SUBJECT: MEETING WITH PRESIDENT MUBARAK: LEBANON, FEZ

SUMMIT AND PRESIDENT REAGAN'S INITIATIVE

1. SECRET-ENTIRE TEXT.

2. DURING A MEETING THIS MORNING (WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 22) WHICH I HAD REQUESTED TO DISCUSS ANOTHER SUBJECT, PRESIDENT MUBARAK RAISED BRIEFLY THE CURRENT LEBANON SITUATION AND ITS IMPLICATIONS FOR THE MIDDLE EAST PEACE PROCESS. NOTING THAT HE HAD BEEN CONCERNED FROM THE START ABOUT THE CONSEQUENCES OF EVACUATING THE PLO FROM BEIRUT, MUBARAK SAID THAT THE U.S. WAS NOW IN A MOST DIFFICULT POSITION IN

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

THE AREA AS A RESULT OF BEGIN'S AND SHARON'S "CRAZY ACTIONS." RETURNING THE MULTINATIONAL FORCE TO BEIRUT WAS THE BEST MOVE THE UNITED STATES COULD HAVE MADE TO DEAL WITH THE IMMEDIATE SITUATION; NOW, MUBARAK SAID, IT IS IMPORTANT TO PRESS AHEAD ON PRESIDENT REAGAN'S PEACE INITIATIVE.

3. MUBARAK EXPRESSED GRATIFICATION THAT THE FEZ SUMMIT HAD NOT REJECTED THE U.S. INITIATIVE. AS HE HAD TOLD KING HASSAN IN A SPECIAL MESSAGE SENT VIA OSAMA EL-BAZ PRIOR TO THE SUMMIT, THIS WOULD HAVE BEEN A FATAL MISTAKE FOR THE ARABS. THE FEZ DECLARATION, HOWEVER, WAS NOT A BASIS FOR MOVING THE PEACE PROCESS FOWARD SINCE IT PROVIDED NO "MECHANISM." AS THE SOVIETS - HAD TOLD THE EGYPTIAN CHARGE IN MOSCOW. MUBARAK SAID WITH A SMILE, "FEZ IS A CAR

WITHOUT AN ENGINE." FEZ HAD, HOWEVER, LEFT THE DOOR OPEN FOR THE UNITED STATES.

- 4. I TOLD MUBARAK THAT, FOR US, THE TEST OF THE FEZ SUMMIT WOULD BE WHETHER IT GAVE KING HUSSEIN SUFFICIENT FLEXIBILITY TO JOIN THE NEGOTIATING PROCESS, HOPEFULLY WITH THE PARTICIPATION OF REPRESENTATIVE WEST BANK/GAZA PALESTINIANS. WE WOULD BE MEETING IN WASHINGTON WITH THE ARAB DELEGATION FROM FEZ TO EXPLORE POSSIBILITIES FURTHER, BUT WE WERE ALSO PRESSING AHEAD IN OUR BILATERAL CONTACTS WITH KING HUSSEIN AND THE SAUDIS. MUBARAK SAID THIS WAS GOOD AND MADE SOME DERISIVE COMMENTS ABOUT THE UPCOMING VISITS OF FEZ DELEGATIONS TO PERMANENT SC MEMBER CAPITALS. WHY, IN PARTICULAR, WAS ASSAD GOING TO WASHINGTON INSTEAD OF MOSCOW? IN RESPONSE TO MY URGING THAT EGYPT ALSO WORK ON HUSSEIN TO JOIN THE NEGOTIATIONS, MUBARAK SAID THAT EGYPT WOULD DO SO. MUBARAK ADDED PARENTHETICALLY THAT HE HAD RECEIVED A MESSAGE FROM KING HUSSEIN URING HIM TO BREAK RELATIONS WITH ISRAEL. THIS WOULD HAVE BEEN A VERY SHORTSIGHTED MOVE, HOWEVER. INSTEAD, MUBARAK SAID, EGYPT HAD SIMPLY RECALLED ITS AMBASSADOR FOR CONSULTATIONS.
- 5. MUBARAK SAID HE FULLY AGREED WITH OUR OBJECTIVE OF SEEKING TO BROADEN THE NEGOTIATIONS BY BRINGING HUSSEIN AND THE PALESTINIANS IN. WHEN I STRESSED THAT

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

THIS COULD NOT BE THE PLO, AND NOTED THAT CAMP DAVID PROVIDES FOR WEST BANK/GAZA PALESTINIANS TO JOIN THE JORDANIAN AND EGYPTIAN DELEGATIONS, MUBARAK SAID THERE ARE MANY PRO-PLO PALESTINIANS IN THE WEST BANK AND GAZA WHO COULD BE GIVEN THE NOD BY ARAFAT. NOTING THAT THE PLO LEADERSHIP WAS STILL CONSIDERING WHAT ITS POSITION SHOULD BE, MUBARAK CAUTIONED THAT THERE WAS ONLY LIMITED TIME BEFORE THE PLO TURNED IN MORE RADICAL DIRECTIONS.

