This only exact copy of the famous canvas measuring 21 by 12 feet, painted by Emanuel Leutze in 1851, was executed by Robert B. Williams in 1969 (when the original was returned to the Metropolitan Museum of Art at its request.) On display in the Memorial Building at Washington Crossing Historic Park, Pennsylvania, the painting is on loan from the Washington Crossing Foundation and is viewed annually by more than 250,000 visitors, who come to admire America's best known historical painting.
