

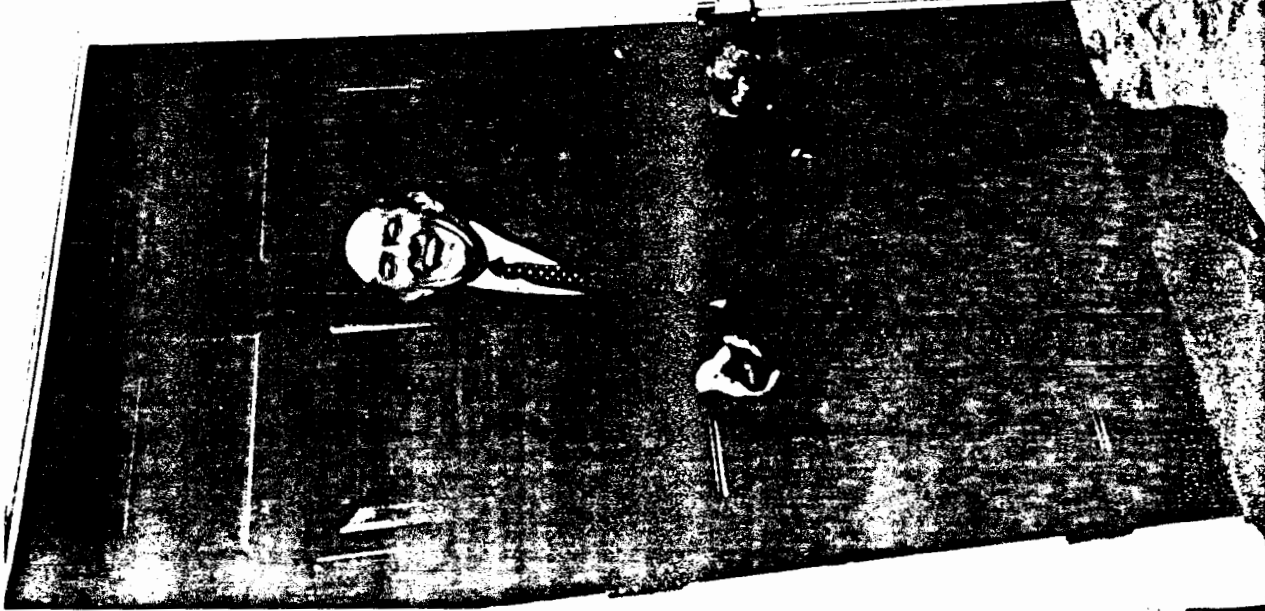

Scheduled reopening was October 18, 1982. A small special interest group prevailed on the FAA to postpone opening.

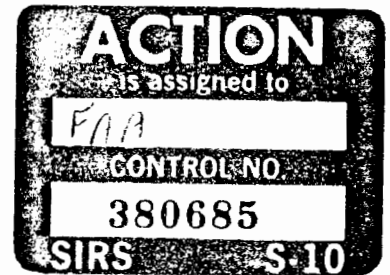
The users need and have requested the additional safety of air traffic control at Fox Field. The community and local industry support traffic control at Fox Field as a positive economic factor.

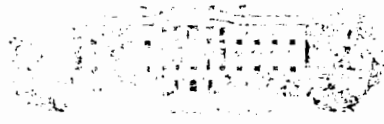

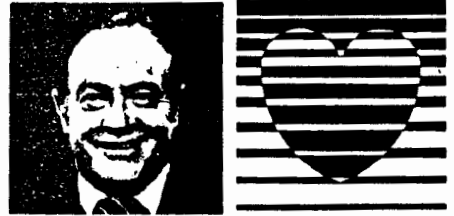
