File → This is in response to your memorandum of August 14th about the CWA's request for a color guard and musical chorus for its September 26 - 29 convention in Washington.

Department of Defense (DoD) Directive 5410.18 authorizes and encourages support for events and occasions "of general interest or benefit to the community as a whole," hosted by non-partisan sponsors, where the primary intent is patriotism, public understanding of national security problems, or public appreciation of our national heritage.

That same directive also states:

Department of Defense support and participation must not directly or indirectly (a) endorse or selectively benefit or favor, or appear to endorse or selectively benefit or favor any private individual, group, corporation (whether profit or nonprofit), religion, sect, religious or sectarian group, quasi-religious or ideological movement, fraternal organization, political organization, or commercial venture, or (b) be associated with the solicitation of votes in a political election. (emphasis added)

The Community Relations Directorate, Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Public Affairs), uses the Encyclopedia of Associations to determine the nature of the many organizations regularly requesting DoD support. The CWA is listed on page 1369 of the 1985 edition, in Section 11, "Religious Organizations." The CWA describes itself in its own words as "Christian," with 220,000 members; the narrative entry the CWA provided says it:

Seeks to inform concerned women in America about the "erosion of our historic Christian-Judeo moral standards" and to provide the opportunity for "concerted and effective actions against movements seeking to destroy the family." Has formed national prayer chapters; encourages members to pray for government leaders. Designates special prayer alerts on morality and family issues.

On the basis of its nature as a religious group, CWA's request for DoD support to its upcoming convention was declined under the provisions of the directive quoted above.

It should be noted that the CWA's 1985 convention flyer reflects its religious orientation (it says the convention will close with a Sunday morning "worship and praise service") and that invited speakers include pro-life (e.g., Melody Green) activists. Any exception to policy to provide DoD support would selectively benefit a particular religious group and imply endorsement of one side of a deeply debated social, moral, and ethical issue that has yet to be resolved in the public and political arena.

DoD policy regarding support of public events is grounded in the reality that "the Armed Forces and the Defense Establishment belong to all the American people." Common ownership dictates the policy of the equitable commitment of resources described earlier.

This policy is reinforced by the practical consideration that since limitations of time and resources make it impossible to respond positively to all equally valid requests of individuals and groups for support, the Department (of Defense) should not do for one what it cannot do for all.





Hope you don't mind one personal note.


My brother-in-law, Carl Wahl, is a Secret Service agent, currently on Vice-Presidential detail.

BoE LEGAL ALERT

On Friday, May 24, 1985, the following proposed bylaw by the State board of Education appeared in the Maryland Register:

PROPOSED BYLAW
COMAR 13A.09.09.02

(a) "School" means any individual, partnership, group, association, cooperative, or corporation, excluding the federal government or any state, county, or municipal agency or division of these, organized for the primary purpose of providing instruction for an organized group (or groups of pupils pursuing defined studies at a defined level) of pupils at least two of whom do not have the same parent or guardian, and at least two of whom are not being instructed on a regular daily basis by their parent or guardian.

(If the bylaw was passed the words in brackets would be deleted; the underlined words would be added.)


We oppose the language of this bylaw because the changes are designed to restrict churches from operating home-school programs. Under the new definition, a parent could be prosecuted for truancy violations even if they are enrolled in a home school under a local church's authority. While the church is allowed to be exempt from such state jurisdiction (Ed. code 2-206 (4)e) the BoE wants to define a certain type of school program that a church cannot operate without their approval. The church cannot let the BoE define or decide what ministries can or cannot be operated. We must leave ministry vision to God alone! Simply put, these regulations are designed to remove specific privileges that the law has clearly provided. We must speak up to prevent their removal!

We suggest that you send a letter, before the July 29 deadline, stating your concerns. Also try to attend the public meeting of July 31 at the State BoE offices (this is not a public hearing). We also advise that you call to voice your concerns a second time sometime before the July 29 deadline. Send your comments to:


Thank you for your inquiry about our home school program!

This includes; transcripts, school records, individualized K-12 curriculum planning, teacher training, workshops, local level support groups, experienced teacher consultation, home visits, annual achievement testing, statewide meetings, field trips, and legal protection under current Maryland law.

