As President of the Thomas Alva Edison Foundation, I am requesting your assistance in gaining President Reagan's support for the International Edison Birthday Celebration - Edison Sciences and Engineering Worth Day Program

The Birthday Celebration also calls attention to the nearly 200 Edison Science and Engineering Youth Day programs in existence throughout the United States, as well as those taking place in numerous other nations. The Youth Day programs, which feature visits by science students and their teachers to research and development laboratories and industrial plants in their local communities, stimulates a closer working relationship between the schools and industry for the benefit of the community and, ultimately, the nation.

We sincerely hope you agree that our 1981 program is worthy of President Reagan's endorsement.