- 6. AT THE END OF THIS PART OF THE CONVERSATION, I ASKED MUBARAK IF HE HAD GIVEN ANY FURTHER THOUGHT TO THE TIMING OF HIS VISIT TO CANADA, IN CONNECTION WITH INSTRUCTED KAMAL HASSAN ALI TO TRY TO RESCHEDULE HIS VISIT TO SPAIN FROM DECEMBER TO JANUARY AND TO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITY OF A JANUARY VISIT WITH THE CANADIANS AS WELL. ONCE THE CANADIAN VISIT WAS FIRM, HE WOULD BE BACK IN TOUCH WITH US ABOUT THE PRESIDENT'S INVITATION.

- 2. BEGIN SUMMARY. BOTH PRESIDENT MUBARAK AND FOREIGN MINISTER HASSAN ALI YESTERDAY PROCLAIMED THEIR SUPPORT FOR THE RETURN OF MULTI-NATIONAL FORCES TO BEIRUT AND EXPRESSED SUPPORT FOR THE U.S. POSITION STATED IN PRESIDENT REAGAN'S SEPT. 2Ø ADDRESS. GENERAL REACTION HAS ALSO BEEN FAVORABLE, AND THE PRESIDENTIAL ADDRESS RECEIVED EXTENSIVE REPORTING INCLUDING TAPED RE-BROADCAST IN FULL. ANTI-AMERICAN TONE OF RECENT PRESS COMMENTARIES WAS NOTICEABLY

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

ABSENT FROM TODAY'S COLUMNS AND EDITORIALS, ALTHOUGH ISRAEL CONTINUES TO BE THE TARGET OF FIERCE ATTACKS. END SUMMARY.

3. SPEAKING WITH REPORTERS ON HIS DEPARTURE FROM YESTERDAY'S NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY CONFERENCE SESSION, PRESIDENT MUBARAK SAID THAT THE RETURN OF THE MULTI-MATIONAL PEACEKEEPING FORCE TO BEIRUT IS THE BEST SOLUTION FOR THE SITUATION IN LEBANON, AT LEAST FOR THE TIME BEING. RESPONDING TO A QUESTION, MUBARAK ALSO SAID THAT EGYPT HAD NOT SEVERED RELATIONS WITH ISRAEL, BUT HAD CALLED THE EGYPTIAN AMBASSADOR IN TEL AVIV HOME FOR CONSULTATIONS. THE LENGTH OF HIS STAY WILL DEPEND "ON HOW THINGS DEVELOP."

THE PRESIDENT MAY AMPLIFY HIS REMARKS AT HIS ADDRESS THIS EVENING TO THE NATIONAL DEMOCRATIC PARTY CONFERENCE

- 4. FOMMIN KAMAL HASSAN ALI YESTERDAY ALSO ANNOUNCED EGYPT'S SUPPORT FOR THE AMERICAN POSITION AS CONTAINED IN PRESIDENT REAGAN'S ADDRESS. ALI CALLED THE ISRAELI WITHDRAWAL FROM BEIRUT "THE FIRST STEP TOWARD SETTLING THE CRISIS." PRESS STORIES TODAY PORTRAYED THE AMERICAN STAND IN PART AS A RESPONSE TO EGYPTIAN CALLS FOR ACTION TO REMOVE ISRAEL FROM BEIRUT IMMEDIATELY AND TO RESTORE AUTHORITY TO THE LEGITIMATE LEBANESE GOVERNMENT.
- 5. IN GENERAL, PRESIDENT REAGAN'S TELEVISED ADDRESS ON THE LEBANESE SITUATION HAS PRODUCED AN ALMOST AUDIBLE SIGH OF RELIEF HERE. LAST NIGHT'S TV NEWS BROADCAST A LONG EXCERPT OF THE SPEECH; FOLLOWING THE REGULAR PROGRAM WAS A SPECIAL SHOWING OF THE ENTIRE ADDRESS. THE TV NEWSCASTER, IN RECENT DAYS SOMBER AND GRIM, APPEARED VISIBLY HEARTENED. OUR USIS PRESS OFFICE PASSED AROUND COPIES OF THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE, AND WE RECEIVED FAVORABLE COMMENTS: -- IBRAHIM SAADA, EDITOR-IN-CHIEF OF MAYO MAGAZINE AND AKHBAR EL-YOM: PRESIDENT REAGAN'S STATEMENT WAS VERY GOOD. LET THE AMERICANS BE IN BEIRUT, AND LET REAGAN CARRY OUT HIS MIDDLE EAST INITIATIVE. OTHERWISE, EVERYTHING WILL COLLAPSE, MODERATE ARAB REGIMES AND ISRAEL ALIKE. MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

