Dear Senator Baker;

For some years I have sorrowed that we no longer have great statesmen in the United States who put their country first rather than the political gains they may selfishly enjoy in their re-elections to Congress with all the built-in freebies the citizens of this country are denied. I have been increasingly discouraged with the burgeoning power of bureaucracy in Washington at the expense of the American people, because politicians, not statesmen, govern us.

I need not remind you what Mr. James Madison, a modest unassuming man, who was one of our great Presidents, stated in "The Federalist Papers": " It may be a reflection on human nature, that such devices (constitutions) should be necessary to control the abuses of government. But what is government itself, but the greatest of all reflections on human nature. If men were angels, no government would be necessary. If angels were to govern men, neither external or internal controls on government would be necessary. In framing a government which is to be administered by men over men, the great difficulty lies in this: you must first enable the government to control the governed; and in the next place oblige it to control itself. A dependence on the people is, no doubt, the primary control on the government; but experience has taught mankind the necessity of auxilliary precautions," Would you agree with me, Senator Baker, that two hundred years later Mr. Madison's statements are still a Delphic oracle?

While I have been a firm supporter of President Reagan, I have had the feeling he has been badly advised on many occasions during his presidency. In your acceptance of the position as his adviser you have risen above our petty bi-partisan government of today. At long last Iam assured that we have a statesman in you, Senator Baker. Once again America may re-establish itself as one of the greatest Nations because you have shown yourself to be the statesman we have needed for so long. May I congratulate you and say, in ending, that you will be a great President, too, in the near future of our country, God willing. With all best wishes for your success in your present position of endeavours to keep the office of the President firmly on track.
