From NSC: The president of Fudan, XIE Xide, is a woman, American trained Ph.D. physicist. She is very dynamic, well-disposed towards US and closely involved with American scientists. She is making effort to improve the environment and attitude of Fudan Univ., which formerly had many Maoists and was known for poor access granted to foreign scholars.
