Chronology of Provisional Irish Republican Army Out-of-Area Attacks
(U)

- 1973 Two bombs exploded at British school and "Globe" cinema in Rheindahlen, West Germany. A third bomb was found in car trunk at British Commissary parking lot.
- 1974 Bombs killed 22 in two Birmingham, England public houses.
- August 1978 Eight explosions occurred at 17 British Army barracks in West Germany, including Moenchengladbach during one weekend.
- July 1979 British Army barracks was bombed in Dortmund, West Germany.
- February 1980 British Colonel murdered in Bielefeld, West Germany.
- December 1983 A carbomb outside Harrod's department store in London killed six--including one American--and injured 100.
- 12 October 1984 Bomb exploded in hotel in Brighton, southern England, where Prime Minister Thatcher and her Cabinet were staying during the annual Conservative

Party conference. Five were killed; 34 injured.

23 March 1987

Carbomb exploded at joint Officers' Mess at Rheindahlen, West Germany--location of British joint headquarters and two NATO headquarters. No injuries.

27 March 1987

Two Molotov cocktails were hurled at British military tractor-trailer carrying "Puma" helicopter in Hamburg, West Germany. Incident inspired by PIRA.

31 March 1987

Bomb injured 31 West Germans at NATO Officers' Club, near Duesseldorf. Attackers assumed only British would be present.

23 April 1987

Six letter bombs were sent to the homes of prominent members of the Thatcher Government. Police defused the bombs; there were no injuries.

6 March 1988

Possible carbomb attack thwarted in Gibraltar.

1 May 1988

Carbombing in Niewbergen, Netherlands that killed two Royal Air Force servicemen and injured one.

1 May 1988

Shooting in Roermund, Netherlands that killed one British serviceman and injured two

