10/19 TRANSBORD III Meeting

Highlights of yesterday's TRANSBORD III meeting were as follows:

- -- The scenario to be used for this joint counterterrorism/emergency management exercise with Canada is: a chemical barge is highjacked by terrorists along the international boundary in the St. Lawrence waterway, continues en route to Detroit/Windsor, and ultimately explodes with potential for large loss of life. The exercise is limited to the communications (no acting out on the scene) between federal, state/provincial, and local authorities in the US and Canada. It is designed to provide experience in joint response to and management of terrorist incidents and post-incident activities (including public and media relations), and will involve a wide variety of federal agencies.
- -- The exercise will be held June 20-23, 1989, preceded by run-up exercises on December 13 (between Ottowa and Washington, communication checks and initial decision-making) and April 12 (similar exercise including state/provincial and local authorities). Both run-up sessions will last 4-5 hours.
- -- Exercise information is classified "for official use"; will be using radio communications in exercise and expect press to find out about it, but do not want it publicized any sooner or any more than necessary.
- -- Agency representatives participating in the exercise should not be involved in exercise planning, so that their responses will not be skewed by prior knowledge.

Mike Jakub (S/CT) seems to be the key US coordinator for this exercise. David Davidson and Jim Armit of the Canadian Solicitor General's office took the lead yesterday on their side. Attached are the relevent handouts from the meeting.
