OPTION A: SECONDARY SCHOOL STUDENTS:

- -- AUDIENCE: REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STUDENT COUNCILS OF TWO HIGH SCHOOLS: ONE BRITISH AND THE OTHER AMERICAN. WE HAVE IN MIND THE AMERICAN SCHOOL OF LONDON (ASL) AND ITS HEIGHBOR, THE QUINTIN KYNASTON COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL. BOTH SCHOOLS RECENTLY JOINED FORCES ON A NUMBER OF INTERMURAL ACTIVITIES. THE PRESIDENT'S MEETING WITH A YOUNG ANGLD-AMERICAN GROUP WOULD EMPHASIZE HIS CONCERN ABOUT THE SUCCESSOR GENERATION WHICH WILL BE DECISIVE IN FUTURE ANGLO-AMERICAN RELATIONS.
- -- VENUE: THE EVENT WOULD TAKE PLACE IN THE MEETING HALL OF THE QUINTIN KYNASTON SCHOOL WHICH IS A FEW HUNDRED YARDS FROM THE AMERICAN SCHOOL. BOTH SCHOOLS ARE IN THE ST. JOHNS WOOD SUBURB, A FIVE MINUTES' DRIVE FROM WINFIELD HOUSE.
- -- LENGTH OF MEETING: FORTY-FIVE MINUTES TO ONE HOUR.
- -- THRUST: THE EVENT YOULD BE CAST AS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PRESIDENT TO SHARE WITH THE STUDENTS HIS CONCERNS FOR THE FUTURE OF MANKING, AND MORE SPECIFICALLY THE AMERICAN QUEST FOR BOTH SECURITY AND A LASTING GLOBAL PEACE.
- -- FORMAT: THE PROGRAM WOULD BEGIN WITH A BRIEF INTRO-DUCTION BY THE HEADMASTER FOLLOWED BY 5 MINUTES' OPENING REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT. THE REMAINING 4B MINUTES OR SO WOULD BE STRICTLY QUESTION AND ANSWER WITH THE STUDENTS;

OPTION B: MIXED GROUP OF BRITISH CITIZENS:

-- AUDIENCE: WE ENVISION A SMALL (18-20) CROSS-SECTION OF PERSONS KNOWN FOR THEIR CONCERN AND INVOLVEMENT IN INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS AND SELECTED FOR THEIR QUALITIES

OF MODERATION AND COMMON SENSE. WE WOULD WORK WITH MR. TERRY WAITE, A LAY ADVICOR TO THE ARCHBICHOP OF CANTERBURY FOR ANGLICAN COMMUNION AFFAIRS TO ORGANIZE SUCH A MEETING. (FYI: WAITE SERVED AS A KEY MEDIATOR IN SENSITIVE NEGOTIATIONS ON BEHALF OF LAMEETH PALACE (HEADQUARTERS OF THE ANGLICAN CHURCH) WITH THE IRANIAN REVOLUTIONARIES IN 1979 TO SUCCESSFULLY SECURE THE RELEASE OF FOUR ANGLICAN MISSIONARIES. HE IS KNOWN FOR HIS INTELLIGENCE, SENSITIVITY AND DISCRETION. ALTHOUGH WE HAVE NOT CONTACTED HIM, WE ARE CONFIDENT HE WOULD ASSIST US IN PUTTING TOSETHER A GROUP OF BRITISH CATIZENS REPRESENTING A CROSS-SECTION OF FAITHS, OCCUPATIONS, BACKGROUNDS, AND MODETRATE, BUT MIXED, POLITICAL OPINIONS.)

