA INDICATED THAT GIVEN IRELAND'S NEUTRALITY SUCH A PROGRAM WOULD HAVE TO BE CAREFULLY TAILORED TO AVOID ANY SUGGESTION OF MILITARY OVERTONES. HE THOUGHT THE SCRIPPS INSTITUTION OF OCEANOGRAPHY (UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA - SAN DIEGO) AND WOODS HOLE OCEANOGRAPHIC INSTITUTION OF MASSACHUSETTS WOULD BE ABLE TO PROVIDE FURTHER DETAILS ABOUT THIS AREA.

3. I TOLD DR. O'HEOCHA THAT THE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS ASSOCIATED WITH OPTIONS A AND B SEEMED TO MAKE THEM UNLIKELY. HE APPRECIATED THIS BUT SUGGESTED THAT A GESTURE SUCH AS OUTLINED ABOVE COULD BE A MEANINGFUL AND APPROPRIATE GESTURE.

4. COMMENT: GIVEN LIMITED TIME BEFORE THE PRESIDENT'S VISIT, I WOULD ESTIMATE CHANCES OF PRESIDENT ANNOUNCING ANYTHING CONCRETE ARE MINIMAL. HOWEVER IF DR. O'HEOCHA COULD BE ADVISED THAT THE USG AND/OR PRIVATE U. S. BODIES

SUBJECT SUMMARY OF INCLEMENT WEATHER OPTIONS FOR NORMANDY  
EVENTS - JUNE 6

Following is a summary of the memorandum Pete Metzger submitted to you regarding the inclement weather options for the Normandy events on June 6. These summaries include only those options which we discussed as viable, in light of the number of personnel to be moved.

OPTION I

- Clear weather in London, the English Channel, Normandy.
- Chopper from Winfield House to Normandy and return.
- 2 H-3s & 2 H-53s for a total of 92 seats.
- Weather call by 0600 hours 6/6.

OPTION II

- Poor weather in London, English Channel, Normandy in early morning.
- M-cade to Heathrow, AF-1 to Cherbourg, M-cade or chopper (if weather has cleared) to events. Return via chopper if weather permits.
- Pre-position chopper package at Cherbourg prior to 6/6 in case weather conditions clear to permit return via choppers.
- Weather call by 0800 6/5.

OPTION III

- Poor weather in London, poor weather in Normandy.
- M-cade to Heathrow, AF-1 to Cherbourg, m-cade to events.
- Weather call by 0600 6/6.

SIDES OF THE ATLANTIC. GOI PROTOCOL OFFICER BRIAN NASON, HOWEVER, DISAGREES COMPLETELY WITH ABOVE VIEWPOINT, STATING THAT RECORD "SMACKS OF SHAMROCKERY" AND THUS DOES NOT HAVE GOI ENDORSEMENT FOR INCLUSION IN OFFICIAL PROGRAM. WITH ALL DUE RESPECT, POST BELIEVES, NEVERTHELESS, THAT BRENDAN GRACE'S PROPOSITION, DESCRIBED BELOW, IS INDEED WORTHY OF STUDY FOR INCLUSION AS A "NON-OFFICIAL" PART OF THE PRESIDENT'S PROGRAM. NASON SAID GOI WOULD HAVE NO PROBLEM WHATSOEVER WITH EMBASSY ARRANGING UNOFFICIALLY FOR A MEETING BETWEEN THE PRESIDENT AND BRENDAN GRACE. GRACE, BY THE WAY, HAS PERFORMED NOT ONLY IN IRELAND BUT ALSO IN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE UNITED STATES. HE RECENTLY HAD FIVE TOP-SELLING ALBUMS IN A ROW.

2. GRACE PROPOSES PREMIERING THE RECORD'S RELEASE BY SINGING THE BALLAD TO PRESIDENT AND MRS. REAGAN SOMETIME DURING THEIR IRISH VISIT. WHAT MAKES GRACE'S REQUEST NOTEWORTHY IS HIS WILLINGNESS TO DONATE ALL ROYALTIES FROM THE RECORD'S SALE TO CHARITY. (THE DISC WITH A NICE RENDITION OF "I'LL TAKE YOU HOME AGAIN, KATHLEEN" ON THE FLIPSIDE WILL BE SOLD INTERNATIONALLY.) REVENUE FROM IRISH SALES WOULD GO TO IRELAND'S PRESTIGIOUS CENTRAL REMEDIAL CLINIC, WIDELY AND FAVORABLY RECOGNIZED FOR ITS WORK WITH THE HANDICAPPED. PROFITS FROM SALES IN THE U.S. WOULD BE GIVEN TO A CHARITY OF MRS. REAGAN'S CHOICE, OR COULD ALSO BE DEDICATED TO THE IRISH CLINIC. (SHOULD THE RECORD "TAKE OFF," PROCEEDS COULD INDEED BE SIZABLE.)

3. GRACE INFORMED THE EMBASSY THAT THROUGH AMERICAN CONTACTS IN THE U.S. A CASSETTE OF THE RECORDING HAS BEEN SENT TO DAVID LOWENFELD, INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS FELLOW, NEW YORK COUNCIL OF FOREIGN RELATIONS WHO REPORTEDLY IS BRINGING THE MATTER TO THE ATTENTION OF

Following are some issues which have been raised during Rick Ahearn's negotiations with the Irish Government:

I. Industrial Event in Galway:

The Irish Government is very anxious for the President to drop-by an American industrial plant during his visit to Galway. They attach a high priority to this event and feel this gesture on the part of the President is extremely important to the economic future of Ireland. They also feel that this gesture would tangibly highlight one of the mutually agreed upon goals of the President's trip to Ireland - to promote American investment in Ireland. As stated in Secretary Shultz's memorandum to the President, "The Irish Government believes that your visit will also help highlight the potential for American investment in Ireland (350 companies--\$4.3 billion invested) and contribute to Irish tourism".

In my opinion deleting this event would be a glaring omission of the publicly stated goals of the trip and would provide both the Irish press and the opposition leaders in the Dail with a foundation for more negative media stories. I also think omitting this event would provide the opposition with reason to believe the President's trip to Ireland is for personal political reasons, rather than to promote American tourism to that country, promote American investment in Ireland, etc.

As illustrated in the following summary, adding this industrial event does not necessitate departing Ashford Castle any earlier, adds 25 minutes to the President's schedule in Galway and still allows him to return to Ashford Castle for the live radio address.

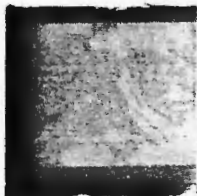
