I. PURPOSE

II. BACKGROUND

The Battle of Normandy was one of the most significant battles of all times and engaged three million men for nearly 100 days in the summer 1944. To memorialize this battle and to provide a place for study and education for the future, a museum and research center are being built in Caen, France. Caen was the pivot point of the battle and was nearly destroyed before its liberation on July 9, 1944.

To assist in the effort to build this center, the U.S. Committee for the Battle of Normandy Museum has been formed to provide support and raise public awareness of the battle and this project. In the future, the Committee will be involved in helping collect documents for the research center, encouraging joint lectures, study projects for college students and facilitating the establishment of a center within the museum for American visitors. The museum is scheduled to open in 1988.

The first meeting of the U.S. Committee is in Washington on June 16. Because of your past interest in this battle, the Committee requested an opportunity to meet with you while they are in town.