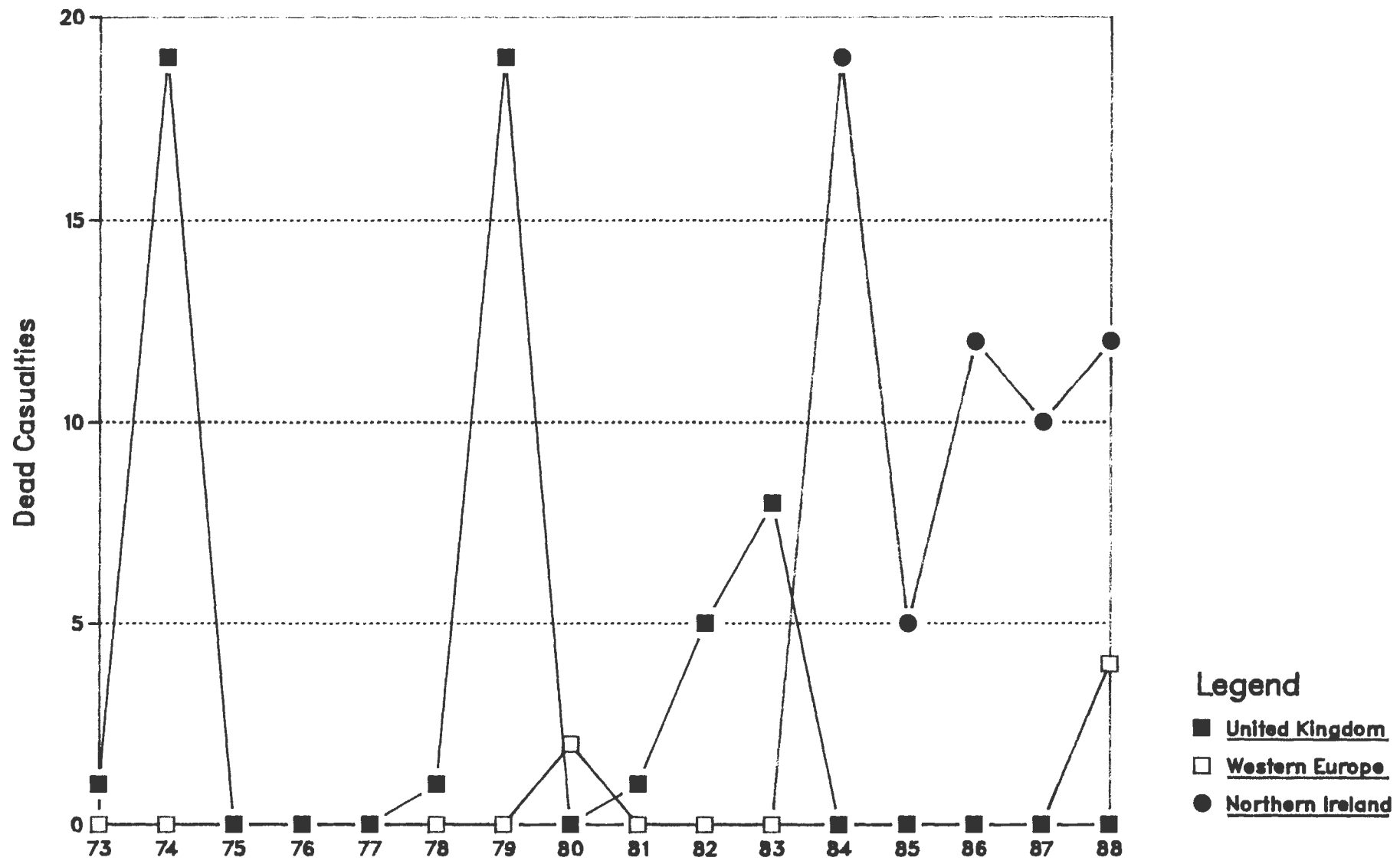

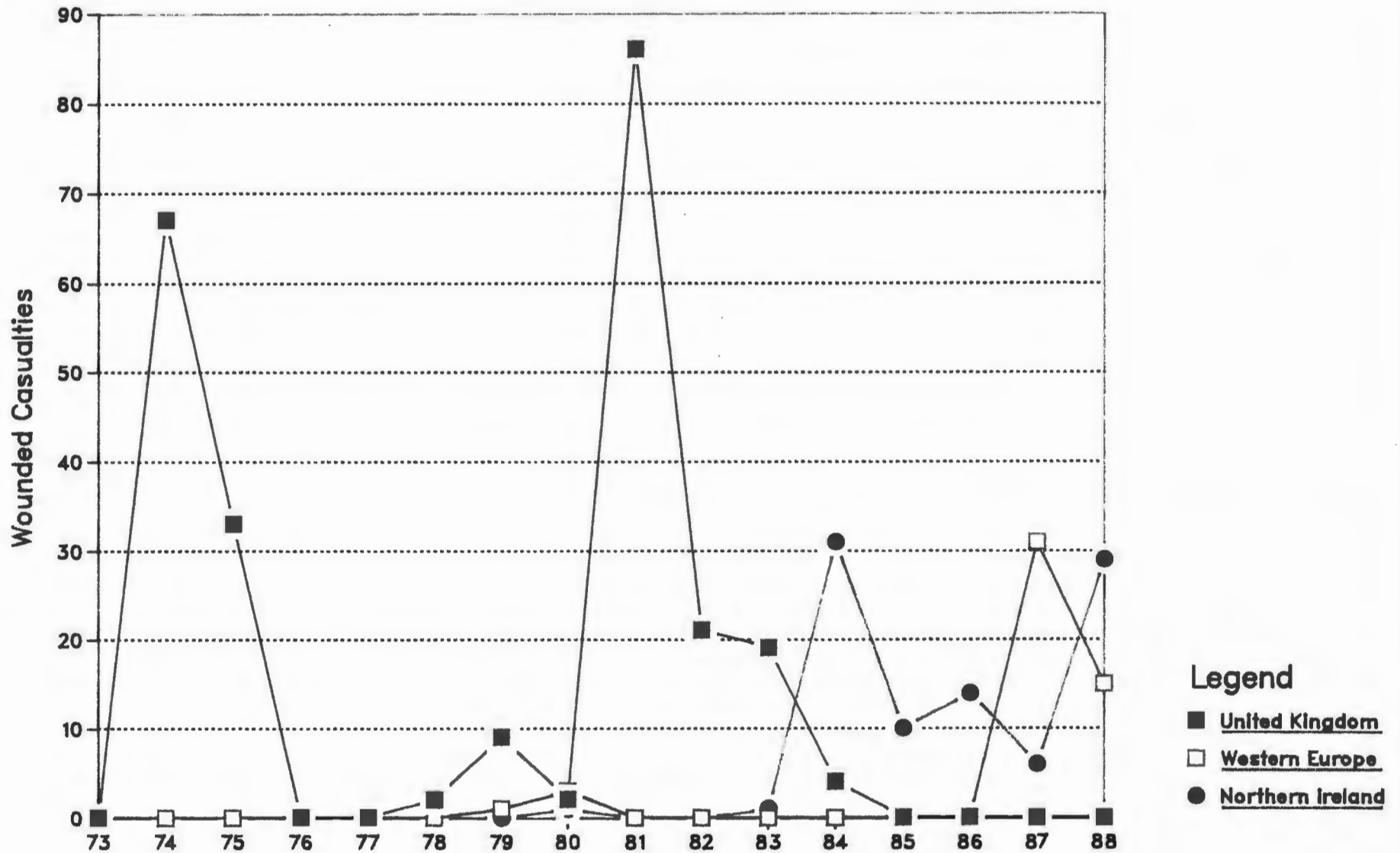
- 3 May 1988 Security officers defused carbomb at British Army's
Ripon Barracks in Bielefeld, West Germany.
- 13 July 1988 Nine British soldiers were injured when two bombs
exploded in their barracks in Duisburg, near
Duesseldorf.
- 1 August 1988 Bomb at British Army barracks in north London
killed one soldier and injured 10 other bystanders.
- 5 August 1988 Bomb injured four in explosion at British Army
barracks in Rathingen district of Duesseldorf.
- 13 August 1988 One British soldier was shot to death at traffic
light in Ostend, Belgium.

