federal judge in D. C. Circuit Court of Appeals

This is to report that, based on my personal observation from a very good vantage point, I strongly support Nino Scalia for the above position.

During 1974, 1975, and 1976, Nino Scalia was Assistant Attorney General in charge of the Office of Legal Counsel. During the same period, I was an attorney in the Office of Legal Counsel and Chairman of the Justice Department's Freedom of Information Committee. The period in question was one that involved many matters of great complexity and high stress, with which Nino and I had to cope. These matters included the 1974 FOIA amendments which were passed over President Ford's veto, and the explosive growth of FOIA activity affecting the CIA, FBI, and other federal agencies.

Based upon this experience, plus my observation of other heads of OLC who are now in federal judicial office, I am confident that Nino Scalia has in pre-eminent degree those personal qualities of intellect, industry, experience, and temperament which qualify him for superior public service as a federal appellate judge.

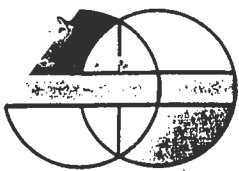

Prior to joining the faculty at the University of Chicago, he was a Resident Scholar, American Enterprise Institute, 1977; a Visiting Professor, Georgetown University Law School, 1977; an Assistant Attorney General, Office of Legal Counsel, U.S. Department of Justice, 1974-1977; Chairman, Administrative Conference of the United States, 1972-1974; General Counsel, Office of Telecommunications, Executive Office of the President, 1971-1972; a member of the Summer Faculty, Office of Hearing Examiners, U.S. Civil Service Commission, 1970; a Professor of Law, University of Virginia Law School, 1967-1971; a Sheldon Fellow at Harvard University, 1960-1961; and an Associate, Jones, Day, Cockley & Reavis, 1960-1967. Mr. Scalia attended Georgetown University from 1953 to 1957 when he received an A.B. degree. He attended the University of Fribourg, Fribourg, Switzerland from 1955 to 1956. He attended Harvard Law School from 1957 to 1960 when he received his LL.B. degree. He was admitted to the Ohio State Bar in 1962. He is 46 years old, married and has nine children.






