Thank you very much for expressing your support for my efforts in opposition to public policies which classify individuals by race and ethnic background. Racial or ethnic quotas (which I find indistinguishable from most so-called affirmative action programs) represent a retreat from the traditional commitment of this nation to equal opportunity for all citizens without regard to race or color or ethnic background. The Constitution, in my view, is a color-blind document and does not permit public officials to establish programs and benefits that make distinctions among individuals on account of such factors as an individual's race or color.


As you know, during the 97th Congress, the Senate Judiciary Constitution Subcommittee, on which I serve as Chairman, held the most complete and extensive hearings on this matter. I believe there are few issues that are more important to defining ourselves as a nation than the question of whether or not to tolerate (or promote) racial or ethnic quotas in employment, admissions, housing, voting, etc. At the present time, however, no further hearings are planned. If future hearings take place, I will notify you promptly should we be in a position to invite you to testify, as I am sure your expertise and experience with affirmative action programs would be a valuable contribution to this hearing process.
