You have asked for our views on a proposed message from the President, congratulating the managing director of Federal Finance and Securities, Ltd., of Great Britain, for launching a unit investment trust comprised of GNMA mortgage-backed securities. The message should not be sent.

The Waverly Asset Management GNMA Unit Investment Trust is clearly a commercial enterprise, and as you know White House policy precludes Presidential endorsement of such commercial enterprises. Under no circumstances should the President be put in the position of endorsing a particular offering in the securities area, whether here or abroad.



You know better than anyone that when the earthquake struck Mexico, visiting death and disaster on so many men, women, and children, Americans responded without hesitation and with an open-hearted generosity that should make all of us proud.
