S. Res. 106

In the Senate of the United States,

May 4 (legislative day, May 2), 1983.

Whereas there were approximately thirty-four million one hundred and fifty thousand accidental injuries and twenty-seven thousand five hundred deaths associated with consumer products in the United States last year;

Whereas accidental injuries and deaths associated with consumer products, although reduced in recent years, continue to occur in the United States;

Whereas the effort to prevent accidents associated with consumer products is a shared responsibility of industry, consumers, and government;

Whereas heightened awareness of accident prevention programs provides greater opportunities for communities, consumer groups, trade associations, and government to continue reducing these consumer product accidents; and

Whereas the week of May 8, 1983, is the tenth anniversary of the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission which has been a leader in protecting the public against unreasonable risks of injury associated with consumer products: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That it is the sense of the Senate that in order to heighten awareness among the American people of hazards asso-

ciated with consumer product use, together with means by which those hazards may be lessened, the week of May 8, 1983, through May 14, 1983, be designated as "National Product Safety Week" in commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission, and that the President be requested to issue a proclamation calling upon the American people to observe the week with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities.

SEC. 2. The Secretary of the Senate is directed to transmit a copy of this resolution to the President.

DICK:

The attached resolution, sponsored by Senator Thurmond, passed the Senate yesterday. It expresses the "sense of the Senate ... that the President be requested to issue" a "National Product Safety Week" proclamation for the week beginning Sunday, May 8, 1983.

It is a simple, one-House resolution and, as such, is not legally binding on the President. There have been at least five previous instances in this Administration where similar resolutions have been disregarded. Please note, however, that last year the President issued a "National Consumers' Week" proclamation for the last week of April on his own initiative.

WHEREAS, the proposed transaction between United States Steel Corporation and British Steel Corporation for the importation of raw steel into the United States is not in the public interest; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed transaction would violate the recently negotiated United States-European Community Steel Arrangement; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed transaction would violate U.S. unfair trade laws governing subsidized imports; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed transaction would interject a new unfair competitive factor into the domestic steel market thereby forcing other steel companies to import cheap, subsidized raw steel, thus reducing the raw steel making capacity of the United States; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed transaction would cause the loss of thousands of steel production and ancillary jobs nationwide; and,

WHEREAS, small businesses, merchants, school districts and communities would be adversely affected; and,

WHEREAS, state and local government bodies would be hard pressed to supply unemployment compensation and social services to the thousands thus unemployed; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois and our community are acutely aware of the devastating effects of unemployment; and,

WHEREAS, our nation's security would face a grave risk, especially in times of international crisis; and,

WHEREAS, the industrial and military strength of the United States of America should never be allowed to be dependent on the whim and fancy of foreign elements;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

that the citizens of the City of Chicago Heights, Illinois call upon the President of the United States of America to use all available administrative and legal means to prohibit the proposed transaction;

that the Secretary of Commerce recognize that the proposed venture is in violation of the negotiated quota arrangement with the Common Market and that he take appropriate action to stop the violation;

that the citizens of the City of Chicago Heights, Illinois call upon United States Steel Corporation to refrain from concluding the proposed transaction and to make the necessary investment in modernizing its steel facilities in this country.

SUBJECT: Draft Proclamation: Alaska Statehood Day

Counsel's Office has reviewed the above-referenced proclamation. At the top of page 2, "in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the passage of the Alaska Statehood Act" should be changed to read "in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the admission of Alaska into the Union." The Alaska Statehood Act was passed on July 7, 1958, so Congress could hardly have designated January 3, 1984 as Alaska Statehood Day in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of that event. Alaska was admitted into the Union on January 3, 1959, when President Eisenhower issued the proclamation called for by the Act, and it is in honor of the anniversary of that event that Congress designated January 3, 1984 Alaska Statehood Day.

SUBJECT: Draft Proclamation: Alaska Statehood Day

Dodie Livingston has asked for comments by close of business December 21, 1983, on the above-referenced draft proclamation. The proclamation, authorized and requested by S.J. Res. 42, was drafted by Interior and has been approved by OMB. It designates January 3, 1984 -- the twenty-fifth anniversary of Alaska's admission into the Union -- as "Alaska Statehood Day." The text of the proclamation praises the people and resources of Alaska, and is largely unobjectionable.

The first two lines on page 2, however, state that Congress requested this proclamation "in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the passage of the Alaska Statehood Act." The Alaska Statehood Act was passed on July 7, 1958, Pub. L. 85-508, 72 Stat. 339, and it would be more than passing strange even for Congress to designate January 3, 1984 as Alaska Statehood Day in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of an event that took place on July 7, 1958. January 3, 1984 is the twenty-fifth anniversary of Alaska's admission into the Union, accomplished not by passage of the Statehood Act but by issuance of Proclamation 3269 by President Eisenhower, pursuant to the terms of the Act. I would revise the language in question to read "in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the admission of Alaska into the Union."

BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

A PROCLAMATION

The Territory of Alaska was admitted to the Union on January 3, 1959, as the forty-ninth State. In the twenty-five years since then, the sturdy inhabitants of our largest State have continued with distinction the work of developing this vast storehouse of abundant resources, while preserving its special environment. As a result of their efforts, Alaska now produces one-eighth of the Nation's gold, one-fifth of its petroleum and two-fifths of its harvested fish. Ten of the sixteen strategic minerals vital to our Nation's security are produced in Alaska. The millions of dollars worth of minerals, forest and food products and energy resources produced each year in Alaska have long since repaid many times over the \$7,000,000 paid by the United States to purchase Alaska in 1867.

The people of Alaska constitute a special resource, one which has made possible the wise use of all the other abundant resources of this important State. Native Alaskans and immigrants from every State, as well as many foreign countries, have worked together to build the cities, pipelines, rail, water, air, and ground transportation facilities which are the basis of Alaska's prosperity. Their hard work and dedication are an example to the rest of our people, as we work to maintain America's greatness.

In recognition of the importance of Alaska's people and its scenic and natural resources to the United States, and

in honor of the twenty-fifth anniversary of the passage of the Alaska Statehood Act^a, the Congress has, by Senate Joint Resolution 42, authorized and requested the President to proclaim January 3, 1984, as "Alaska Statehood Day."

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RONALD REAGAN, President of the United States of America, do hereby designate January 3, 1984 "Alaska Statehood Day." I call upon the people of the United States, and the Federal, State and local governments to observe "Alaska Statehood Day" with appropriate ceremonies.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand this day of December, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and eighty-three, and of the Independence of the United States of America the two hundred and eighth.




