THE PRESIDENT: Greetings to all of you, the officers and men of the USS Eisenhower. Believe me, all of us up here are inspired by the sight of your magnificent ship and the battle group which accompanied you to the coast of Normandy.

We're returning from a commemmoration of the 40th anniversary of the D-Day landing -- the heroic operation that was planned and commanded by General Dwight D. Eisenhower. The memory of "Ike" our great allied leader still inspires heroic efforts on both sides of the Atlantic.

Today, as 40 years ago, our Navy and all of our Armed Forces are advancing the cause of peace and freedom. The dedication of you, our sailors and marines, particularly during your recent deployment in the Eastern Mediterranean, is in the highest tradition of the service.
