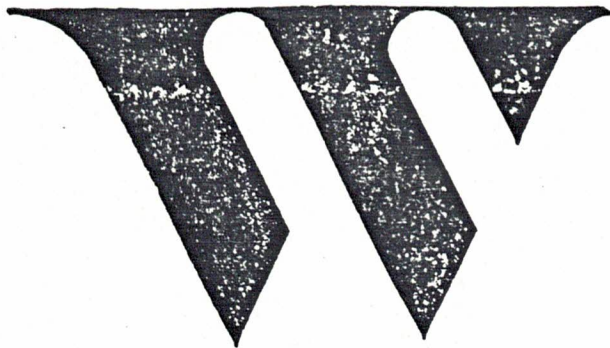


Dear Mr. President,

"I had a phone call from the embassy asking where they could get hold of one," she told me. "They said a 'certain lady' in the White House wanted one.

IT'S NOT only Wild West cowboys who have begun to fancy those Australian Akubra hats now being exported to the United States in large numbers (Column 8, Tuesday). An old Hollywood cowboy and his wife are to get a couple as well. The American Ambassador to Canberra, Mr Robert Nesen, leaves for Washington today with a Thanksgiving gift of the hats for President Reagan and his wife, Nancy. Mrs Reagan inquired about the Akubras after she saw one worn by 23-year-old Skye Macleod, this month's cover girl on the American magazine Town and Country, which carries a feature on Australia.

Reagans Getting Down-Under Hats

While America's diplomats in Australia are keeping an eye on the precarious situation of Malcolm Fraser's government, the United States ambassador, Robert Nesen, and members of his staff have been shopping for Christmas presents for Ronald and Nancy Reagan.

White House Deputy Chief of Staff Mike Deaver's wife, Carolyn, was so taken with the cover of November's *Town & Country* magazine, showing a model wearing a \$30 rabbit-fur-felt Australian western hat, that her husband's office asked the ambassador in Canberra to track down the hat.

"We got in touch with the Sydney model on the cover, and then she contacted the Akubra hat company [400 miles away]," explained Audrey Flynn, Nesen's secretary.

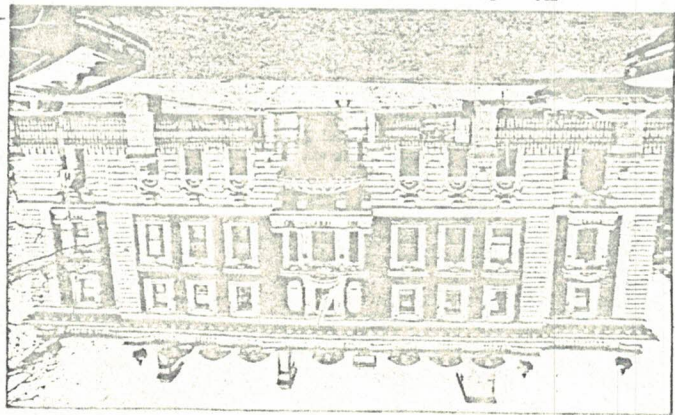
Recently, Nesen, who is back in the United States on leave, handed over the hats

What's Missing at Cooper-Hewitt?



The Cooper-Hewitt: Was there a theft?

THE COOPER-HEWITT MUSEUM has been missing about 125 pieces of jewelry for more than a year, but law-enforcement officials on the case have had a little problem: Museum officials don't even know exactly what's gone.

The loss was discovered during the museum's first "eye contact" inventory of its decorative-arts collection since 1897 (when the collection was part of the Cooper Union Museum). In August 1981, officials reported to police and F.B.I. agents that the contents of several drawers, each containing about 25 pieces of turn-of-the-century jewelry, were missing, but they weren't sure what pieces were gone, or if they weren't simply misplaced.

David McFadden, curator of decorative arts at the museum, minimized the value of the pieces, noting that the collection's finest jewels are kept in a vault. "In the best of all possible worlds, we'll find them as we reconcile our inventory in the coming years," he said. He added that hundreds of thousands of items had entered the museum's collection since 1897, most without being photographed and with "minimal cataloguing." Law-enforcement officials are not sure if the jewelry has in fact been stolen, but an investigation into the matter is continuing. "We are looking at it in connection with major thefts in the area," said F.B.I. agent Mike Downey. —Craig Unger

Calling Con Ed? You're on Tape

One recent visitor was perched on a ledge in the glasshouse admiring the greenery for no more than six seconds when a security guard told him to move on. Bank's Plants A Thorny Issue


