



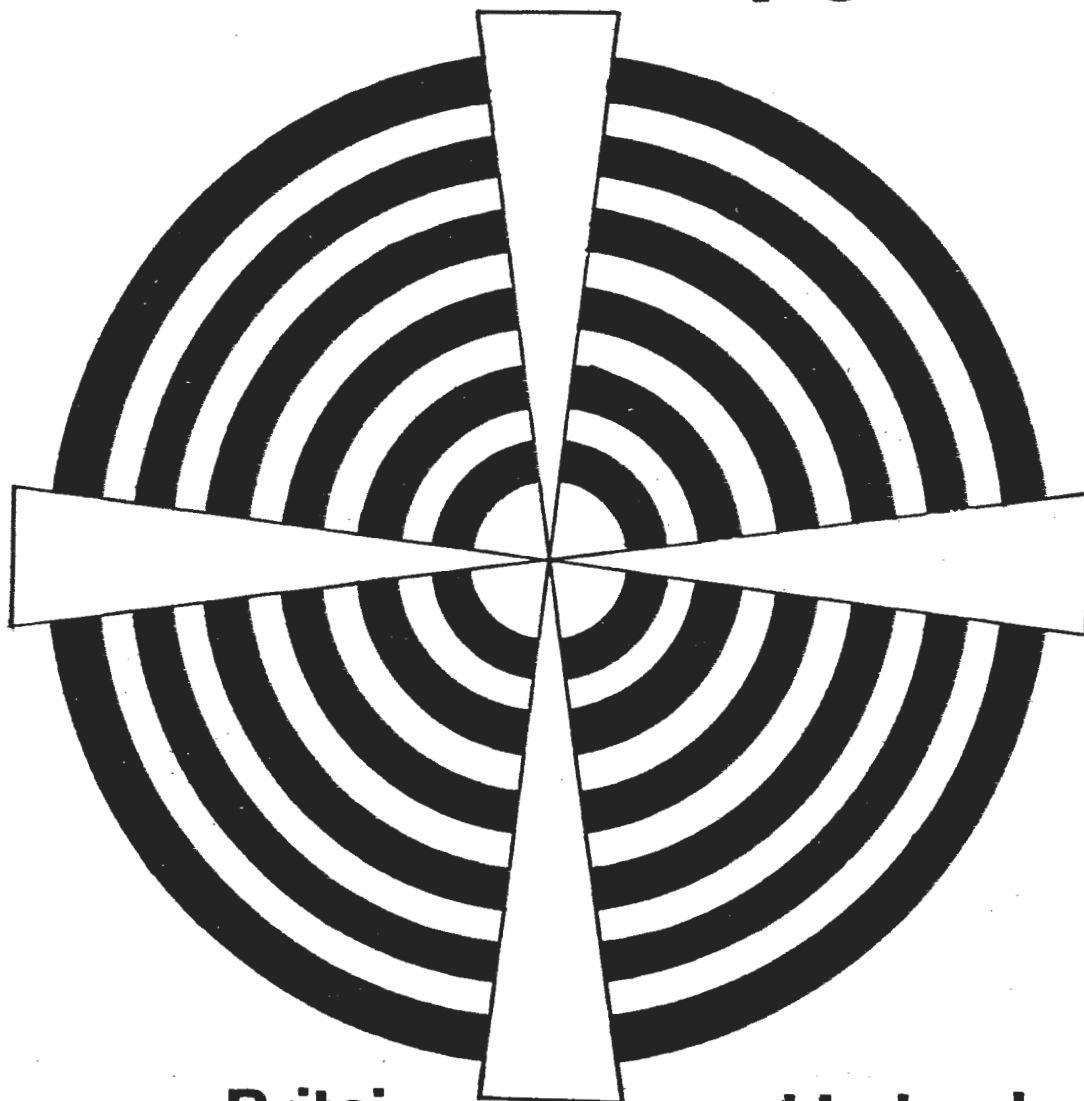

I am included in your guest-list for today's Reception as wife of the President of the Royal College of Surgeons. My own work in Ireland for the past twelve years has been centred on political peace, non-violence, forgiveness and reconciliation and accordingly I should like to give you the enclosed study-pack, recently launched in London and shortly to be publicised in Dublin and Belfast also. It is a very modest effort but it is a beginning and its credibility lies in having been worked at amidst one of the bitterest and most complex conflicts in the Western world.

SUBJECT: Your Meeting with Japanese Prime Minister
Nakasone, June 7

I had previously given you a memorandum focussing on your bilateral objectives for this meeting. This paper elaborates on the Summit-related issues you should discuss with him. There are basically three which you should raise.

