

SUBJECT: Boards and Commissions

There are presently no vacancies on the American Battle Monuments Commission. We appointed all eleven members in January and they will serve out the length of the President's term.

Regarding the National Cancer Advisory Board, we previously appointed six members in June of 1982. However, there are six more vacancies in March of 1984. This is an 18 member Board with a six-year term.

Also, there is an upcoming vacancy on the President's Cancer Panel in February of 1983. This is a three member board which Armand Hammer chairs. The new member must, by law, be a distinguished scientist or physician.