- -- EMBASSY APPRECIATES THE NEED FOR UTTER CARE AND DISCRETION IN DEVELOPING THIS EVENT. WE BELIEVE OUR BEST SHOT IS TO WORK WITH A POLITICALLY NEUTRAL, HIGHLY ESTEEMED ORGANIZATION SUCH AS THE ANGLICAN CHURCH. THE CHURCH ITSELF HAS BEEN ACTIVELY INVOLVED IN THE NUCLEAR CONTROVERSY IN THE UK AND ITS POSITIONS HAVE CONSISTENTLY TURNED OUT TO BE THOUGHTFULLY MIDDLE OF THE ROAD.
- -- VENUE: A HOUSE OF WORSHIP, PREFERABLY IN THE VICINITY OF WINFIELD HOUSE, SUCH AS ST. MARYLEBONE PARISH CHURCH.
- -- LENGTH OF MEETING: FORTY-FIVE MINUTES TO ONE HOUR.
- -- FORMAT: A BRIEF INTRODUCTION BY A RESPECTED RELIGIOUS OR COMMUNITY LEADER (TO BE DETERMINED); FOLLOWED BY AN OPENING STATEMENT BY THE PRESIDENT AND 40 MINUTES OF QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS.
- -- THRUST: DEMONSTRATING HIS DETERMINATION TO REACH OUT TO A CROSS SECTION OF THE BRITISH PUBLIC THE PRESIDENT WOULD USE THE OPPORTUNITY TO EXPRESS HIS RT #8748

I would like to bring to your attention the attached letter from Mr. William Petty, one of the more than 100 U.S. Rangers who landed on Omaha Beach on June 5-6, 1944, and who will be in Normandy for commemorative ceremonies when the President is there.

The letter makes a very poignant example of the people-to-people dimension of US-French relations. Aside from recalling the incredible acts of bravery which distinguished our men, it points to an equally remarkable "love affair" which endures to this day between the inhabitants of the Pointe Du Hoc area of Normandy and the American fighting men who brought liberation to them.


I think this is a very moving episode, the type which best reflects the President's own sentiments and which, you may agree, might be an appropriate one to tie in with the President's visit. Mr. Petty suggests that the President may want to honor this unique episode by appearing there when he visits Normandy this June (it is close by). As much as any other short stop, this could make a dramatic point about the continuing friendship and trust of the American and French peoples.

Dear Gil:

Pursuant to our conversation last evening, I will briefly outline the facts pertinent to the 2nd Ranger assault of the cliffs of Pointe Du Hoc and the remarkable efforts of the Fenchmen of the Pointe Du Hoc Committee to honor that action with the hope that our President will honor the Rangers and them by visiting there when he goes to France for the 40th anniversary of the Invasion. There will be in attendence on the 5th and 6th of June more than 100 Rangers who either scaled the cliffs or assaulted via Omaha Beach.

As you have visited the site, I am sure that you are aware of the magnitude of this Bal-a-klavic endeavor. Instead of including in this letter combat details of the mission, I am sending along a book about the operation which thoroughly covers all phases. I would, however, like to point out that the Rangers objective was to destroy six 155 calibre artillery pieces with a range of fourteen miles that jeapordized the landings at Omaha and Utah Beaches. Although upon arrival at the top of the cliffs, we found that the guns had been relocated; they were found and destroyed by sergants Len Lammel and Jack Kuhn. So the mission was a success.

I feel that what has happened between the Rangers and the local citizens of the Pointe Du Hoc area is of much more significane appropos relationships between two nations than the actual battle. Being aware of President Reagan's sense of respect for the common man, I think that he may like to know of this unique relationship and perhaps honor the local Citizenery and the Rangers by appearing there.

Following is a brief description of the facts as they have been related to me. Further corroberation and details could be obtained by talking to Messieurs Bob Rawalet, Villiers and Tribulett who live in the area. Joe Rivers of the American Battlefield Monuments Commission at the Omaha Beach Cemetary knows how to contact them.

Shortly after the end of World War II the aforementioned men together with other local citizens formed the Committee of Pointe Du Hoc for the purpose of preserving the battlefield to commemorate those who fought there and those who gave their life there. They did just that. In 1984 it remains the same as when we dragged our tired butts off it on June 8th 1944.

I returned there for the first time twenty nine years later with my sons, expecting changes to the extent that I could not explain the battle to them. You can imagine my stunned surprise when I walked out on the Pointe to find it as though I had left it the day before. I wept.

