DEAR MIKE:

I SUSPECT STRONGLY THAT YOU ARE INUNDED
WITH PEOPLE WANTING SOMETHING FROM YOU. RELAX,
I WANT NOTHING. TRUTHFULLY, THOUGH, I WAS
REAL DISAPPOINTED THAT YOU DID NOT ANSWER MY LETTER
TO YOU EARLIER LAST YEAR. SUCH IS LIFE & THAT'S ALL
BEHIND ME NOW.

MY REASON FOR WRITING HAS ONE PURPOSE:
I SERVED AS RR'S CHIEF OF CIVIL RIGHTS FOR
MANY YEARS. I TOOK THAT RESPONSIBILITY
SERIOUSLY; IN FACT THE DOCTORS TELL ME I
TOOK IN TOO SERIOUSLY. DURING MY TENURE
THERE, I WAS IN & OUT OF TROUBLE WITH MEMBERS
OF THE ADMINISTRATION; HOWEVER, NOT ONCE
WAS THE GOVERNOR EMBARRASSED WHILE I
WAS RUNNING FER. THAT PLACE WAS
A ZOO. YOU PEOPLE WERE GREAT TO ME
& I THINK I DID A JOB FOR ALL OF YOU.
MEETING PIER GHERINI WAS BY FAR THE
BEST THING THAT HAPPENED TO ME AT FER.
HE WAS A GREAT BOSS & HE TREATED
ME LIKE ONE OF HIS KIDS. WE STILL
STAY IN CONTACT & I TALKED TO PETE REZINARI.

AT FERC, MY JOB, BECAUSE OF THE NATURE OF THE LAW, WAS TO STAY CLOSE TO THE MINORITY LEGISLATORS, LABOR & CIVIL RIGHTS PEOPLE. I DID THEN & STILL HAVE CLOSE CONTACTS IN THAT AREA. MOST OF THEM WILL SAY PRIVATELY THAT THE REAL PEOPLE DID A GOOD JOB IN CIVIL RIGHTS.

NOW TO THE POINT: RECENTLY (WITHIN LAST TWO WEEKS) I HEARD THAT YOU & OTHERS ON THE WHITE HOUSE STAFF MET AT CAMP DAVID & ONE OF THE TOPICS DISCUSSED WAS RR'S LOW STANDING WITH BLACKS. EARLIER, I HEARD THE PRESIDENT RESPOND TO A QUESTION AT HIS NEWS CONFERENCE REGARDING BLACKS STATE THAT WHILE HE WAS GOVERNOR, HE APPOINTED MORE MINORITIES THAN ALL THE OTHER GOVERNORS COMBINED. FINE, BUT HE HAS NOT EVEN SCRATCHED THE SURFACE IN THIS AREA. EXAMPLES:

- 1) HE APPOINTED ROGER TAYLOR AS MY REPLACEMENT AT FERC. ROGER IS BLACK & IN THAT POSITION, HE HEADED CIVIL RIGHTS FOR THE GOVERNOR — A FIRST —
- 2) YOU PEOPLE LET US DO OUR JOB WITHOUT BUTTING IN. IN OTHER WORDS, NOT ONCE WAS HEAT EVER APPLIED TO ME REGARDING THE OUTCOME OF CASE OR INVESTIGATION
- 3) IT WAS THE GOVERNOR WHO SIGNED MAJOR AMENDMENTS TO THE FERA ACT SEX DISCRIMINATION & AGE DISCRIMINATION AMENDMENTS WERE SIGNED BY RR

4) THE GOVERNOR ^{RE} APPOINTED C.L. DELLUMS TO THE COMMISSION. CL IS A LEADING BLACK & THE UNCLE OF RON DELLUMS. THE BLACKS NEVER BELIEVED HE WOULD DO IT, BUT HE DID.

5) AT ONE TIME WE HAD HEAVY INVESTIGATIONS GOING AGAINST 11 MAJOR UTILITIES I.E. PG&E, PT&T SO COX GAS ETC. AS A RESULT, MANY MINORITIES & WOMEN WERE HIRED, PROMOTED ETC

6) AT THE SAME TIME WE HAD 28 POLICE & FIRE DEPT'S UNDER INVESTIGATION. WE DID OUR JOB

7) WELL, WE EVEN HAD THE LA TIMES UNDER INVESTIGATION. WE GOT ALONG WELL WITH ALL OF THEM BECAUSE, THANKS TO PIER, WE WENT THERE TO HELP NOT HURT. THEY ALL KNEW IT & WERE ALL VERY APPRECIATIVE. AND THE JOB GOT DONE VERY WELL

8) WE WORKED DAMN HARD WITH THE STATE PERSONNEL BOARD & HELPED MANY, BY ELIMINATING MANY REQUIREMENTS THAT WERE NOT NEEDED.

