I understand that you are in favor of refusing to allow the budget requests of the C.R.L.A. for the coming year. I wish to express my whole hearted support of this stand.

The activities of this group in the Marysville-Yuba City area has been one of harassment rather than assistance in solving the complicated social problems that we face.

They were prominent in the protest march on the Sutter Co. welfare office last year. The inflammatory literature the "starving" farm worker demonstrators passed out reportedly came from their Marysville office. One of the C.R.L.A. lawyers and his wife were the guiding light of this group and were closely associated with the Mexican- American woman who posed as the "leader" of this "starving assembly". In case you are interested this woman weighed at least 200 pounds. Pictures of this well fed group are available if needed, including the tots five and six years old, and the high school kids imported from Sacramento.

Their last achievement has been their attempt to break down the efforts of our High School administration to control the racial incidents that have flared up this fall. Most of the details have been reported in the local paper. One item that was not reported is the fact that a C.R.L.A. lawyer escorted the black, that had been suspended for breaking the jaw of a white student in two places, back onto the campus. This act forced the high school administration to refuse re-admission or admit defeat. The high school authorities stood firm and C.R.L.A. has started a damage suit because the school has "deprived the plaintiff of his right to an education".

This group is not contributing anything constructive in our area and I can see no reason why we should not use the tax money they request to better advantage. Pledging my continued support of your efforts to solve our tax problems I remain


According to the newspapers you are about to make a decision as to whether the California Rural Legal Assistance organization should receive an eight million dollar budget for the coming year.

Sir:

We have been reading a great deal in the newspapers about the pros and cons of the office of the California Rural Legal Assistance.

We feel the intent of the program was to help the poor in need of legal assistance. However, in reading accounts of various activities of the attorneys and cases that are in court, raises a question; is the original intent of the program being carried out?

Just recently, on our local level, we were faced with the situation of the CRLA attorneys taking to court a case against our district involving the suspension of a student. The administration very definitely had records of incidents and reasons for the suspension. If the CRLA attorneys had been interested in the welfare of the student, I believe, they could have reviewed the records and plainly seen the administration had made repeated attempts to help the student without any cooperation on the part of the student or guardian and settled the matter without the cost of going to court.

The fact that this particular case was forced into court leads me to question the reasons behind this action. Surely, not under the pretense of trying to help the student. Help him to do what, resist and defy rules and regulations that are made for the benefit and protection of all of us.

Our neighboring school district is also involved in a similar case involving dress code, is this really a benefit to the student or does it merely increase his attitude of resistance and defiance to society and the world around him; to have the CRLA come in help him resist school rules and regulations.
