

Dear Mr. Manley:

I have been asked to reply to your letter of March 28 to Mr. Robert C. McFarlane, Assistant to the President for National Security Affairs, regarding an AID package for Tanzania.

Based on AID's reply to an inquiry which Senator Tower made on your behalf in January, you are probably aware of the suspension of all new U.S. development assistance funded activities for Tanzania. This is due to Tanzania's default on past Foreign Assistance Act-funded loans which has brought into effect a Congress-mandated legal requirement for cut off (the Brooke Amendment). It is difficult to estimate when the default might be resolved (it is up to the Tanzanian Government) and how our development assistance program might be structured once it is resumed. We do not expect that a remedy for the default is near. As far as we know, a Tanzania Government agreement with the IMF is not imminent.

We appreciate, nonetheless, the amount of work which has gone into your proposal and the great interest you have shown developing an approach to raising Tanzania's food output. you for sharing your views with us.

Dear Mr. Chairman: For the past sixteen months, my firm has been dealing with officials from Tanzania regarding an agricultural package for the Country of Tanzania. In meetings in London with the First Secretary of Agriculture and in subsequent meetings with Afriservices, an African trading company composed principally of retired British trained Tanzanian officers, it has been pointed out to me the international political advantages of our participating in this agricultural AID package for that country. It was also suggested by Prof. Simon Mbilinyi that political concessions to the center-right would be made by Tanzania and all other eight members of the South Africa Development Coordinating Committee. In my personal opinion, United States would be passing up establishing an excellent long-term relationship with nine countries in East Africa if we neglect the overtures which have been made. I have talked with the Honorable Al Hanley who at the time was Chief of Mission to Tanzania and who endorsed my agriculture package as a number one priority after an IMF agreement has been reached between the Government of Tanzania and the International Monetary Fund. It is my understanding after discussions with Col. (Ret.) Amin Kashmiri in London in November, 1983 that Tanzania

is close to reaching an agreement having devaluated their currency over a period of 1-1/2 years a full 50%. I urge you to seriously consider this AID package for Tanzania in the interest of the United States long term diplomatic, economic and political relations with Tanzania and the other members of the South Africa Development Coordinating Committee.

Having personally met with these people over a period of sixteen months, I would be willing to elaborate my feelings to the National Security Council.

RESUME OF NEGOTIATIONS

ON AGRICULTURE TRANSACTION FOR TANZANIA

Resume of contact between private and official representatives of the Government of Tanzania and Chief Executive Officer of Manley Imports & Exports, Inc. over a period of the past fourteen months. Meetings were held in Washington, D.C., Mexico City, and London.

Approximately fourteen months ago in Washington, D.C., I was approached and advised by people representing Tanzania, that they needed approximately 1,000 tractors with implements in order to have a productive agriculture program as their people were in grave need of food and thus far, attempts at agricultural production have been other than successful. We agreed to assist the Country of Tanzania which was to be represented by Afriservices of London, England and Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. Afriservices was to be assisted by Africonsult of London and Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. Col. SMA Kashmiri retired from the Tanzanian army, was to be the principal party representing Tanzanian commercial interests. We have not kept a daily diary on these meetings for reasons of confidentiality.

On May 4, 1983, John M. Manley, representing Manley Imports & Exports, Inc. had a meeting with Prof. Simon Mbilinyi in a private meeting room in London at the Naval and Military Club of London. Present were Prof. Simon Mbilinyi, Principal Secretary of the Ministry of Agriculture, Col. SMA Kashmiri, and Mrs. Mariam Zailor of Afriservices. Also present was Mr. Michael Morris of the Paris office of International Harvester representing International Harvester's interest and assisting in preparation of the agricultural package. After many hours of discussion, Prof. Simon Mbilinyi conceded of the sad state of modern agriculture production in! Tanzania and requested that a representative of International Harvester go to Arusha, Tanzania and meet with agricultural technicians in Tanzania. Mr. G. Thompson of the International Harvester office in Paris met with the agricultural engineers of Tanzania in Arusha, Tanzania. After this meeting of agriculture specialist, Prof. Simon Mbilinyi, Principal Secretary of the Ministry of Agriculture, on May 19, 1983, forwarded a letter with his requirements for a successful agriculture venture in Tanzania.

During our numerous meetings in London with Prof. Mbilinyi, Col. Kashmiri, and Mrs. Mariam Zailor, it was pointed out to me that Tanzania, while being presently partially occupied by unwelcomed forces, had a sincere desire to go to the West along with eight other countries in East Africa who are leaning to the West. Shortly after being decolonized after World War II, they had felt that they were being exploited as a colony. As a result, they made the extreme move to the Left toward Communism and they feel that they are on the losing end. To quote Col. Kashmiri, they (Tanzania), and eight other nations of East Africa, feel that they are being "fleeced".

