

SUBJECT: PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION ON THE STUDY  
OF ETHICAL PROBLEMS IN MEDICINE AND  
BIOMEDICAL AND BEHAVIORAL RESEARCH

Bruce Jacobson who is a member of the commission has written to you asking that the commission meet with the President to present its report.

I recommend that it not meet with the President nor with anyone on the White House staff and that the report be submitted by mail.

Attached is a news clip in which the staff of this commission is opposing the President's direct order and expressed wishes on infanticide.

The report itself will be controversial.

HHS legislative people report that Kennedy is pushing very hard to have the commission reestablished since it is staffed by people very close to him. By continuing its existence, Kennedy can be assured that all of these very controversial medical-ethical issues remain housed in a well-funded, well-staffed arena capable of being covered by the New York Times when expressing their views.

Having the President or anyone here meet with the group to receive the report would raise its profile to a level which is neither appropriate nor necessary.



Dear Mike:

I seek your advice regarding a matter involving my company and the U.S. Government. Cognizant of your time constraints, I have been brief in my explanation.

For over two years we have attempted to negotiate a modification of land restrictions imposed by the Marine Corps on approximately 180 acres of our property in Orange County, 3-1/2 miles from the Marine Corps Air Station, El Toro. A modification of restrictions will allow the development of an office complex resulting in \$176,000,000 in construction and the creation of 6,500 jobs. Negotiations broke down in 1981, and as a result, in February, 1982 we were forced to file a lawsuit in Federal Court. Yesterday, the court denied the Marine Corps' Motion for Summary Judgment, thereby allowing the matter to go to full hearing in October of this year. We feel confident the court will rule that the restrictions are unenforceable, however, we would prefer to avoid the lengthy process of litigation (appeals, etc.) and resolve our differences with a substantial monetary and/or equivalent value settlement. Our settlement overtures to date have been rebuffed by both the Marine Corps and the Navy Department.

Since I am not experienced in the workings of government, I am at a loss as to how or whom to approach at the higher levels of government to initiate settlement discussions.

Mike, some time ago you mentioned that if I were ever in Washington, D.C. to call you and we would get together. Respecting your position and busy schedule, I would like to take you up on your invitation and explain this matter in more detail. Since we have a project in Montgomery County, Maryland, I am frequently in your area. Thanks for your precious time.