9) WE MORE THAN DOUBLED THE OUTPUT PER CONSULTANTS. THIS ACTION REALLY HELPED THE POOR.

107 LAST, OF COURSE IS THE FACT THAT WE MORE THAN DOUBLED THE NUMBER OF HOUSING (RUMFORD ACT) COMPLAINTS FILED WITH THE AGENCY. PEOPLE COULD NOT BELIEVE THE REAGAN PEOPLE WOULD DO IT, BUT WE DID.

ON THE NEGATIVE SIDE, I RAN A ZOO. I PROBABLY RECEIVED MORE PETITIONS THAN ANYONE IN GOVERNMENT. WE ALSO HAD MORE SHOOTINGS, DIVORCES, FIGHTS THAN ANY OTHER AGENCY IN GOVERNMENT BUT MINE THAT WAS CIVIL RIGHTS DURING THE LATE 60'S & 70'S.

I GUESS WHAT I AM SAYING IS THAT THE PRESIDENT DOES NOT HAVE TO TAKE A BACK SEAT TO ANYONE IN THE CIVIL RIGHTS AREA. WE DID EXACTLY WHAT HE ASKED OF US, I.E. "BE YOUR BROTHERS HELPER, NOT HIS ICEBERG."

I AM STILL ALIVE & DOING WELL, HEALTHWISE. I HAVE MY LAST MEDICAL APPOINTMENT TUESDAY IN SAN FRANCISCO. I GUESS I WAS THE ONLY ONE IN THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION WHO RECEIVED A JOB RELATED INJURY. IT SURE WAS A LONG HAUL BACK. THE DOCTORS SAY I HELD TO MUCH INSIDE ME REGARDING PAROLE CASES.

ALSO, QUITE POSSIBLY, I WAS TOO DAMN SENSITIVE FOR THAT WORK

ONE OTHER INVESTIGATION - REMEMBER WHEN WE MET WITH JACKSONS HUME AT BASIC UETS? HE SAID WE DID A GOOD INVESTIGATION OF HIS FIRM. HE WAS EXTREMELY FED UP WITH THE FEDS & RIGHTFULLY SO. MY POINT - YOU PEOPLE NEVER INTERFERED WITH THE INVESTIGATION.

THEY CLAIM THAT MY BEING AN ORPHAN AT AN EARLY AGE GAVE ME A STRONG SENSITIVITY ETC.

WHO KNOWS. ITS AMAZING, I WAS 6 WHEN MY MOTHER DIED & 7 WHEN MY DAD DIED. I WAS ALSO THE OLDEST OF 4 CHILDREN. WE ALL GOT SPLIT UP & YET, NONE OF US GOT INTO TROUBLE. WE ALL HAVE LARGE FAMILIES & NO DIVORCES. I SAW SO MANY CASES LIKE MINE WHILE ON THE PAROLE BOARD. THE ONLY DIFFERENCE BEING, THE MEANEYS ALWAYS WORKED & NEVER WENT TO JAIL — I'M GETTING CARRIED AWAY SO I WILL STOP WHILE I'M AHEAD

MIKE, ONE OTHER COMMENT: THE UNEMPLOYMENT SITUATION IS FOR REAL. AS AN EXAMPLE, DURING THE PAST 18 MONTHS, I HAVE BEEN OUT OF WORK 7 MONTHS. I HAVE MORE ENERGY THAN ANY TEN PEOPLE YOU KNOW & I'VE BEEN LAID OFF BY TWO COMPANIES. HIGH INTEREST RATES KILLED US THANK GOD MY WIFE GOT A JOB. THIS PERIOD HAS BEEN AN EXPERIENCE BUT I HAVE NO REGRETS. I'VE HAD 25 6000 OULS & THERE WILL BE BETTER DAYS WATCH ME AFTER I GET RELEASED FROM THE DOOR
