The ship of state is commonly perceived as being dead in the water. I genuinely believe that a hostile element in the media is responsible for this perception. Something can be done. Please consider this scenario:

The President goes on television May 1 and asks his followers to lead this nation out of recession by purchasing one or more big ticket items in the next three days. "Tell your dealer "The President sent me," Mr. Reagan says in concluding his remarks. After the President's address his supporters do indeed go out and place orders for billions in cars, appliances, machinery and equipment. The public, seeing Dan Rather's obvious embarrassment as he reports the response to the President's plea, are overwhelmed because most of them did not realize that the recession is already ending. The President, however, having already been advised by his pollster that the people would buy American at his urging, caught the Congress napping, put them on the defensive, and once again regained his mastery over the boys on Capitol Hill.

Mike, this will work. Have the President's pollster check into it. I have spoken to half a dozen people about the idea, and they believe it will work. I'm 41 years old and far from being a misty-eyed dreamer. The people I spoke to are similar in age and thinking. We are willing to back the President with our pocketbooks. I'm convinced there are millions of us. At least look into this matter. If I'm right, a lot of people will sit up and take notice.

**GLOOM GROWS** in the administration as lawmakers spurn Reagan economic goals.

"The animals up there feel they are out of their cages," says one official lamenting Congress's lack of domestic-spending restraint. Congress rejects a Reagan proposal to save \$16.2 billion over five years through civil-service retirement changes. Presidential aides fear that the House will soon pass a costly jobs bill. Congress senses "a loss of power by the president," says one Reaganite.

Reagan avoids moving in to try to negotiate budget compromises; "the winds are against him," one official explains. But aides say the president may be able to regain the initiative with vetoes of big spending bills. He may flail Congress for trying to raise taxes to finance its generosity. A House-Senate split on budget issues could strengthen Reagan's hand.

*Congressional concern about budget deficits appears to fade, but "the deficits are still a very serious problem," one administration official warns.*



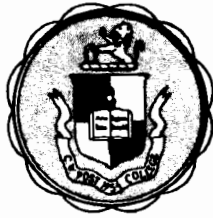



3. Through the Council and the individual responses of our 573 member life insurance companies, our business has strongly endorsed your program for economic recovery and your efforts in revitalizing the economy.


4. You are aware of our wholehearted support of your tax program and particularly our endorsement of interest withholding. Our recent visit to the White House reaffirmed our position.

5. Our industry has been in the forefront of raising the level of participation by business leaders in working within government.