The enclosed material explains our program in greater detail. Please feel free to call if you have additional questions.

Families interested in joining our growing home school system should read this packet carefully, complete all essential information on the enclosed forms, and enclose your Application Fee of \$46.00. Be sure to select three (3) preferences for interview dates. All new families are required to have an interview at the time of enrollment.

The most outstanding reservations parents have about homeschooling are the questions of legality. Is it legal? Do I have to get approval from the local authorities? What does enrollment in WCF-SSS provide legally? These questions are difficult for the average non-lawyer to assess. We at WCF-SSS have carefully gone over legal concerns with a competent attorney and have organized our school accordingly.

Simply put, the State Board of Education has jurisdiction over all non-collegiate education. There is only one exception to this authority--the church operated school or instructional program. (See Md. Education Code 2-206 (1), (4)(e).) Currently, any home education program can be overseen by the state unless it is authorized and operated by a bona fide church that wishes to operate under the exemption provision. The BoE does not like churches operating home schools, and has made many attempts to prevent it. However, the Attorney General's office has finally acknowledged that the 2-206 exemption does indeed apply to every home-school location that we operate. All of our families have been protected by our legally correct organization (not one has gone to court). The BoE is still attempting to undermine our program by opinions and certain by-laws, but the fact remains that state law has made provisions for our exempt existence. The abuse of power by the BoE does not make our program illegal. However, we must be willing to stand against their abuses if we intend to preserve our liberties. At this time, the major Christian school organizations and other pro-family lobby groups of Maryland are working along with us to preserve this open door of opportunity for Christians.

Our church operated home schools are legally exempt. For this reason we need to protect the integrity of the Christian elements of each home school. Hence, our detailed 4-page application designed to ensure that we have families of the highest Christian commitment. We must be willing to sacrifice in order to protect our church/school freedoms.

APPLICATION

This school is committed to the central responsibility of parents! God, in His wisdom, has designed the family as the center of character and life education. This responsibility cannot be abrogated. In its conception, the daily informal "classroom" of the home was God's intended tool. The waning of this training center in modern society has played a major role in the decline of dynamic Christian living. Its timely replacement will play no small part of any lasting Christian renewal.

PROGRAM DETAILS

What is the program philosophy of WCF-SSS?

WCF-SSS is a school is founded upon three mandates. The Divine Mandate requires parents to fully shoulder their responsibility of training children in the informal and and secure home setting where life principles are "caught" by example more than didactically taught. The Statutory Mandate requires all to be responsive to the state's concerns (compelling interests) that children grow up to be useful, productive and well adjusted citizens (this, of course, is also a scriptural mandate!). Thirdly, the Natural Mandate receives its impetus from careful research that demonstrates that learning of any sort is best accomplished in the loving, caring environment of the home.

How should home schooling relate to the church?

The church was designed to be a resource of support and direction for every child of God. The home was designed to be the center of training for children. The church must, therefore, see itself as a support network for parents in their role of training their children, but it must also be careful not to usurp or supplant the parental role.

WCF-SSS offers its program to parents who share our philosophy and do not have a similar program available thru their church. We view our ministry as complimentary to the local church and wish to work alongside and in conjunction with it. Our families need to have the general support of their church leadership.

What are the academic goals of WCF-SSS?

Our goals include; the satisfaction of the state's compelling interests, individualized academic programs built around the child's readiness, teaching methods that reflect the informal home setting and tutorial approach, inclusion of other essential non-academic skills, and, above all, spiritual training worthy of the Christian's heavenly calling.

What curriculum is used?

Each of our programs are individualized to meet the needs of the child, experience of the teacher and general use and preference of the particular family. Our basic core materials come from publishers like A Beka Book, Bob Jones, Rod & Staff, Alpha Omega, ACE-Basic, and Moore's Home Grown Kids. Many other publishers are also used to round out the specific needs of a particular home.

How are students placed in the program?

Through testing, previous school experience and conference, each child is placed in an academic level that reflects their capabilities. A loose correlation of gradedness may exist, but emphasis is put on skill level.