In addition to preserving the battlefield they have erected a monument to the Rangers that is magnificent in its simplicity. In order to accomplish what they did these French gentlemen had to raise in excess of \$50,000 from the community. This becomes an act of magnamious proportions when one realizes that it occured in a not wealthy community of a war torn nation.

Over the years there has developed a warm relationship between the members of the Pointe du Hoc Committee and the Rangers. When we visit there the red carpet is out. We dine in their homes and some sleep there. They just can't do enough for you. You must know that from your visit there when you only had to mention my name and Bob Ravalet knew my home town and pretty much all about me. That is not only me but all Rangers who climbed the cliffs. He can probably tell you where they all live.

I feel that the most important aspect of this story is that it is not a government to government thing, but one of people to people. It really is a Readers Digest type story and had I the ability to write I would submit it.

The Ranger contingent will be on the Pointe at 11:00 a.m. on both the 5th and 6th of June. I am sure that time can be made flexible to the Presidents schedule if he decides to head in our direction. Those arrangements would have to be made through Len Lomell in Toms River, N.J. Telephone 201-349-2676 at home, 201-349-2443 office. He is the organizer of the trip and who in my opinion was the top Ranger of the 2nd Bn. He is another source of information on this story and is far more informed on the matter than I. You will find him a very cooperative gentlemen.

I feel that the Rangers are indeed fortunate and indebted to this wonderful group of Frenchmen. Ironically our second major battle (Hill 400; Bergstein, Ger) that made D-D ay look like a picnic, is also the same as we left it. The same three companies - D, E, & F that climbed the cliffs took the hill with a bayonet charge. We went up the hill with 180 men and after beating off a paratrooper regiment for three days walked down when relieved with less than 40. The reason it is the same is that it is in a forest preserve. Understandably, there is no monument honoring us there.

Incidentally, Pointe de Hoc was turned over to our Battlefield Monuments Commission in 1979. I think this was the year although I am not certain. At any rate they have it now and in their safe hands it is assured for future generations.

Had the local French citizens not done their heroic deed it would not have been possible to preserve its D-Day condition.





- 1. CONCUR WITH JAGENCY TO PLAN FOR EFFICIENT MANAGEMENT OF OFFICIAL PARTY, INVITED GUESTS AND INTERESTED PUBLIC BEFORE AND DURING JUNE 6. COMMEMORATION OF NORMANDY LANDINGS. THE PRIMARY OBJECT OF ALL PLANNING SHOULD BE TO ENSURE THAT VETERANS (AND THEIR FAMALIES) ARE GIVEN THE HIGHEST PRIORITY IN ATTENDING THE EVENT OF THEIR CHOICE.
- 2. WITH RECARD TO OFFICIAL CEREMONIES, YOUR WORKING HYPOTHESES ARE COPRECT. THERE WILL BE AN OFFICIAL USG DELEGATION AT EACH CEPTICIAL CEREMONY INVOLVING US PARTICIPATION AND IT IS NOT LOGISTICALLY POSSIBLE FOR THESE OFFICIALS TO MOVE FROM ONE CEREMONY TO ANOTHER. ONLY THREE MEMBERS OF THE USG DELEGATION CAN BE TRANSPORTED WITH THE PRESIDENTIAL PARTY. THE WHITE HOUSE ADVANCE OFFICE (WHAO) WILL DESIGNATE WHICH MEMBERS OF THE USG DELEGATION CAN TRAVEL WITH THE PRESIDENT:
- 3. YOUR PROJECTED NUMBERS IN EACH USG DELEGATION AND INVITED GUESTS WILL BE USED HERE UNTIL MORE CURRENT INFORMATION BECCHES AVAILABLE. A SYSTEM IS BEING DEVELOPED TO ALLOCATE INVITATIONS EQUITABLY. WE AGREE THAT OUR SYSTEM HAS TO BE FLEXIBLE ENOUGH TO ACCOMMODATE LAST MINUTE CHANGES, AS THE SATISFACTION OF THE VETERARS IS OUR PARAMOUNT OBJECTIVE.
- 4. THE PLANKING ORGANIZATION IN WASHINGTON FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE OFFICIAL PARTY, INVITED GUESTS AND INTEFESTED PUBLIC IS AS FOLLOWS:

The attached cable from Embassy Paris indicates that the French, as only they can, have asked that we schedule our Point du Hoc ceremony later on June 6. Embassy Paris has explained the problems involved with a schedule modification, but Mitterrand seems adamant.

