ENERGY PLANS Hodel: 1 minimal fed. control (2) balanced/mixed energy options oil, gas, coal, nuclear/renewables (hydro, solon, geothernal, etc)/conservation (effic, savings)
coal: 90% of coal prod'd is used domestically; 10% exported Clark: Linoures Report rec'd = have revamped system to make sure we get FAV on leaves = expect moratorium will be ended soon = overall decline in US coal exports: agreemt up Nakasone is key step Hodel: do not believe muke ind. is dead or even dying - one reason for decline is that growth in elect. demand is only 390/yr = cancellation of coal plants is wheat of nuclear - no quick fixes avail. - problems incl. public perception - are prop's to intro. a reg reform act to out time for bldg new plants from nearly 14 yrs to 7 yrs. (also sugg to put finite time on decis to OK plants) NR: (legis) is that unlikely to get bill this yr; looks ox in 5, but less good in H= - new NRC apptint will also be key RENEWABLES = now 8/2 % of energy needs; could be 10% by 2000 CONSERY: trend lines very good here GAS, OIL = NEPA; effort county - don't hear disc of windfall profet tax on gas dereg anymore not replacing vil as rapidly as it's depleted SPR = 390 m bol (100 m when PCR wang)