What is needed to start a program?

After completion of the enclosed application, each family has an interview which is designed to complete the necessary details of enrollment and establish the new program. These interviews are held during regular business hours (9-5) at our offices. We ask that both parents attend this meeting. Enrollment details include contracts, transcripts, textbook selection, I.E.P. forms, record keeping, calendar, daily schedules, etc.

How does WCF-SSS monitor and operate the program?

After proper completion of all paperwork, the program is operated through three provisions. First, we have at least two general teachers meetings which are required. Secondly, there is a systematic record keeping plan which keeps our office informed of your progress. (This includes lesson plans, summaries, attendance and sample work.) Regular home visits (four (4) for new parents) are also planned for encouragement and oversight.

What other features are available through WCF-SSS?

Besides the organization and monitorization of the basic program, WCF-SSS sponsors several state wide events each year. These include; special field trips just for home schoolers, access to a Christian teachers convention, regional family fellowships, a Scholastic Arts Festival, a Field Day, achievement testing, an annual banquet and more as the Lord provides.

Is there any special help available to parents?

We do not require parents to have achieved a certain level of education as a prerequisite for acceptance. Indeed, the responsibility of parenthood extends to every Christian family regardless of educational level. Developing a healthy fulfillment of these responsibilities is the goal of our ministry. An open policy like ours must demand a specific educational support system to ensure competency in every program. Failure to do so would jeopardize the integrity of our schools.

One of the main responsibilities of our program is to provide services to parents that will ensure the proper progress and competency of every program. In order to facilitate this need in our program, we have established a special tutorial program that is available to all of our families on a demand basis.

FEE POLICY

The cost of this program is less than Christian schools but it is more expensive than correspondence schools. This is necessary in order for us to carry out the many facets of administration, home visits and other special programs. A very important legal question is raised if a school does not have the financial base from which to carry out its advertised program. Therefore, it is the policy of WCF-SSS to accept gifts and charge fees and tuition as necessary to provide the fiscal base needed to operate this ministry.

Fee Categories

Application Fee: Each family applying for the program shall pay a one-time \$46.00 non-refundable application fee.

Program Development Fee: There is a program development fee for first year families. This one-time \$54.00 fee is due with the submittal of the organizational paperwork given out after acceptance into our program. Besides the extra administrative costs, this fee also includes the extra home visit given to first year families.

Enrollment Fee: A non-refundable enrollment fee of \$45.00 is due for each student enrolled in our program. This fee covers testing and curriculum development for each child. Children not needing testing shall be discounted \$10.00 each.

Tuition Fee: Tuition shall be charged on an incremental basis for up to four (4) children. This tuition is due monthly from September 1 to June 1. Any Family who otherwise qualifies for the program, but would not be able to participate due to financial strain should contact our office for tuition assistance information. See the current Fee Schedule for details of tuition payments.

FEE POLICY

Book Fees: Book fees vary with the needs of each family. Each family will be charged our cost for their books plus postage and handling. Books may later be sold back to the school on consignment.

Extra Fees: Extra fees may be charged for additional expenses incurred. This might include a nominal fee for a special field trip or event. It also might include a legal fee if necessary to protect the church school-at-home opportunity. At this time, there are no planned extra fees.

For Calendar

Application Fee: Each family applying for the program shall pay a one-time \$45.00 non-refundable application fee.

Program Development Fee: There is a program development fee for first year families. This one-time \$24.00 fee is due with the submission of the organizational paper-work given out after acceptance into our program. Besides the extra administrative costs, this fee also includes the extra home visit given to first year families.

Enrollment Fee: A non-refundable enrollment fee of \$25.00 is due for each student enrolled in our program. This fee covers testing and curriculum development for each child. Children not needing testing shall be discounted \$10.00 each.

Tuition Fee: Tuition shall be charged on an incremental basis for up to four (4) children. This tuition is due monthly from September 1 to June 1. Any family who other-wise qualifies for the program, but would not be able to participate due to financial strain should contact our office for tuition assistance information. See the current fee schedule for details of tuition payments.