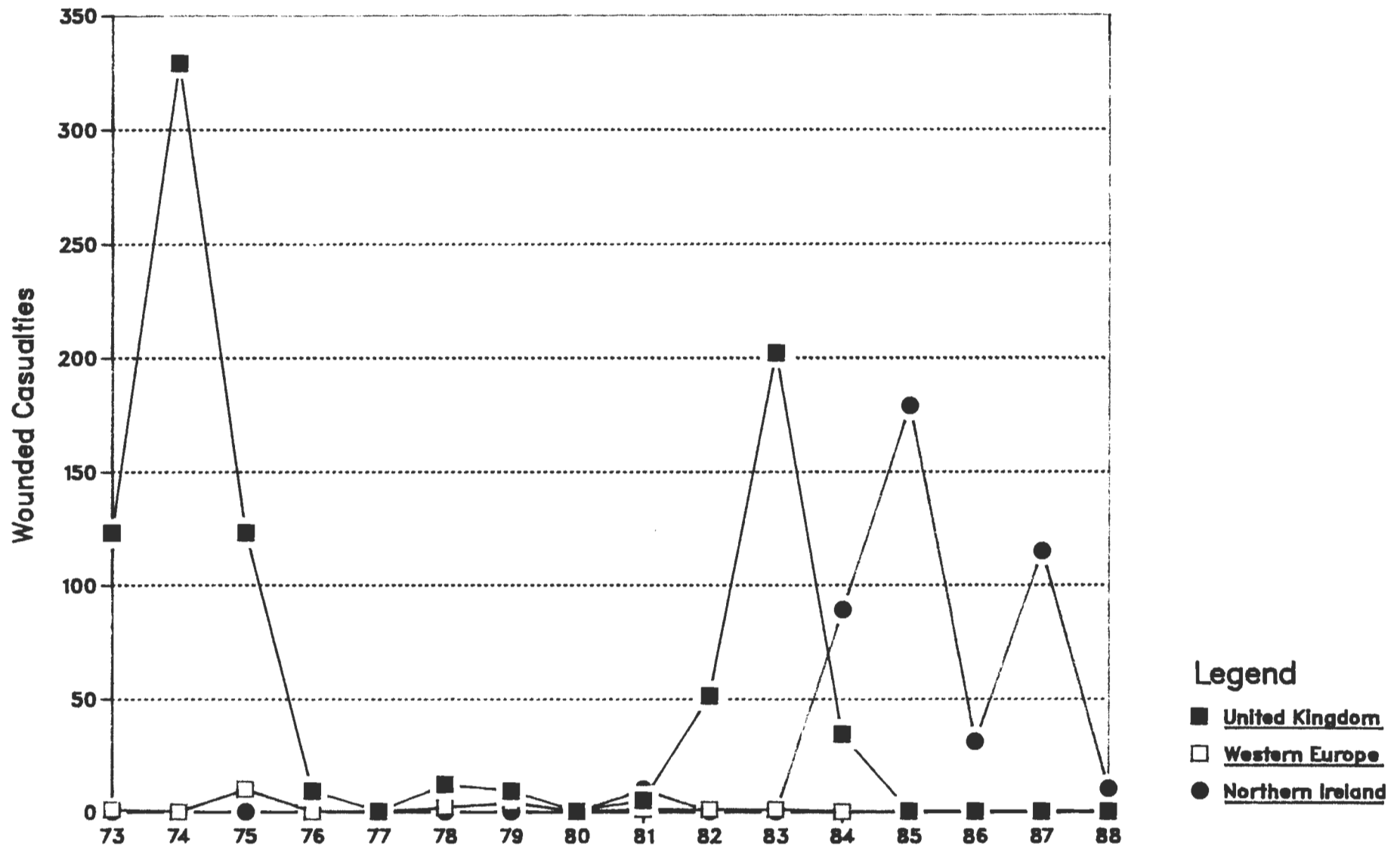
Casualties: PIRA Attacks Against Military International and Domestic, 1973 - 88



