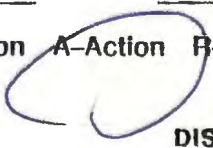

PRESIDENTIAL REMARKS: DEPARTURE OF PRESIDENT MUBARAK
THURSDAY, JANUARY 27, 1983

President Mubarak and I have just had a comprehensive and useful discussion, first in my office and then over lunch. As might be expected, given our full partnership in the search for regional peace and security, there was broad agreement on the critical issues facing us in Lebanon and I assured President Mubarak of my determination to support the territorial integrity, independence and sovereignty of Lebanon. To that end, there must be an early withdrawal of all foreign forces.

We also discussed the urgent need to achieve a comprehensive peace settlement for the Middle East which would permit all the states in the region to live in peace, while meeting the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people. In that regard, I thanked President Mubarak for his support of my September 1 peace initiative and promised to work closely with him to expand the peace process. On Africa, I reaffirmed our support for Egypt's constructive efforts, as a leading African power, to promote the stability and development of African countries and institutions.

On bilateral questions, I reiterated the importance of our economic and military assistance for Egypt and assured the President that our assistance will complement his economic policy and development priorities. Specifically, we wish to support the priorities of the new Egyptian 5-year plan, with emphasis on increasing agricultural and industrial productivity, and the rehabilitation and expansion of the water and related disposal

systems in Egypt's major urban centers. In response to President Mubarak's request for more flexible economic assistance, [our ministries will work together to find ways and means for rapidly disbursing economic assistance.] We also will explore with Congress ways to permit some reprogramming of funds to high priority areas.

President Mubarak's visit, the second since he was elected to office, emphasizes the special nature of our relations with Egypt and the importance I assign his friendship and wise counsel. Our two countries share a common dedication to building a Middle East that is peaceful, prosperous and secure from outside intervention. The Egyptian-American full partnership has accomplished much towards the realization of that ideal. We will continue to build on our record of accomplishment. I look forward to working with my friend, President Mubarak, towards that end.

PROPOSED DEPARTURE STATEMENT

President Mubarak and I have just had a very comprehensive and useful discussion, first in my office and then over lunch. As might be expected, given the frequent consultations and close relations between our two countries, there was broad agreement on the critical issues facing us in the Middle East. We reviewed the situation in Lebanon and the importance of achieving a comprehensive peace settlement for the Middle East. In that regard, I expressed my gratitude to President Mubarak for his support of my Middle East peace initiative and promised to remain in close touch with him as we seek to make an expanded peace process a reality.

On bilateral questions, I reiterated the importance I attach to our economic and military assistance programs for Egypt. To improve the coordination of our economic assistance, President Mubarak and I agreed to establish the Egyptian-American Economic Assistance Coordinating Committee, which will meet at least once annually, and more often if necessary. I have designated AID Administrator Peter McPherson to chair the U.S. side of this committee.

President Mubarak's visit, the second since he was elected to office, symbolizes the importance I place on our relations with Egypt and on his friendship and wise counsel. Our two countries share a common dedication to the ideal of a Middle East that is peaceful, prosperous and secure from outside intervention. Egyptian-American cooperation has accomplished much towards the realization of that ideal. I fully expect that we will continue to build on our record of accomplishment. I look forward to working with my good friend, President Mubarak, towards that end.
