

Thank you very much for expressing your support for my efforts in opposition to public policies which classify individuals by race and echnic background. Racial or ethnic quotas which I find indistinguishable from most so cauled affirmative action' programs) represent a retreat from the straditional commitment of this nation to equal opportunity for all citizens without regard to race or color or ethnic background. The Constitution, in my view, is a color-blind document and does not permit making observables to establish programs and benefits that make distinctions among individuals by account of such factors as an individual a king offer.

Constitution Subcommittee, on which I serve as Chairman held the most complete and extensive hearings on this metter. I believe there are few issues that are more important to defaning ourselves as a nation than the question of whether or not to tolerate (or promote) racial or ethnic quotas in employment, admissions, housing, voting, etc. At the present time, however, no further hearings are planned. 
