





Dear Mr. Pack:

Thank you for your telegram of December 12 concerning construction differential subsidies (CDS) for tanker vessels.

As you know, the Department of Transportation published a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking which would allow any owner or operator of a tanker built with CDS to repay that subsidy. Upon repayment, the owner or operator would be permitted to enter domestic tanker trade. The docket in the Department's rulemaking proceeding closed on May 2, 1983. The Department is now in the process of evaluating options for final action in this rule-making. However, the Appropriations Act for the Department of Commerce, signed by the President on November 28, 1983, prohibits the enforcement of any final rule on this matter until after June 15, 1984.

Comments and recommendations from maritime interests such as yours are appreciated. Your views concerning CDS certainly will be considered.

Thank you again for expressing your views on this important and complex issues.



SUBJECT: Letter from Senator Murkowski and Representative Young

I have reviewed the circumstances surrounding the incident referred to in the letter you received from Senator Murkowski and Representative Young. Needless to say, I consider it very serious any time we receive such an allegation.

At my direction, all of the agents who were involved in the Elmendorf event have been interviewed. The evidence gathered does not indicate that any Secret Service agent was involved in either restricting the movements of or detaining in any way Senator Murkowski or Representative Young. In fact, all the agents were under the impression that both individuals were permitted access to the secure areas.

Accordingly, I can say with certainty that the Secret Service did not inhibit the movement of these individuals during the President's participation in the Elmendorf visit. As a policy, we always try to be sensitive to and consider the political reality associated with unnecessarily restricting the movements of Members of Congress.

I would like to recommend that an agent assigned to our Liaison Division personally visit both individuals in an attempt to ascertain any additional facts they may possess.
