Mike:

You and I have talked about the format of Summit briefings for the President and I agreed to try to work a "role playing" approach at which working level experts would take the role of Thatcher, Kohl etc. in laying out how they would react on each of the several agenda items. In trying to put that together it became apparent that our working level troops are more vertically oriented than horizontal as would be required for such an approach. Specifically, for example, Beryl Sprinkel could present an excellent portrayal of how everyone feels about financial issues and debt problems but could not tell you much about how Thatcher feels on such issues as East-West relations, the environment or terrorism. ~~Consequently we propose an approach which approximates what I think you were trying to achieve--using many working level people--while assuring the quality of knowledge we need. This would call for us to treat the agenda issue by issue with a working level person laying the issue and how everyone feels about it. We would then go on to another working level person and treat it, etc. Is this OK?~~

SUBJECT: Meetings with the President in Preparation for his  
European Trip and London Summit (U)

The White House has scheduled three additional meetings with the President in preparation for his June European trip and the London Summit. (U)

The first meeting will be on Friday, May 25, 1984 from 11:00 a.m. to 12 noon in the Oval Office. Its focus will be the President's visit to Ireland, Normandy, and the bilateral aspects of his UK visit. The National Security Advisor will make introductory remarks on the overall objectives of the bilaterals and then we ask that Secretary Shultz briefly review each meeting, patterned along the lines of his normal Oval Office pre-brief prior to a Presidential meeting with a foreign leader. The President will have bilateral meetings with Irish President Hillary (June 3) and Prime Minister FitzGerald (June 4); Mrs. Thatcher (June 5); and Prime Ministers Nakasone and Craxi, as well as Chancellor Kohl (all on June 7). The May 25 meeting should also be utilized to brief the President on the Normandy portion of his trip (June 6). (C)

We suggest that the May 25 meeting only touch lightly on the President's meeting with Nakasone, as we have included a normal pre-brief on the London schedule (from 11:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.) just prior to the President's June 7, 11:30 a.m. bilateral with Nakasone. (C)

The second preparatory meeting will be on Tuesday, May 29, 1984 in the Cabinet Room from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon. It will address the political and economic agendas for the London Summit. On May 29 the first half-hour will be devoted to the political agenda; the remaining time will be spent on the economic aspects of the Summit. Closer to the meeting, we will provide a separate memo with details on the meeting agenda, its objectives, and participation. (C)

The third preparatory meeting will be over lunch in London on Thursday, June 7, from 12:30 p.m. to 1:30 p.m. At the outset

1. FURTHER TO REFTEL. A MAJOR ELEMENT IN THE VISIT IS THE PROGRAM AT UNIVERSITY COLLEGE, GALWAY. THIS EVENT HAS CREATED CONSIDERABLE ATTENTION AND CONTROVERSY. AN IMPORTANT SEGMENT OF THE ACADEMIC COMMUNITY IS QUESTIONING THE APPROPRIATENESS OF THE PRESIDENT PARTICIPATING IN AN ACADEMIC CEREMONY. FOR THIS AND OTHER REASONS DISCUSSED BELOW, THE VISIT IS, WE BELIEVE, AN EXCELLENT OPPORTUNITY TO ANNOUNCE A GREATLY EXPANDED COMMITMENT TO ACADEMIC EXCHANGES.

2. THE CURRENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM BEING OPERATED IN IRELAND IS PAINFULLY INADEQUATE. IT RELIES ENTIRELY ON INCOME FROM FUNDS ESTABLISHED IN THE MID 1950'S UNDER AN AGREEMENT SIGNED BY THE TWO GOVERNMENTS. THE MONIES EARNED ARE ALLOCATED BY THE IRISH SCHOLARSHIP BOARD, WHICH IS ORGANIZED SIMILARLY TO A FULBRIGHT COMMISSION. THIS YEAR'S EXCHANGES INCLUDE THREE PARTIAL AMERICAN FULBRIGHT LECTURERS, SIX SHORT-TERM GRANTS TO IRISH SCHOLARS AND A LIMITED NUMBER OF GRANTS FOR TRAVEL. A FULL ACADEMIC EXCHANGE PROGRAM WOULD MAKE POSSIBLE SIX FULL-YEAR FULBRIGHT LECTURERS, TEN GRANTS TO IRISH SCHOLARS, TEN OR MORE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR IRISH STUDENTS, AND FUNDS FOR AN AMERICAN STUDIES CONFERENCE AND MATERIALS AND ADMINISTRATIVE COSTS INCLUDING AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. THE EXPANDED PROGRAM WOULD ALSO ALLOW FOR IRELAND TO PARTICIPATE IN OTHER PROJECTS UNDER THE FULBRIGHT PROGRAM. AFTER NEARLY TEN MONTHS OF WORK WITH THE BOARD, CONSULTATION WITH HEADS OF UNIVERSITIES, IRISH GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND THE HEAD OF THE ACADEMIC EXCHANGE DIVISION OF USIA, THERE IS NOW OVERWHELMING SUPPORT FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A FULL ACADEMIC EXCHANGE PROGRAM LIKE THOSE EXISTING IN MANY COUNTRIES AROUND THE WORLD.

3. ADDING A STATEMENT OF AGREEMENT TO SUPPORT ACADEMIC EXCHANGES WOULD PROVIDE CONCRETE EVIDENCE OF THIS ADMINISTRATION'S INVOLVEMENT WITH AND SUPPORT FOR ACADEMIC INSTITUTIONS. ALONG WITH THIS ANNOUNCEMENT, REFERENCE CAN BE MADE TO SOME OF THE EXCELLENT INITIATIVES CREDITED TO THIS ADMINISTRATION. AN EXPANDED ACADEMIC EXCHANGE PROGRAM WOULD A) COMPLEMENT THE PRESIDENT'S YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAM BY CREATING NEW SCHOLARSHIPS FOR IRISH STUDENTS TO STUDY IN THE UNITED