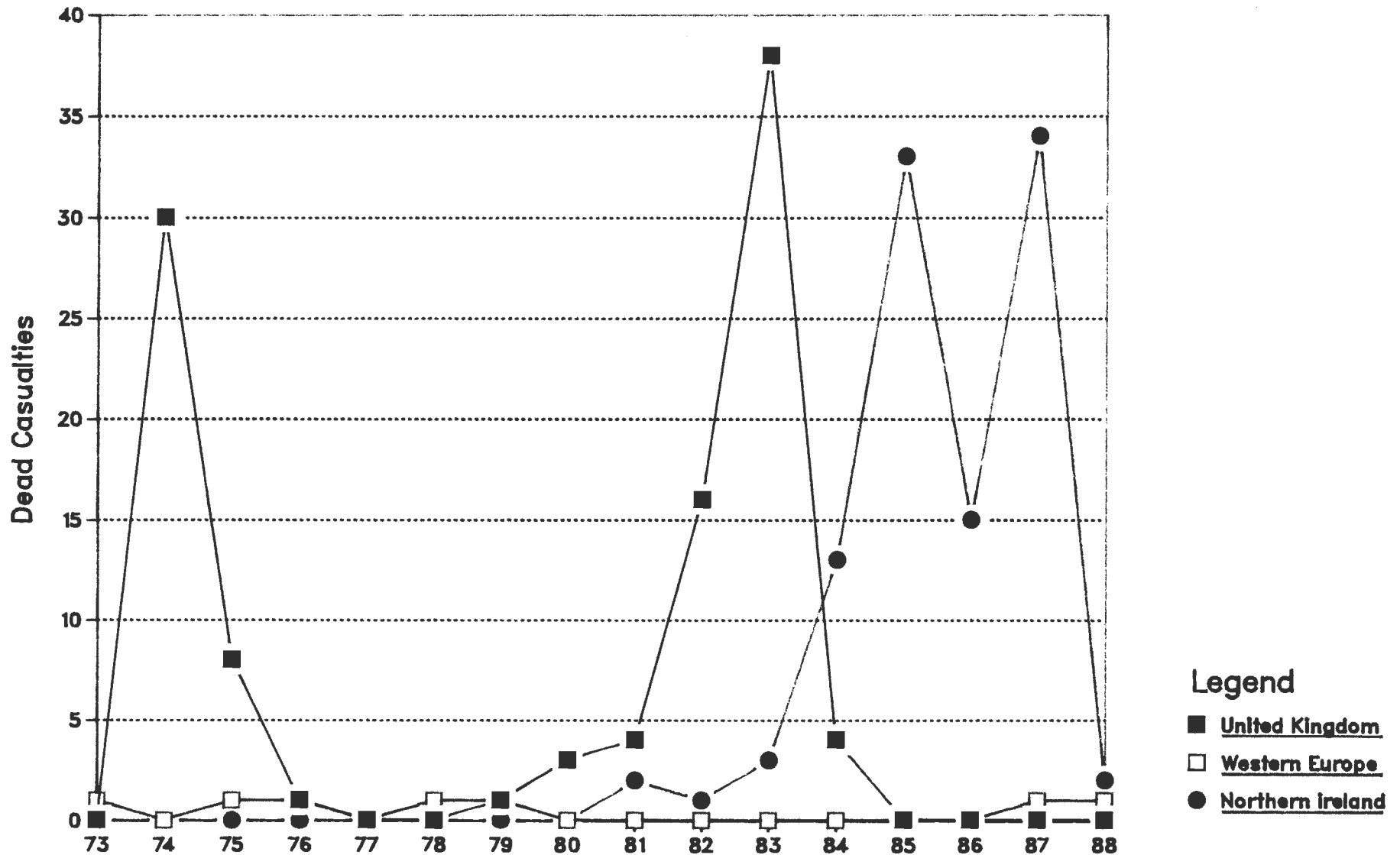
Casualties: PIRA Attacks Against Military International and Domestic, 1973 – 88