After the meeting with Prof. Mbilinyi on May 4th, on the evening of May 5th, I had dinner in an Afro-Arabian restaurant in London with Prof. Mbilinyi and in a private discussion of which I was the only American present, Prof. Mbilinyi took one of his cards and in his own handwriting, said that not only did Tanzania want to swing to the West and toward free enterprise, but he wrote the name of Southern Africa Development Coordinating Committee, a group of nine countries in East Africa. It is my feeling, after discussions with these Tanzanian gentlemen, and they are in agreement, that if we can put together an effective agricultural program in Tanzania which will grow crops, it will be a major United States example for all of East Africa. Included in the agricultural package is a request for agriculture advisers and maintenance people, up to twenty personnel from the United States, to assist with this and we will show all the countries of East Africa an example of a successful United States AID program.

Over the past fourteen months, I have had meetings in Washington with the following:

Mrs. Joan Johnson who is over the Tanzanian Desk of the State Department,

Alexander Ray Love, Bureau for Africa, Agency for International Development,

Robert Calderisi of The World Bank,

David F. Demarest, Jr., Office of the U. S. Trade Representative, Director of Public Affairs,

F. L. Stokelin, Office of African Affairs, U. S. Department of Commerce,

Gerald M. Feldman, Director of East/West Africa Division, U. S. Department of Commerce,

Robert H. Dickson, Jr., Legislative Counsel to Senator John Tower,

Virginia Mayo, Economist of the African Section of The Export-Import Bank,

David K. Kehl, Legislative Assistant to Congressman Robert H. Michel,

Urath C. Gibson, International Trade Specialist, U. S. Department of Commerce.

Since meeting with Mrs. Joan Johnson in the State Department, I have kept her periodically advised of the activities in this matter.

Prof. Simon Mbilinyi was born in Tanzania, educated at the University of Michigan as a economist, and served as a professor at Stanford University and is very pro-West. He drew up the Tanzanian economic program several years ago for Tanzania and was named First Minister of Agriculture. He is very highly thought of by all people from the West for his economic views and sentiments.

Col. SMA Kashmiri was born in Tanzania, trained by the British in England for the military and retired after sixteen years' service. He is a perfect gentleman and is highly intelligent; excellent contacts in Tanzania and East Africa.

Mariam Zailor was educated by missionaries in Tanzania, is highly intelligent, and has excellent contacts as far as the Tanzanian Ambassador to the United Nations.

Col. G. I. Marealle was born in Tanzania, educated by the British in England for the Tanzanian army, retired Tanzanian army, highly intelligent, excellent contacts, and a perfect gentleman.

Manley Imports & Exports, Inc. has been dealing with Mr. Jay O. Suchland, Martin Patmore, Tom Riemers of International Harvester's Chicago International Sales office, and Mr. Michael T. Morris, Regional Manager, Africa, International Harvester, Paris office.

We have also talked with Mr. Don Monrad, International Sales for Catapillar Tractor of Peioria, Illinois and David Sutherby British representative of Catapillar office in London, England.

I would like to point out that after Chief of Mission Hanley heard my presentation on this agricultural package for Tanzania, he stated to me that in his opinion, it was just exactly what Tanzania needed and should have number one priority after an agreement is reached with the International Monetary Fund. Thus far, their currency has devalued 30% and an additional 20% devaluation will occur shortly according to Col. Kashmiri. It is anticipated that an International Monetary Fund agreement will be reached between the Government of Tanzania and International Monetary Fund by January or February, 1984.

The major agreement of May 3, 1983 called for agriculatural equipment in the amount of \$47,150,000.00 all United States manufactured. There have been price changes since May 3, 1983, therefore, we would like to know will funds be available for such a major agricultural project for Tanzania?

It is interesting to note that the recent Commission appointed . by the President on foreign aid states that aid and assistance to foreign nations should be in compliance with United States foreign policies. It is my feeling that this package fully meets that requirement. We have a group of people whose leaders are seeking a gradual free enterprise system for their nation.

I will be in Washington soon to further elaborate upon this package and give details of my meeting with Col. Kashmiri on November 14, 1983 concerning political implications. We have friends in Tanzania who are seeking a better life in cooperation with a free world and in particular, the United States of America.

I have personally been invited to go into Tanzania when and if delivery is made on the tractors by Prof. Simon Mbilinyi. my dealings with these people, I find that they are sincere.

It is interesting to note that Tanzania was the African nation that invaded Uganda at the time General Ida Amin who had killed over 55,000 of his own people. Col. Kashmiri and Prof. Mbilinyi pointed out the fact that the economic repercussions of that war had a disastrous effect on the nation, yet these people had the courage to correct a very serious situation in a neighbor country. It is also reasonably safe to say that they have the best army in East Africa.

In closing this resume of my activities over the past fourteen months regarding this agricultural package for Tanzania, I have attempted to present the facts of what I consider to be a highly worthwhile AID package for East Africa. If it is successful and agriculturally productive, it will create a very fine impression of the United States in Tanzania and all of East Africa in my opinion.