IF THE U.S. CAN ESTABLISH A STRONG CENTRAL GOVERNMENT IN LEBANON, THAT WOULD BE AN ACHIEVEMENT. WITHOUT THAT, VIOLENT ACTS SUCH AS THOSE WE HAVE JUST WITNESSED COULD TAKE PLACE AT ANY TIME. IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT ALL FOREIGN FORCES PULL OUT OF LEBANON VERY SOON.

--MOHAMED TABTAWI, MANAGING EDITOR OF AKHBAR EL-YOM:
THE PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT WAS VERY POSITIVE. NEVERTHEL NEVERTHELESS, WE HAVE TO WATCH THE INTERNAL REPERCUSSIONS IN EGYPT. THERE IS THE POSSIBILITY OF EXTREME REACTION FROM THE MUSLIM FUNDAMENTALISTS, WHO FEEL BEATEN BOTH IN EGYPT AND IN BEIRUT.

6. REPORTING OF THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS HAS BEEN VERY HEAVY AND IN POSITIVE TERMS. THERE ARE LENGTHY EXCERPTS OF REAGAN'S ADDRESS, BACKGROUND STORIES ON REAGAN'S DECISIONS FOLLOWING THE MASSACRES, AND ITEMS ON REMARKS BY VICE-PRESIDENT BUSH, SECRETARIES

7. WOVEN INTO THE FAVORABLE REACTION REACHING US HAVE ALSO BEEN ELEMENTS OF REPROACH AND I-TOLD-YOU-SO. FOR EXAMPLE, ADMIRAL HAMDY, HEAD OF THE LIAISON SYSTEM OF EGYPT, PRAISED PRESIDENT REAGAN'S STAND AND THE RETURN OF THE MNF FORCES TO BEIRUT, BUT HE CRITICISED THEIR EARLIER "PREMATURE WITHDRAWAL"

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

AND ADDED THAT HE HOPES THE U.S. WILL REALLY DO SOMETHING WITH ISRAEL "THIS TIME."

8. FOR THE RECORD, WE ARE ALSO REPORTING SEVERAL ADDITIONAL EGYPTIAN PROTESTS AGAINST THE BEIRUT MASSACRES WHICH WERE MADE BEFORE THE PRESIDENT'S ADDRESS.

--AS REPORTED IN THE SEPTEMBER 22 EDITION OF OPPOSITION NEWSPAPER AL-AHALI, THE BOARD OF THE CAIRO BAR ASSOCIAT ASSOCIATION ON SEPT. 19 REACTED STRONGLY TO NEWS OF THE BEIRUT MASSACRES. IT CALLED FOR RECONSIDERATION OF CAMP DAVID AND THE PEACE TREATY WITH ISRAEL; FREEZING OF EGYPTIAN-ISRAELI RELATIONS; EXPULSION OF THE ISRAELI AMBASSADOR FROM CAIRO AND RECALL OF THE EGYPTIAN AMBASSADOR FROM TEL AVIV; AND THE BOYCOTTING OF AMERICAN INTERESTS IN EGYPT AND ALL ARAB COUNTRIES.

AMONG THOSE SIGNING THE STATEMENT WAS BOARD CHAIRMAN AHMED HASSAN SHANNAN, AN NDP PARTY MEMBER WHO SUCCEEDED TO HIS POSITION LAST YEAR WITH ACQUIESCENCE OF THE GOVERNMENT-AFTER THE PREVIOUS INCUMBENT HAD BEEN FORCED OUT FOR OPEN CRITICISM OF PRESIDENT SADAT.

--TODAY'S AKHBAR REPORTED A STATEMENT BY THE EGYPTIAN MEDICAL ASSOCIATION DENOUNCING THE BRUTAL MASSACRE OF PALESTINIANS IN LEBANON AND CALLING UPON ARAB GOVERNMENTS TO CONFRONT THIS AGGRESSION. THE STATEMENT HELD PRESIDENT REAGAN RESPONSIBLE FOR ISRAEL'S VIOLATION OF THE CEASEFIRE, AND CALLED UPON HIM TO FORCE ISRAEL TO WITHDRAW FROM BEIRUT SO THAT THE ARAB'S CONFIDENCE IN AMERICA MAY BE RESTORED.

