In response to your request for a status report on the implementation of Recommendation 13 of the December, 1985 report of the Vice President's Task Force on Terrorism, I have been advised by the Assistant Secretary for Enforcement that this recommendation has been fully implemented. On May 1, 1986, the President, in NSDD-207, directed the Secretary of the Treasury to protect spouses of visiting heads of state. At that time, the U.S. Secret Service assumed responsibility for this mission from the Department of State and provides such protection when requested.

SUBJECT: Status of Action to Implement Recommendation
No. 1 of the Vice President's Task Force on
Combatting Terrorism (S)

Recommendation No. 1 of the Vice President's Task Force on Combatting Terrorism called for the establishment of a comprehensive listing of all the diverse elements and components of the national program for combatting terrorism. It was recommended that the NSC, in conjunction with OMB and the Departments of State and Justice, maintain this listing in a programming document. Subsequently, in NSDD 207, OMB was tasked to implement this recommendation of maintaining a national programming document that depicts resources dedicated to combatting terrorism. (S)

In response to this tasking, OMB staff:

- acquired and consolidated the data acquired by the Vice President's Task Force;
- coordinated with NSC staff an updated request for data on resources devoted to combatting terrorism in the President's 1987-91 Budget;
- issued on July 1, 1986 this request for data to all affected agencies through the OMB branches responsible for reviewing those agencies;
- received all agency responses by August 31, 1986; and
- incorporated this revised data in the national programming document. (S)

Thus, the current national programming document accurately reflects revised 1984-91 resources devoted to counterterrorism. Modifications and agency changes in the value and categorization of resources devoted to combatting terrorism are evident. (S)

I/R-87/S-141

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In 1987, OMB plans on reissuing this request for data to reflect updated resource information contained in the President's 1988-92 Budget. Coordination with the NSC and the Departments of State and Justice will be continued. All agencies cooperated fully in the 1986 request for data, and no difficulties in continuing to implement the Task Force's recommendation are anticipated. (S)
