We got another call from Mr. Bell for the McLean Chamber of Commerce event in Bloomington, IL, and he said that he called Stockman's office and they declined. He asked what the status was of his request with Regan's office-----

I again explained that with the testifying on the hill, etc., Regan would be a long shot. He said since the event date is so close how about us trying for an U/S or A/S at Treasury to speak? I said that I would convey that to you.

Right after he called, we got a call from Shirley
Moore who said that Bell had called them again about
his request and wanted Deaver to call Stockman/Regan
to do this event. I told Shirley about the many calls
from him --- and that I knew Stockman/Regan would be
impossible at this time. She agreed, and asked us
to try to get a Treasury person for him (she told Bell

Mr. Bell said that he would call on Monday for a status report ----- WHAT DO YOU WANT TO DO?

He wanted us to ask for Regan or Stockman when he first called on 1/19 when he found out the president could not attend.

We have not done anything with this --- and this is his 5th or 6th call to us.

The background on the attached is as follows:

On 1/19 Bell called us saying that RR cannot attend the McLean County Association of Commerce and Industry's meeting on 3/3/83 in Bloomington, IL. Sadleir's office told him to call us for help with a rep.

I called Rawlins that day, and called Central Files -- who told me the file was charged out to Rawlins -- for the back-up. Mary could not find the file, but told me she would look for it.

I have been bugging her about it, and Bell called again today to ask what the status is of the request. He again asked for a rep (Stockman or Reagan) and I told him very difficult, budget, hill hearings, etc. I was going to ask him for the back-up and he said he was told that we had the file --- I called Rawlins, and she brought the attached by to us -- the ONLY thing she has on event. She did tell me that this request was heavily staffed out since RR visited his farm during the campaign.

Do you want to try for Stockman/Regan, or tell him that they are unavailable and try someone else at Treasury, OMB, or just decline?

I spoke with Helene enroute to Austria last night. She had discussed the matter with Bill Clark, Ken Dam, and Ron Mann, on our staff. She said to tell you they still think there is a position available. However, we will not know the particulars until we reach Greg Newell this morning (he could not be reached last night), since this job is under his jurisdiction.

The job of U.S. Representative to International Organizations is a new position created by the recently passed State Department Authorization Act. The White House first heard of its existence several months ago when Newell informed our office of a newly available plum appointment.

Roger Kirk, the Deputy U.S. Representative to the International Atomic Energy Agency, is currently the highest ranking full-time American representative in Vienna. He is a career FSO and has been at his current post since 1978. The point of contention is whether we would have to remove Kirk in order to place Williamson. We had understood that the new Act created a full-time Representative and Deputy Representative. However, it does not because the IAEA job has been combined with the international organizations caretaker position. Apparently, it had been assumed by some that Kirk would automatically move up to full Representative.

As Ken Dam may have told you, he thinksit is very important to have an expert on nuclear power in this position because it does deal primarily with IAEA. He expects Williamson would get a worse hearing on the Hill than Adelman and suggests we find him another ambassadorial post.

If this position does not work out, Helene says she has saved a great post, Ambassador to the Ivory Coast. Attached for your information are the fact sheets on the Vienna position. I will advise you as soon as Greg Newell gives us an explanation.

UNITED STATES REPRESENTATIVE TO INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS
IN VIENNA

This position was created by the recently passed Department of State Authorization Act, Fiscal Years 1982 and 1983. The statutory provision is as follows:

"Sec. 118. Section 2 of the United Nations Participation Act of 1945 (22 U.S.C. 287) is amended by adding at the end thereof the following new subsection:

"'(h) The President, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall appoint a representative of the United States to the Vienna office of the United Nations with appropriate rank and status, who shall serve at the pleasure of the President and subject to the direction of the Secretary of State. Such individual shall, at the direction of the Secretary of State, represent the United States at the Vienna office of the United Nations and perform such other functions there in connection with the participation of the United States in international organizations as the Secretary of State from time to time may direct.'"

The newly combined mission, which is a merger of the former missions to the IAFA and UNIDO, is responsible for the at site representation of U.S. interests in these organizations as well as a host of others, e.g., UNRWA, the U.N. Center for Social Development and Humanitarian Affairs (UNCSDHA), the U.N. Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL), the U.N. Division of Narcotic Drugs (DND), the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB), the U.N. Fund for Drug Abuse Control (UNFDAC), and the United Nations Scientific Committee on the Effects of Atomic Radiation (UNSCEAR).

The post is currently classified as a Class III post with the Ambassador paid at Executive Level IV (\$58,500). The Ambassador supervises a staff of twenty, drawn from the Departments of State and Energy.
