SUBJECT: Secretary Weinberger - Part 2

I just spoke to Arthur Liman at 2:25 P.M. Liman is beseeching Secretary Weinberger's cooperation. The Meese testimony is clearly taking longer than anticipated due to John Nield's slow pace. Liman's best guess is that the Committees could begin Secretary Weinberger's testimony on Friday (after Don Regan), and that there would be great pressure to finish Friday but it could very well extend until Monday (which the Secretary is resisting). This schedule is obviously dependent upon how long Don Regan's testimony extends (Arthur hopes one day only).

The other alternative would be for Secretary Weinberger to agree to begin his testimony some time on Thursday (after Meese finishes) and finish on Friday, with Don Regan being the final open session witness on Monday.

Arthur emphasized that the Committees will do the best they can to end the hearings on Friday or Monday and thereby eliminate the opportunity of having additional witnesses being called.
