I do hope you receive this note!

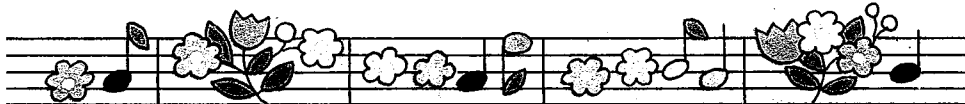
