


Dear Mr. President:

My war was Southeast Asia, during which I was a USAF combat controller (parachutist) in 1965 and a fighter pilot in 1968. My father's war was D-Day + 6 until some six months later when he was evacuated home to a military hospital. He was former Representative Olin E. "Tiger" Teague; you were most kind to send my mother a note when he died shortly after your Inauguration.

The purpose of this letter is simply to let you know how proud you made me feel as I watched your D-Day activities this morning via television. Uppermost in my mind as you delivered your thoughtful words at Pointe-du-Hoc was how grateful and how thankful I am to be an American. You are a wonderful inspiration, Mr. President, to Americans who love their great country as I do. For this inspiration, I thank you.