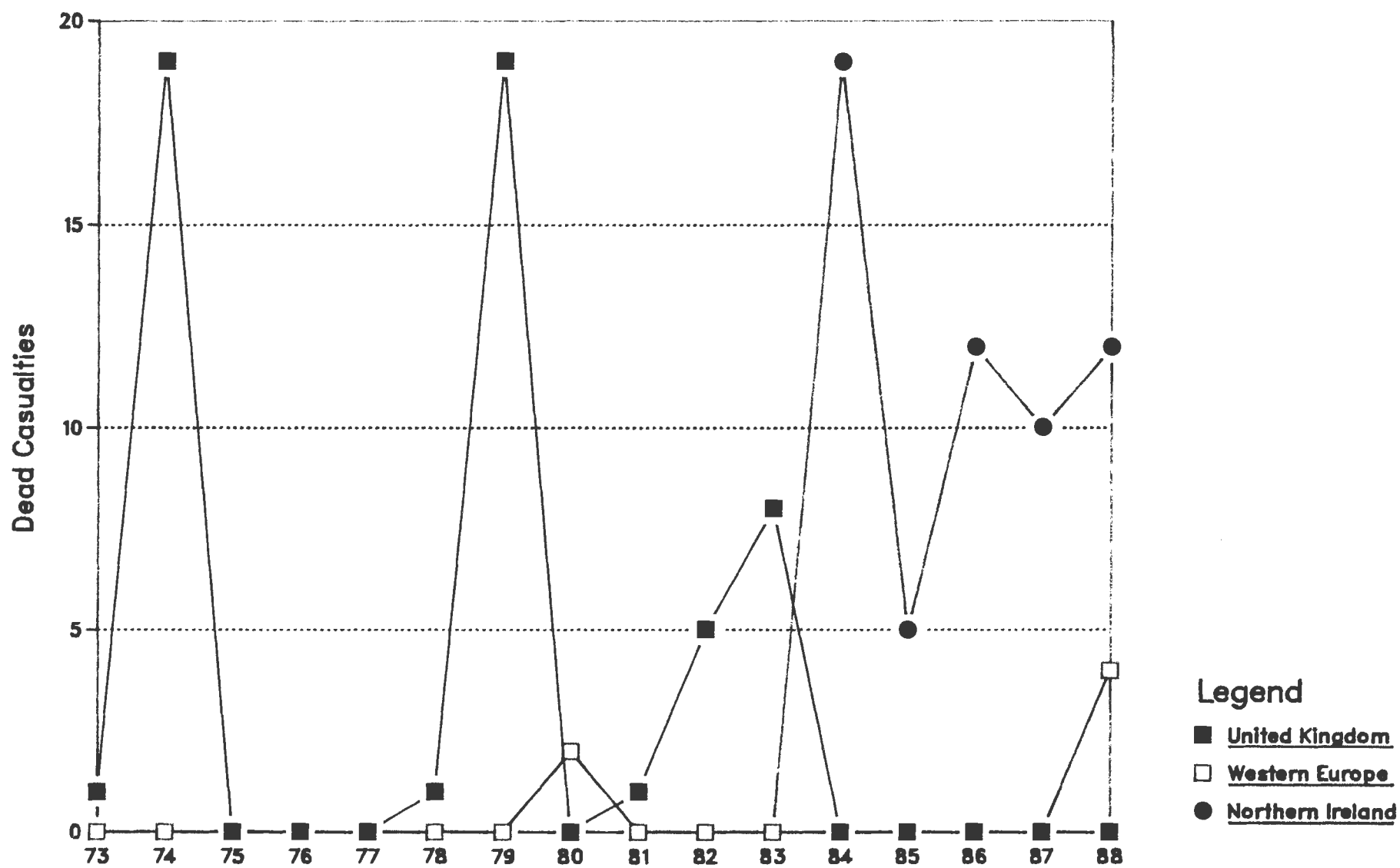
Casualties: PIRA Attacks Against Non-Military International and Domestic, 1973 - 88



