

Subject: Proposed Scenario for Presidential Visit to the United Nations: September 25-26, 1983

The President's decision to deliver the American statement at the September 26 session of the general debate of the 38th United Nations General Assembly opens a number of choices for his schedule. The following scenario sets out required and optional activities. From a protocol viewpoint, the only essential meetings are courtesy calls on the Secretary General of the United Nations, Javier Perez de Cuellar, and on the new President of the General Assembly, not yet elected. (He will be either Hepburn of the Bahamas or Illueca of Panama.)

Sunday, September 25

1800 Arrive New York City

Host principals-only dinner for visiting head or heads of state/government. The format would be the same as in Williamsburg.

Monday, September 26

We have allotted time for three or four bilateral or group meetings. The Department has already recommended five essential meetings during the UNGA period: President Mubarak of Egypt, President Mitterrand of France, Prime Minister Gandhi of India, King Hassan of Morocco, and President Betancur of Colombia. Aside from Mrs. Gandhi who arrives in New York September 25, it is not yet clear which of these leaders will be in New York on September 26. For example, we know that President Mubarak will be on an official visit in Europe and will not arrive in New York until September 28; in fact he is scheduled to see Mitterrand in Paris on September 27. Likewise Mrs. Thatcher is not to arrive in the U.S. until September 29, and does not at present plan to go to the UNGA at all, although the President's announcement may change her mind.

We expect that announcement of the President's decision to address the UNGA will stimulate other leaders to go to New York or to change their intended dates of participation, thus leading to additional requests for bilaterals. We will review our earlier recommendations on the basis of reactions to the announcement of the Presidential visit, and the amount of time the President would make available. In any event, assuming that the list contained in Tab l is substantially inflated for September 26, it will be inevitable that a number of leaders already in New York and those unable to be present while he is there will try to see him in Washington.





One New York meeting, however, seems indicated above all others: i.e., Prime Minister Gandhi. The President could meet with her privately or, alternatively, with Mrs. Gandhi and a few other nonaligned heads of state from various geographic regions. In the latter case, we would need careful prior understandings with Mrs. Gandhi on participants, agenda, and outcome of such a meeting. (This matter is addressed in a separate Hill-Clark memo which includes a suggested letter to Mrs. Gandhi.)

In addition to a meeting with Gandhi, there could be similar meetings with heads of organizations, such as the Presidents of the EC-10 (Papandreou), the OAU (Mengistu), ASEAN and the Arab League. The attendance at these meetings would depend upon the format adopted for Mrs. Gandhi. Group meetings have the potential of giving the impression of a rival summit. One-on-one meetings with these leaders would minimize this risk.

Alternatively, the President could hold separate meetings with the geographic groups, e.g. African (OAU), Latin American, Asian. As can be seen from Tab 1, the numbers would be small, but in this manner he will have spoken with all heads of state/government in attendance on September 26.

Finally, the President could hold bilaterals with particularly important individuals. This would provide for good, substantive meetings but could cause bad feelings among those left out.

In any case, the President's activities will not preclude requests for individual bilaterals in Washington or necessarily result in the cancellation of any requests already pending.