--AHRAM'S EDITORIAL PAGE SEPT. 21 CARRIED A LENGTHY AND VITUPERATIVE PIECE BY ABDEL RAHMAN EL-SHARQAWI, FORMER EDITOR OF ROSE EL-YOUSSEF MAVGAZINE AND NOW CHAIRMAN OF THE AFRO-ASIAN SOLIDARITY COMMITTEE (WHICH IN ROME SEVERAL MONTHS AGO CALLED FOR YASSER ARAFAT TO COME TO EGYPT--AN INITIATIVE WHICH FELL FLAT). EL-SHARQAWI'S PIECE STRONGLY ATTACKED THE U.S. FOR DEFENDING ISRAEL IN THE UN AND FOR SUPPLYING ISRAEL WITH THE WEAPONS USED TO COMMIT MASSACRES IN LEBANON.

--ON SEPT. 28, ONE OF OUR AID CONTRACTORS WAS HOLDING A MEETING IN ONE OF CAIRO'S POORER NEIGHBORHOODS.

THE MEETING WAS INTERRUPTED BY A LOCAL RESIDENT DWHO, DESPITE HIS PROCLAIMED FRIENDSHIP FOR AMERICANS, ANGRILY DENOUNCED THE U.S. FOR ITS POLICY IN LEBANON,

AS INSTRUCTED IN PARA 3 OF REFTEL. I PROBED WITH ALI THE QUESTION OF FUTURE EGYPTIAN-ISRAEL! RELATIONS. WASHINGTON CHARGE EL ZOEBY, MFA STAFFERS AND NEA/EGY DIRECTOR LLOYD.

4. REFERRING TO HIS SEPT. 30 CONVERSATION WITH THE SECRETARY, BUTRUS GHALI TURNED TO HIS "PREOCCUPATIONS" CONCERNING THE PEACE PROCESS: MOMENTUM AND CREDIBILITY. 5. BUTRUS GHALI SAID ENTERPRISE WILL REQUIRE CAREFUL EFFORTS. RESULT WOULD BE INTERNATIONAL ENDORSEMENT OF THE PRESIDENT'S INITIATIVE. HE NOTED THAT SECRETARY HAD UNDERSCORED U.S. DETERMINATION TO PURSUE THE INITIATIVE BY POINTING OUT THAT THE PRESIDENT, NOT THE SECRETARY, HAD PROPOSED IT. HOWEVER, BUTRUS GHALI SAID EGYPT HAD

- 6. VELIOTES CHALLENGED BUTRUS GHALI'S ASSERTION THAT U.S. IS OPPOSED IN PRINCIPLE TO UN ACTION ON THE MIDDLE EAST. HE SAID THIS IS NOT THE CASE, BUT WE ARE CONCERNED THAT OUR OPPONENTS WOULD ADD ELEMENTS WE WOULD HAVE TO OPPOSE. DF COURSE WE WOULD BE DELIGHTED IF 100 NATIONS ENDORSED PRESIDENT REAGAN'S PROPOSALS, BUT OUR EXPERIENCE WITH THE UN MAKES US SKEPTICAL OF SUCH AN OUTCOME.
- 7. BUTRUS GHALI SAID EGYPT IS CONVINCED THAT UN IS USEFUL TOOL AND IF U.S. AGREES, GOE WOULD BEGIN CONTACTS WITH OTHER COUNTRIES. HE NOTED THE SECRETARY HAD SAID THE ISSUE IS WORTH STUDYING. VELIOTES SAID WE MUST FIRST DISCUSS THE SUBSTANCE OF WHAT WOULD IN A PROPOSED UNGA RESOLUTION. ON TIMING, BUTRUS GHALI SAID THAT DISCUSSION OF PALESTINIAN ISSUE IN UNGA WILL NOT BEGIN BEFORE NOVEMBER 15, SC 5-6 WEEKS ARE AVAILABLE. HE ADDED THAT EGYPT WILL DROP THE IDEA IF PRELIMINARY SOUNDINGS ARE UNFAVORABLE. BUTRUS GHALI AND VELIOTES AGREED TO CONSULT

