SUBJECT: POTENTIAL PRESIDENTIAL RESIDENCES IN GENEVA

The Special Mission identified two outstanding residences.

Today I was informed by the U.S. Mission in Geneva that the Rothschild Villa may also be available. The Special Mission was not permitted to survey the Rothschild Villa because we were informed by Swiss authorities it would be undergoing renovation between September and December and the family was not interested in making the villa available. U.S. Mission personnel have informed me that in their opinion the Rothschild Villa is the most suitable. When I return to Geneva we will survey and analyze its potential.

Chateau de Bellerive is the stately rustic residence of the Prince and Princess Sadruddin Aga Khan which dates from the 12th Century and has been owned by the family since 1956. It is located in the town of Collonge-Bellerive, 4 miles from the center of Geneva (12 minutes in non-rush hours), along the "left" side of Lake Geneva (i.e. the side across from where the Swiss want us). The property consists of six acres, beautifully arranged and landscaped. The Chateau consists of five living and sitting rooms and eight bedrooms, most with private baths. There is a movie room, a tennis court, boat dock and an adjacent field which could be used as a helicopter landing zone. It is furnished in a traditional style, some rooms reflecting the family's islamic heritage.

Eisenhower (Pometta-Firmenich) Villa is a traditional-looking villa, dating from the 18th Century, was used by President Eisenhower in 1955 for the Geneva Summit. It is located along the "right" side of Lake Geneva four miles from the center of Geneva and 1-1/2 miles from the U.S. Mission. The property has six acres and is well cared for. It has two living and sitting rooms and eight bedrooms, four of which have private baths (four bedrooms on a seperate third floor). In addition, there is another residence immediately adjacent to the villa which is slightly larger, less elegant, than the villa and is occupied by the owner of the property who would consider letting us use his residence as well. (This would be ideal for you, Bud and other necessary support staff, insuring the President and Mrs. Reagan's maximum privacy yet your immediate proximity.)

The owners are Dr. and Mrs. Daniel Pometta, she being from the Firmenich family which had originally owned the property. Dr. Pometta is a Professor of Internal Medicine at the University/Cantonal Hospital of Geneva. The Firmenich family are the proprietors of a lucrative perfume manufacturing business. Current tenant of the villa is the family of Prince Karim Al Hussein Aga Khan IV, a nephew of Prince Sadruddin Aga Khan.

In summary, as I reported yesterday, I am confident that whichever residence is chosen, the President and Mrs. Reagan will be comfortable and residing in a facility that compares favorably with other residences they have stayed in overseas.

Attached is a proposed summary schedule.

FOREWARD

On Wednesday, August 14, 1985, The United States will celebrate "Peace in the Pacific Day," in commemoration of the day World War II ended and four decades of peace and friendship between America and Japan began. The event will take place on the deck of the aircraft carrier USS Enterprise, in the San Francisco Bay.

It has been proposed that President Reagan attend this event. Therefore, a pre-advance team traveled to San Francisco last week to survey the possibilities for such a trip. In light of The President's recent surgery, a medic was included as part of the pre-advance team. Special consideration was taken to insure The President's comfortable recovery from that operation.

With the President's recuperation in mind, attached are two alternate schedules. Option A includes all the activities in which it has been proposed The President take part. Option B is an abbreviated schedule which eliminates close to an hour of combined standing and walking time for The President. It is our sense that a dignified and appropriate ceremony can be held above deck and that The President need not take part in those activities below deck.

It is our recommendation, after careful consideration and discussion, that The President's participation in this event be the more limited and shorter Option B. As shown in attachment A, this plan would cut the standing time from 50 minutes to 15; the walking time from 40 minutes to 15 minutes.

It is understood that the question of whether or not The President actually attends this event is undecided at this time, and that it is possible that The Vice President may attend instead. Due to the more extensive planning, communications, security and logistical requirements for The President, the earliest possible decision is requested on this issue.

EVENT CONCEPT

The President and Mrs. Reagan will participate in a ceremony on the flight deck of the aircraft carrier, which will include a "pass and review" of six ships and a submarine, including the USS New Jersey and the USS Arkansas; approximately 10 minutes of remarks; and, a wreath-casting ceremony as a "Tribute to the Fallen" of World War II.

At the conclusion of the ceremony two options are possible. Under option A, The President and Mrs. Reagan proceed below to the Flag Cabin. It is proposed that while the press is taken off the ship by helicopter to file in Alameda, The President and Mrs. Reagan participate in an event with a small group of enlisted personnel. At the conclusion of this event, The President and Mrs. Reagan move to Wardroom II for a reception with Medal of Honor winners from World War II. At the conclusion of the reception, The President and Mrs. Reagan return to the Rancho del Cielo, arriving at approximately 4:10 p.m.

Under option B, The President and Mrs. Reagan depart The USS Enterprise at the conclusion of the ceremony on the flight deck. This option would return The President and Mrs. Reagan to Rancho Del Cielo at approximately 3:25 p.m.
