
Dear Mr. Deaver:

I wanted to write you to tell you that I think the President's press conference was great and in my view the very best. He answered his critics accurately, particularly about the necessity of press news about arms negotiations, such as the one about furnishing aid to private schools, answering that the parents of the children attending private schools pay taxes for public schools as well as tuition for private schools.

I was particularly glad in the opening part of his statement that he brought attention to Social Security, about which I talked to you. I know that unlawful beneficiaries and double payments must be eliminated and perhaps a special tax enacted in the future, as the fund will be bankrupt in several years. But for this year, before a means to finance the program can be worked out, I think the President's statement was clear and correct.

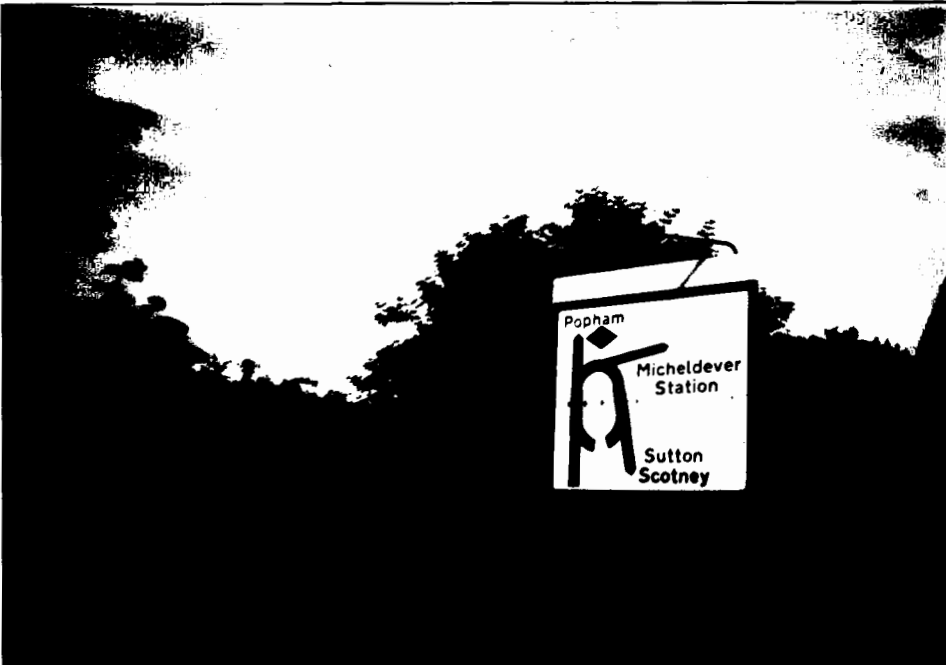


I am informed that the United States is to host the next international economic summit conference and that the President is considering holding the conference in the Western United States.