UN EXPERTS IN EACH GOVERNMENT ON LANGUAGE AND TACTICS. MOUSSA OBSERVED THAT RESOLUTION WOULD BE BASED ON PRESIDENT'S INITIATIVE AND WOULD REFLECT CONSULTATIONS WITH OTHERS. BUTRUS GHALI SAID ACCOUNT WOULD HAVE TO BE TAKEN OF VIEWS OF EC-10 ON A PALESTINIAN HOMELAND. VELIOTES WARNED THAT U.S. POSITION STANDS, AND WE WILL NOT NEGOTIATE AWAY FROM THE PRESIDENT'S PROPOSALS. 9. BUTRUS GHALI EMPHASIZED THE NEED TO PLAN THE PROCESS CAREFULLY. HE ASKED WHAT WOULD HAPPEN IF ISRAEL CALLED THE RESOLUTION THE SAME AS CAMP DAVID AND AS A RESULT THE ARABS REFUSED TO COME TO THE TABLE. HE SAID ONE SCENARIO RESULTING FROM THE UNGA RESOLUTION MIGHT BE A CONFERENCE ON PEACE IN THE MIDDLE EAST, TO WHICH ISRAEL, JORDAN, EGYPT AND OTHERS MIGHT BE INVITED TO CONSIDER THE BASIC DOCUMENTS: 242, CAMP DAVID AND THE NEW UNGA RESOLUTION. UNDER THIS APPROACH, BUTRUS GHALI SAID QUESTIONS ON SUCH ISSUES AS THE RESUMPTION OF TRIPARTITE NEGOTIATIONS COULD BE BYPASSED. PERHAPS THERE WOULD BE NO REASON TO MENTION CAMP DAVID AND THE NEW RESOLUTION EXPLICITLY, AND EACH SIDE WOULD ATTEND FOR ITS OWN REASONS. VELICITES SAID THE PROPOSAL WAS INTERESTING AND THAT WE WOULD LOOK AT IT.

10. VELIOTES SAID THE TOP PRIORITY NOW IS FINDING A WAY TO GET THE JORDANIANS AND PALESTINIANS TO THE NEGOTIATING TABLE. BUTRUS GHALI ASKED HOW EGYPT CAN HELP. VELIOTES REPLIED THAT THE ARABS SEEM TO BELIEVE THAT AFTER THEY NEGOTIATE WITH EACH OTHER, THEY WILL THEN NEGOTIATE WITH THE U.S. THIS IS NOT THE CASE, HE SAID; THE FOCUS SHOULD BE ON A NEGOTIATION WITH ISRAEL AND THE ARABS SHOULD UNDERSTAND THAT. ALSO, VELIOTES, SAID, JORDAN WILL NEED STRONG SAUDI SUPPORT AND THE SAUDIS SHOULD BE URGED IN THAT DIRECTION. HE WONDERED WHY THE SAUDIS WERE SO RELUCTANT TO BE FORTHCOMING. BUTRUS GHALI OBSERVED THAT AT FEZ THE SAUDIS HAD OPPOSED ARAB RECONCILIATION WITH EGYPT. VELIOTES SAID THE U.S. WOULD DISCUSS THESE ISSUES 'ITH THE SAUDIS. IN RESPONSE TO VELIOTES' QUESTION, BUTRUS GHALI SAID EGYPT HAS GOOD RELATIONS WITH HUSSEIN,

RELATIONS WITH MOROCCO ON AFRICAN ISSUES ONLY, AND THAT RELATIONS WITH SAUDI ARABIA ARE PRACTICALLY NON-EXISTENT. HE SAID THAT RELATIONS WITH HUSSEIN HAD BEGUN WITH SADAT, WHO AGREED TO SEND HUSSEIN REPORTS ON EGYPT'S MEETINGS WITH THE ISRAELIS. VELIOTES OBSERVED THAT THE SAUDIS DO NOT LIKE TO BE LEFT OUT, AND THOUGHT THAT IF EGYPTIAN RELATIONS WITH HASSAN AND HUSSEIN WERE STEPPED UP, THERE MIGHT BE IMPROVEMENT IN SAUDI RELATIONS WITH EGYPT.

11. CONCLUDING, BUTRUS GHALI SAID EGYPT WILL SEND THE

U.S. A NON-PAPER WITH THE DRAFT OF THE UNGA RESOLUTION. HE WOULD BE LEAVING NEW YORK OCTOBER 3 AND PROPOSED AN EARLY MEETING IN EUROPE (POSSIBLY PARIS OR ROME) WITH VELIOTES TO DISCUSS INFORMALLY THE NON-PAPER AND THE AGENDA OF A CONFERENCE. HE STRESSED THE NEED FOR CLOSE U.S-EGYPTIAN CONTACTS, SAYING THAT AS A RESULT OF CLOSE CONTACTS THE ISRAELIS OFTEN PRESENT THEIR CASE BETTER THAN OTHERS.