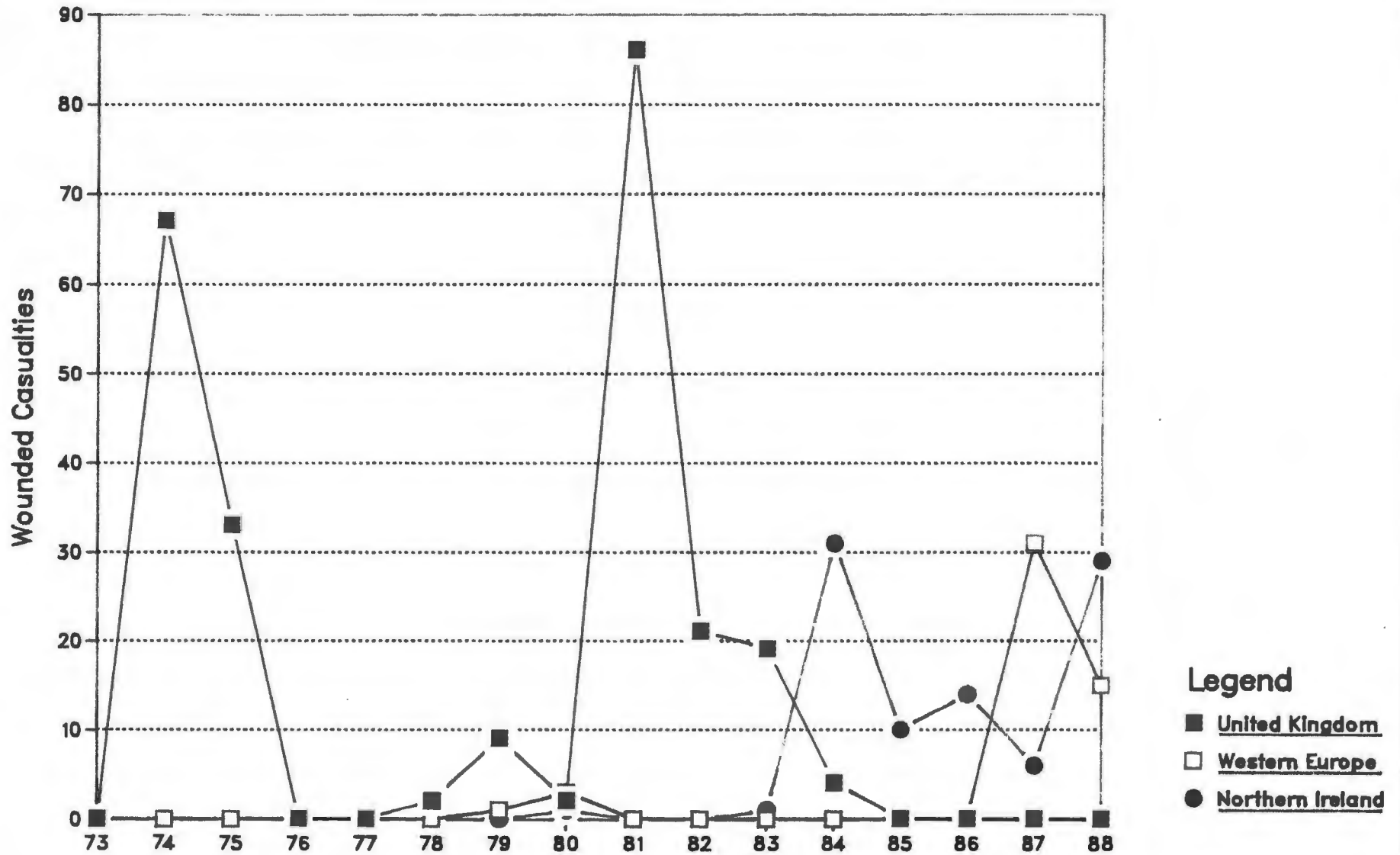
Casualties: PIRA Attacks Against Non-Military International and Domestic, 1973 - 88



