



Dear Dr. Schneider:

I understand the Government of Taiwan has just completed a competitive evaluation of the Hughes 500MD/TOW and the German BO-105/HOT to fill a defensive amphibious assault requirement. Selection of the winning system is expected within the next thirty days. Hughes, because of its significant cost advantage, has an excellent opportunity to win the program.

In anticipation of the sale, Hughes requested an advisory opinion (GC-0183-84) from the Department of State as to whether or not the United States Government would favorably consider the sale of the 500MD/TOW to Taiwan. On July 9, 1984, Hughes was advised that the sale "would not be in furtherance of the foreign policy of the United States."

The 500MP helicopter has been in operation in Taiwan for a number of years in an armed ASW configuration for the Navy and police configuration for the National Police. The helicopter has limited performance capability in terms of payload and endurance, and can be effectively utilized in defensive posture only. The ground TOW missile system is also integrated in the Republic of China military force structure. It was procured from the United States through FMS channels.

The components of the 500MD/TOW are, therefore, already in Taiwan. The sale of the 500MD/TOW does not represent new technology nor the introduction of new or advanced weapon systems. The introduction of the airborne TOW system represents only a repackaging of the current ground TOW system to provide the stabilization necessary for helicopter application.

The sale of the 500MD/TOW appears to be within the current arms transfer restraints and provides an excellent opportunity for the United States to demonstrate its continued support of Taiwan. If, however, the TOW embargo is sustained, it is expected that the Taiwanese will select the BO-105 with the French HOT missile system. The HOT system is currently in production and has been successfully integrated on the BO-105.

I would appreciate it if you would review the situation and determine if Department of State approval is possible.

George, I don't know what makes some of the people over there tick but, Korea has about 250 of these helicopters, they are all armed, they are enemy of the Red Cninese, the same as Taiwan, so what is the difference whether we sell them helicopters with weapons or without?

I wish you could get this thing cleared up because, I guess, I've spent the better part of a month over there, on separate occasions, trying to get this deal closed for an American company. To loose it now to a German company, only because of the decisions made at some level in your Department, is beyond my ability to understand.