I don't understand why this was not brought up with our pre-advance or advance teams, particularly with Mike Deaver. Still, a refusal to modify our plans risks French bitterness at being "upstaged." We do need to get back to Paris fairly soon on this, but have heard that Henkel has already cabled Paris and indicated that no change is possible. Are you up to speed on this one?

MITTERRAND'S MILITARY ADVISOR HAS HOLFTHELESS INSISTED THAT WE RAISE THIS ISSUE WITH THE WHITE HOUSE WE RECOMMEND BELOW TWO ALTERNATIVE RECPONSES AND REQUEST INSTRUCTIONS ASAP. END SUMMARY.
- 2. ON APRIL 24 WE RECEIVED A DIPLOMATIC NOTE FROM THE PROTOCOL SECTION OF THE QUA! D ORSAY, REPEATING THE SCHEDULE OF "OFFICIAL" EVENTS FORESEEN FOR JUNE 6, AND CONTRINING THE FOLLOWING PHRASE: "THE FRENCH AUTHORITIES BELIEVE THAT THE COMMEMORATIONS ORGANIZED IN THE THEATRE OF OPERATIONS BY THE FRENCH GOVERNMENT WITH THE PARTICIPATION OF SENIOR INVITED FOREIGN PEFCONALITIES CANNOT BE PRECEDED BY OTHER CEREMONIES ORGAN ZED SEPARATELY ON FRENCH TERRITORY BY THE SENIOR FERRECENTATIVES OF THE STATES ACCOCIATED WITH THE NATIONAL CEREMONIES."
- 3. OUR BRITISH COLLEAGUES IMMEDIATELY CONCLUDED THAT THIS PHRASEOLOGY WAS INTENDED TO PREVENT THE QUEEN FROM CARRYING OUT A PLANNED SERIES OF ACTIVITIES BEGINNING THE HORNING OF JUNE 6, AND CALLED TO INQUIRE ABOUT OUR REACTION TO THE HOTE. - 4. TO CLARIFY FRENCH INTENTIONS, DCM MET WITH MITTERRAND'S MILITARY AFFAIRS ADVISOR (GENERAL SAULNIER), WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE JUNE 6 EVENTS, ON APRIL 26.

 SAULNIER SAID THERE WERE PROTOCOL AND PRACTICAL REASONS WHY THE FRENCH DID NOT WANT CEREMONIES TO BE HELD BEFORE THE START OF THE OFFICIAL FRENCH CEREMONIES.

THE PROTOCOL REASON WAS THAT THE CEREMONIES WOULD ALL BE ON FRENCH SOIL AND OTHER CHIEFS OF STATE SHOULD NOT START BEFORE MITTERRAND. THE PRACTICAL REASON WAS THAT THE FRENCH FEAR ATTEMPTED MOVEMENTS BY CROWDS OF SPECTATORS FROM ONE EVENT TO ANOTHER, WHICH COULD BE DIFFICULT TO CONTROL.

- 5. DCM WENT OVER OUR PLANNED SCHEDULE (REFTEL)
 CAREFULLY, NOTING THAT IT WAS THE SAME AS THE
 SCHEDULE PRESENTED TO SAULNIER AND BARCELLINI ON
 MARCH 28. DCM EXPLAINED THAT IT WOULD BE EXTREMELY
 DIFFICULT, AND PROBABLY IMPOSSIBLE, TO CHANGE OUR