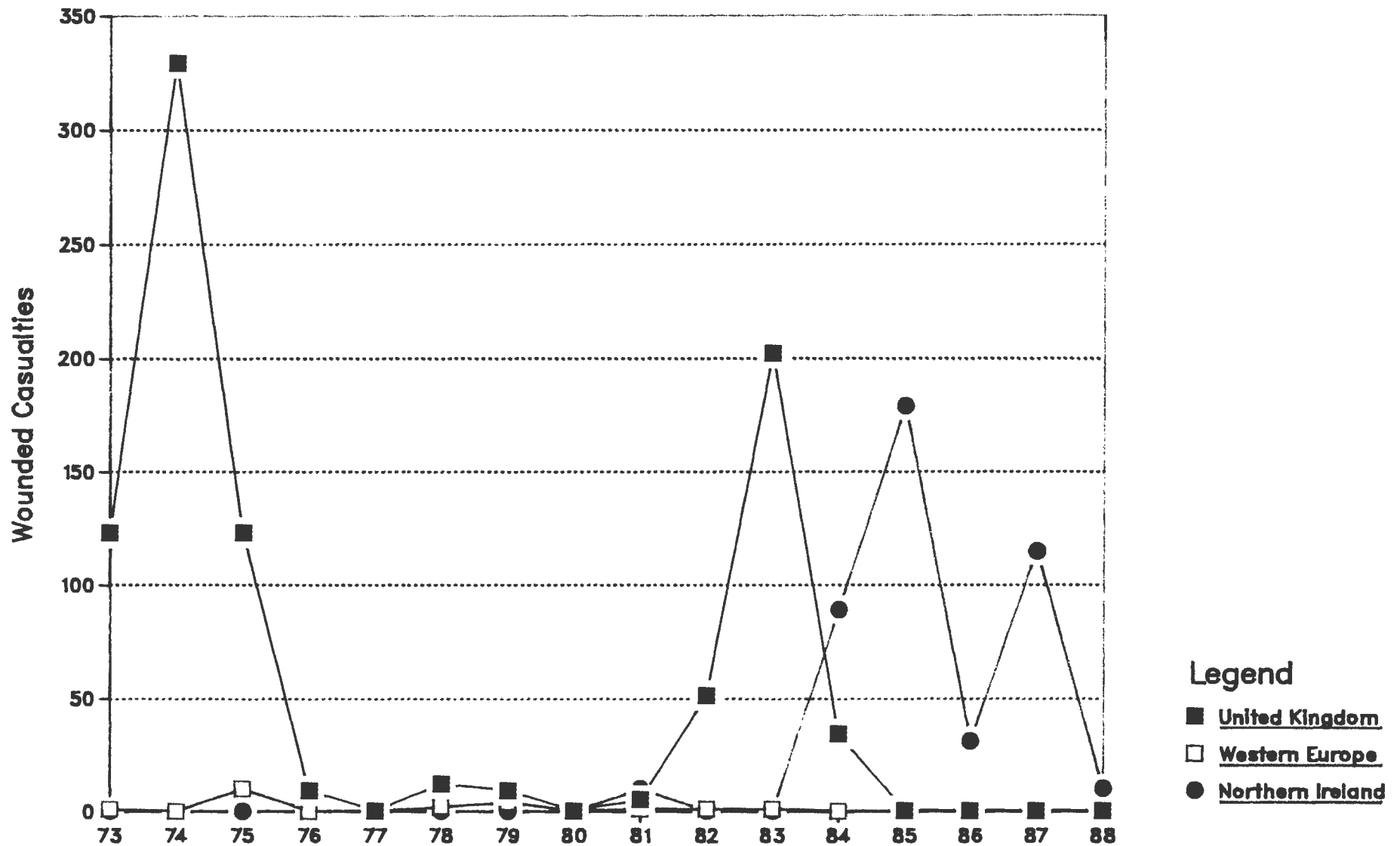

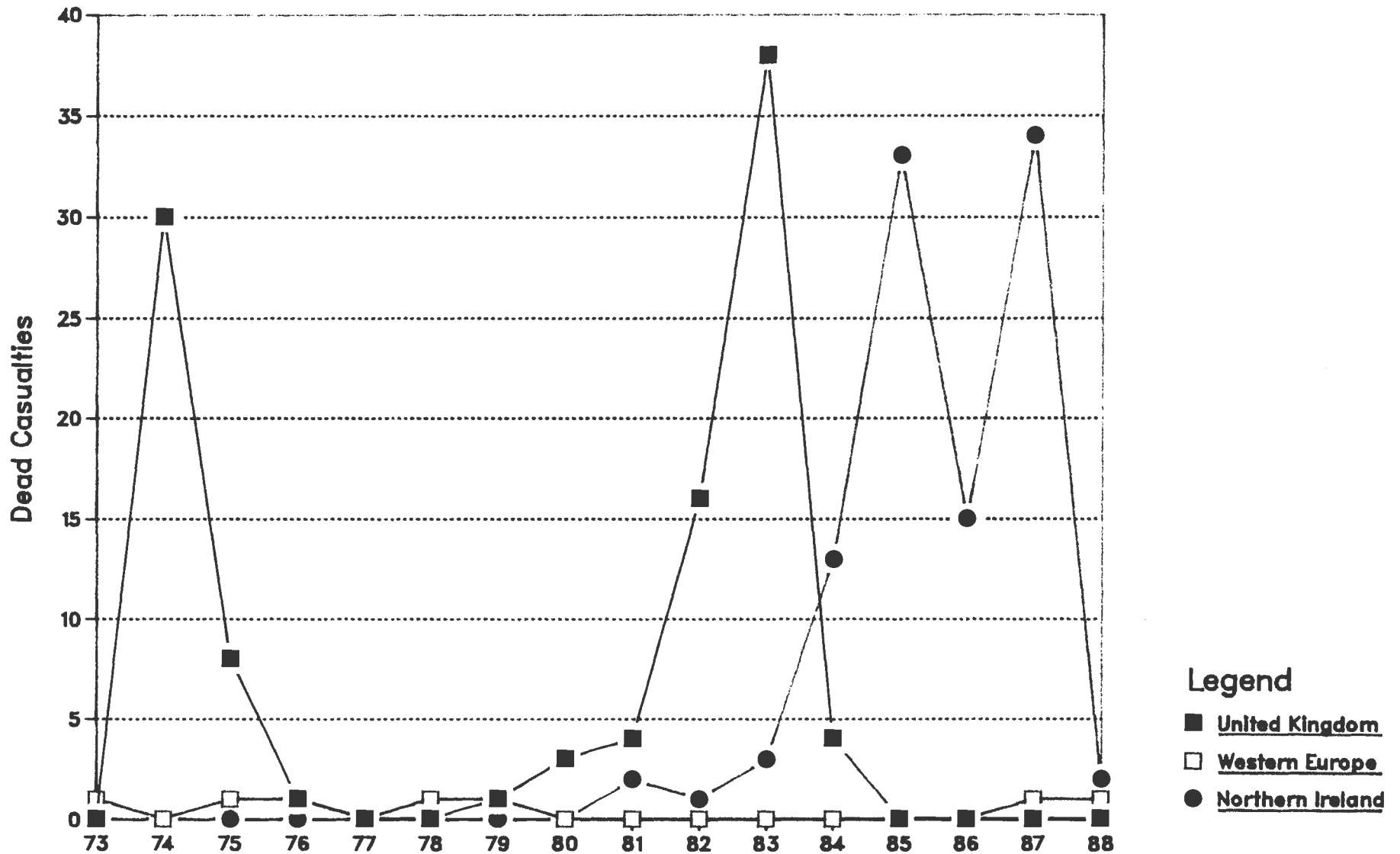
Casualties: PIRA Attacks Against Military International and Domestic, 1973 – 88