1. Our desire that the Economic Declaration specify that we aim for a decision in 1985 on whether to launch a new round of trade negotiations.

2. Building on Nakasone's reported interest in raising the question of coordinated release of oil stocks in the event of a serious disruption in supplies from the Persian Gulf, to coordinate with him the handling of this issue during the discussion of the Gulf at the Friday lunch of Heads and Foreign Ministers.

3. Our support for reaffirmation of the trilateral (North America-Europe-Japan) relationship in the maintenance of our common security, and confirming his support for a meeting of the seven Foreign Ministers next fall.

New Trade Round

While Nakasone was the first to issue a public call for a new round of negotiations, Japanese officials have not taken as clear a line as we would have preferred in pushing the need for a decision on it to be taken next year. Our current timetable for preparing a new round envisages a meeting of senior officials in GATT early in 1985 to give momentum to the consultations on objectives, participation and timing which we hope to have initiated at the November 1984 meeting of GATT contracting parties. This would lead to a meeting later in 1985 (e.g., October or November) at which the decision to launch the negotiations, to begin early in 1986, would be taken. During your meeting with Nakasone, you should explain the importance we attach to the need for a decision in 1985 and enlist his support for it during the Summit discussion of trade.

Coordinated Oil Stock Draws

Nakasone has been reported in the press to be contemplating a request to his Summit partners to agree to release strategic oil stocks in the event of a serious disruption of supplies from the Gulf. There will be strong resistance from some of the Europeans to this, and Japan itself has inadequate stocks to deal effectively with a serious lengthy disruption. Clearly, the Japanese need an early draw by others (mainly the U.S.) to mitigate a severe disruption to their economy. In the time before such a disruption, Japan should be increasing their own security by building further their own stocks.

We have refrained from pushing action at the Summit on coordinated stock draws, despite our keen interest in getting such an agreement, for two reasons: (1) the groundwork in IEA and at official levels in Summit-country governments has not been sufficiently laid to give much hope of success now; (2) any earlier indication of U.S. interest would have prompted strong opposition (especially from the French). This tactic has thus set the stage, given the backdrop of increasing tension in the Gulf, for the initiative to come from others, rather than us. You could use your meeting with Nakasone to find out if he really wants a discussion of stock policies and if he wants a statement on the issue in the London declaration. If so, you could explain our requirements (i.e., that effective action must be taken by all and that demand restraint is not sufficient in itself as a "contribution" by others). If he accepts our viewpoint, you could indicate you would support him in raising the issue at the Friday lunch and would be prepared to offer language for a statement on it in the communique. Private contacts with Japanese officials indicate they want to coordinate draws. You should use this opportunity to note your pleasure that Japan is building stocks, but that, despite constraints of their budget, you hope they will do more in the future so that a coordinated draw would be more effective.

Reinforcing Trilateral Cooperation

We know Nakasone is anxious to maintain and enhance Japan's role as an equal partner in Western consultations. The Williamsburg statement on peace and security was both a symbol and expression of this. We would like to carry this process over into London in two ways: by direct reference in the "London Charter" statement on democratic values and by Summit endorsement of the meeting of the seven Foreign Ministers at next fall's UNGA. The Japanese have agreed to support the proposal for such a meeting. During your meeting, you should assure him of your support for an appropriate reference in the

"Charter" to the need to strengthen the partnership of the Summit countries (including Japan), stressing that our security is indivisible and must be approached on a global basis (thus echoing the Williamsburg statement). We have proposed language for the "Charter" to this effect to the British. You should ask Nakasone if this is satisfactory and if he needs anything different. You should also confirm that he will support the proposal for the Foreign Ministers' meeting in the fall as we have been informed.

Talking Points

New Trade Round

- Continue to support your call for new trade round.
- Important that Summit state our desire to have decision on it taken in 1985.

Oil Stock Draws

- Understand you want to discuss cooperation in releasing oil stocks in emergency resulting from Gulf war.
- If so, must understand that U.S. needs comparable action by all partners; demand restraint done by others less effective, not quantifiable.
- We cannot draw unless others visibly sharing burden of coping with disruption.
- Pleased you are building stocks; I recognize your budget constraints, but hope you can do more to increase effectiveness of coordinated action if future requires.
- If you agree on coordinated stock draw, I can support if you raise at Friday lunch and am prepared offer language for inclusion in communique if others wish.

Trilateral Cooperation

- Have proposed adding to "Charter" wording to echo Williamsburg on indivisibility of our security.
- Want support enhanced role for Japan in political consultations.
- Understand you will support proposed meeting of seven Foreign Ministers next fall; believe this will be useful to continue consultations among seven.


