Greetings to all of you gathered today commemorating the 43rd anniversary of D-Day. President Roosevelt said December 7th will live as a day of infamy. And so it is remembered, yet June 6th, in contrast, lives on as a day of triumph. You are taking care that the significance of this day is not lost.

I know that for many of you this day has special meaning. You participated in the historic battle that took place on the Normandy coast four decades ago.
