Let's remember -- the Soviets are tough, single-minded and possess an arsenal more than capable of killing millions of people. We cannot base our security against that arsenal on the <a href="https://www.more.not.org/hope.not.org/">https://www.more.not.org/</a> we must pursue agreements that <a href="insure">insure</a> it cannot be used.

Accordingly we must be as tough and as patient as they are.

Now I know there are a lot of "quick-draw" critics who want to blame the United States and the President for not getting an agreement. They are the same people who less than two years ago were saying there wouldn't ever be a summit.

Iceland was not the last chapter in the book on arms control, it was just the next chapter. We are continuing our efforts to secure real arms control. I believe there is every reason for optimism. We should not be discouraged because there is no quick fix, but we should be encouraged we have moved so far on these very difficult issues.

I think the first thing that is important to do is put these talks and what occurred into perspective. You will recall a week ago in announcing we were going to Iceland I said that we did not seek nor did we expect agreements. We described our trip as a "base camp to the summit" to be held here in the United States.

If there was a suprise in Reykjavik, it was that we discussed so much and moved so far. No one a week ago would have thought there could have been agreement in so many areas. While we did not sign a document and there remained significant differences, we must not mistake the absence of a final agreement for the absence of progress. Historic gains were achived.

10/14/80

Last week I described Iceland as a base camp on our way to the summit. This week, I want to report to you that I believe we have an excellent chance to plant a permanant flag of peace at that summit. I call on the Soviets to not miss this opportunity. Do not slip down the slope that leads to greater arms buildup. Don't mistake the absence of an agreement for the absence of progress. Progress was made.
